| BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF STATE OF TEXAS: <br> Section 1. That Subsection (a), Section 20, Article XVI, Texas, be amended to read as follows: (a) The Legislature shall have the power to enact a Mixed Beverage Law regulating the sale of mixed alcoholic election basis. The Legislature shall also have the power to regulate the manufacture, sale, of intoxicating liquors, including the power to establish a State Monopoly on the sale of distilled liquors. | "Should the Legislature enact any enabling laws in anticipation of this amendment, no such law shall be void by reason of its anticipatory nature." <br> Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "Repeal of the prohibition against open saloons XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas." |
