





BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF

Section 1. That Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Texas he, and the same is hereby, amended by adding thereto another Section to be designated as Section 9, which thail read as follows:

"Section 9. 1 cup dark or golden raisins
4 cup coarsely chopped nuts Cream shortening and sugar. Add egg and beat well. Blend in banana and orange peel. Resift flour with baking powder, salt and soda. Blend into creamed mixture alternately with milk. Stir in raisins and nuts. Turn into greased loaf pan (about 81/2 x 4½ x 2½ inches). Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) about 1 hour. Let stand 5 minutes. Turn out onto wire rack to cool. Makes 1 loaf.
