The 1984 program as announced is almost identical except that the required acreage reduction is 25 percent. Neither program involves cross-compliance between program crops or offsetting compliance between farms, giving farmers the opportunity to participate on one frogram on another farm or other farms. In 1982, participation in the acreage reduction program (ARP) ranged from a low of 58 percent in the West to a high of about 85 percent in the Southwest, with the mid-South and Southeast in between at 73 percent. Plantings that year came to 11.34 million acres and yields averaged a record 590 pounds per acre. But acreage abandonment cut harvested acreage was 11.963 million bales. The normal U. S. abandonment percentage is only about seven percent and the five-year centered average yield through 1981 was 517 pounds per acre.
Applying a 72 percent acreage participation to the 25 percent ARP requirement and to the U.S. acreage base of 15.5 million acres in 1984 would indicate planted acreage next year at 12.7 million. Production, assuming a normal seven percent abandonment and a 1984-85 offtake equaled the 1983-84 estimate of 114 million, about 1.3 million bales would be added to the
"That would probably put next year's ending stocks at something over five million bales, which is something we definitely do not need," says PCG Executive "Mice President Donald Johnson.
