Following the series of games, a dessert course was served by the hostesses with Mrs. Joe Sloum pouring coffee.

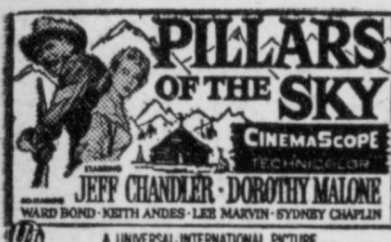
