slightly larger in diameter than the rest and may be bluish or blackish in color. White grubs have a brown head capsule and three pairs o
conspicuous legs (grubs of the billbug are legless). Grubs hatch from eggs laid in the
ground by the female beetles. Most of them spend about 10 months of the year in the ground; some remain in the soil 2 or 3 years. In mild 2 inches below the surface; in winte they go deeper in the soil. Adults of white gruas are commonly called Jepanese beetles, May beetles,
beetles, or June bugs. They are a
little over $1 / 2$ inch long and in localized spots or in large,
irregular-shaped areas. Where regular-shaped areas. Where
nfestations are heavy, the grass roots may be entirely eaten away and
the turf grass rolled back like a he turf grass rolled back like a
carpet. Moles, skunks, and birds feed on the grubs and may tear up the sod searching for them. To detect
the presence of grubs, examine the the presence of grubs, examine the
soil around the grass roots. Dig in brown areas near the edge of green, healthy areas of grass. If more than
one grub per square foot of area is ne grub per square
found, the lawn should be treated. White grubs can be controlled by applying diazinon or Orthanol. Be
sure to read the label and follow its recommendations.
