

#### Count Milk In When You Count Calories

In a time of calorie counting and weight watching, it's important that Americans remember they get about 42.5 percent of their calories from fat, but only 4.5 percent of their calories from milk. One cup of regular milk contains 160 calories.

And it's a fact that regular milk is 96 percent fat free, actually a low fat product. Unfortunately, not all homemakers know the facts about milk. This came out in a 1970 survey by the United States Department of Agriculture that indicated that "thirty three percent of the homemakers polled thought regular whole milk contained at least 50 percent fat."

Hour-long interviews were conducted among a representative sample of 2,200 homemakers to determine their attitudes toward dairy products. More than six out of 10 homemakers who reported having used whole milk in the year preceding the survey said "they

AT THE END OF LAST WEEK'S comments, a distinction was drawn between public wrongs as a matter of responsibility between the courts and the legislative branch of the Federal Government.

The Conservative view is that public wrongs do not lend themselves to judicial solutions. Rather it is a matter of legislative initiative to determine questions of public policy and spending priorities. Only a broadly based representative body can bring the judgment to bear on these factors in order to place them in perspective.

More fundamental decisions involving public policy matters should be made by a democratically selected and a political body directly answerable to the people.

Properly, the courts have played a role in limiting excesses in the exercise of legislative and executive power. But, they have done so within the context of private litigation and have carefully avoided challenging governmental policy as distinguished from constitutional power to act,

In more recent years this traditional role of the courts has changed. More and more

the judges have entertained jurisdiction and ruled on maiters aimed at asserted public wrongs. If the Legislative Branch of Government should frustrate the desires of a group of people by rejecting their claims, the courts are asked to furnishrelief. This judicial activism is not consistent with the original role the courts were fashioned for and represents a dangerous shift of power from the people, acting throughtheir elected representatives, to judges who are answerable only to theniselves. It is a trend bad for the courts and worse for the

It would be well for crusading judges to ponder this statement by Justice Felix Frankfurters "The Court's authority -- possessed of neither the purse nor the sword -- ultimately rests on sustained public confidence in its moral sanctity. Such feeling must be nourished by the Court's complete detachment -- in fact, and in appearance -- from political entanglement and by abstention from injecting itself into the clash of political forces in political settlements".

one of the most consistent advocates of judicial restraint. It has been the failure of Federal courts at all levels to heed his advice, that constitutes the core of some of the problems we have in this country today.

All too frequently, declsions are rendered on the basis that Judges disagree with the Congress on matters of policy. Oftentimes opinions may be couched in language challenging the constitutionality of a law but heavily influenced by their belief that congressional enactment is simply un-

THE LATE JUSTICE STONE, who served for 16 years with distinction on the U.S. Supreme Court, expressed this view: "The power of the courts to declare a statute unconsitutional is subject to two guiding principles which ought never to be absent from judicial consciousness. One is that the courts are concerned only with the power to enact statutes, not with their wisdom. The other is that, while unconsitutional exercise of power by the Executive and Legislative Branches of Government is subject to judicial restraint, the only check upon our own exercise of power is our own sense of self restraint. For the removal of unwise laws from the statute books, appeal lies not to the courts but to the ballot box and to the processes of democratic government.

"Pedestrian" on Skates

Roller skating on the sidewalk, six-year-old Teddy was hit by a delivery truck backing out of a driveway. In short order, Teddy's parents aimed a damage suit at the trucking company.

At the trial, they noted that pedestrians on sidewalks had the "Maybe so," conceded the company. "But this boy was not really a 'pedestrian' at all. He was a roller skater." However, the court upheld

Teddy's claim. The judge said: "While a pedestrian is ordinarily one who travels on foot, the mere circumstance that he has attached to his feet roller

with any other character than that of a pedestrian."



Local traffic laws often grant special rights to pedestrians over this one, courts have given the word "pedestrian" a broad mean

But this works both ways. The status of pedestrian may involve duties as well as rights. Thus:

A woman climbed down from a trolley car and started jaywalking toward an opposite corner. Struck and injured by a passing taxicab, she later sued the cab company for damages. When the company pointed to an ordinance against jaywalking by pedestrians, the woman replied "Until I reached the sidewalk

I was still a passenger, not a pedestrian. Therefore, the ordinance against jaywalking did not apply to me. However, the court turned

down her excuse. The judge said her status changed from passenger to pedestrian at the moment she got off the trolley What is your status if you have car trouble on the road and have

to use your feet? In one case, a man was run down while walking behind his stalled car to set out warning flares on the highway. When he sued, he was blamed by on the left side of the roadlike any other pedestrian. But the court ruled that, at





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

Here is a sampling of blooms of dwarf marigolds, is and double forms, monochrome and bi-colored. All an useful in your garden.

What do you call dwarf in a plant? Three inches inches? A foot? Whichever you answer, there's a smile of the height you named.

There are dwarfs like gold and mahogany-flowered Bolero; Rusty Red, blooms colored as its name suggests; and tangerine-orange blossomed Tangerine growing, respectively 12, 15 and 18 inches high. Next are "extra" dwarfs

Next are "extra" dwarfs which include the 6 inch high Petite series in gold, orange, yellow and bi-colored blooms and the 8 inch Brownie Scout with double, golden flowers splashed red at the bases of the petals.

And then there are the dwarf
