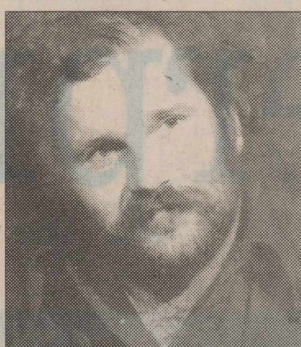

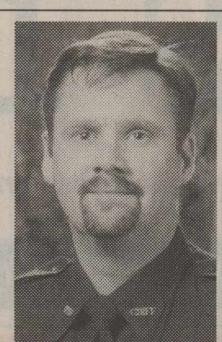

**History of Police – Part VIII  
'Nick Names' – continued**

As we continue our look at police nicknames, I think it is important to remember that a person should be able to "laugh at themselves" and not take their profession too seriously; however, some of the nicknames I have discovered are specifically derogatory and could be offensive to some readers so I have left out some of the more poignant references to our profession.



Chief  
Nathan Johnson

The compound word ekename, literally meaning "additional name", was attested as late as 1303 A.D. This word was derived from the Old English phrase eaca "an increase", related to eacian "to increase". By the 15th Century, the mis-division of the syllables of the phrase "an ekename" led to its corruption into the form "a neke-name." Though spelling has changed, the pronunciation and meaning of the word have remained relatively stable ever since.

Here are a few that start with the letter "C" - "F".

**Campo**

(Pronounced Cam-poe) Is a term used to describe Police/Peace officers whose jurisdiction is a university/college. It is most commonly used in North America. It is a combination of the title Campus Police.

**Cinder Dick**

An old term for railroad police detective, derived from the detective having to walk on the railroad ballast rock, also known as "cinders".

**Cherry Toppers, Cherry Tops, or**

**Cherries**  
Often used in reference to police cars, which in some nations bear red lights on the top of the car.

**Cop or Copper**

Commonly believed to be an acronym for Constable On Patrol, the term actually refers to "one who captures or snatches". This word first appeared in the early 18th century, and can be matched with the word "cap", which has the same meaning and whose etymology can be traced to the Latin word 'capere'.

**County Brownie**

A slang term for some sheriff departments because of their brown uniforms and cars.

**County Mountie**

Term for the county sheriff and deputies.

**Crackers**

A slang term for the police in Florida especially in south Florida

**Crusher**

Of unknown origin but may have come from the nickname used for the Royal Navy Regulating Branch or the Navy Shore Patrol.

**Dicks**

Slang for detectives. May have come from fictional detective Dick Tracy.

**"Donutters" or The Do-dos**

Arises from the stereotype of police

officers eating donuts.

**Dogs**

Used in many European languages as an insulting term for police similar to pig in English

**Ecilop, s**

Australia for police reversed as seen through rear vision mirror.

**Feds**

Usually used in the United States to refer to higher federal law enforcement agencies, especially the F.B.I.

**Filth**

A widespread term used in several countries by criminals, is often considered popular in Greater London, England.

**Finest (as in - "Winters Finest")**

Used in either admiration, or slightly derisive irony, in the United States.

**Flatfoot**

A term that refers to the large amount of walking that a police officer would do, thus causing flat feet.

**Flic**

French slang for a policeman.

**Fuzz**

This North American term first appeared in the 1920s and gained popularity in the 1930s. This slang term may be in reference to the sound of the field radios that police commonly use. It surfaced in Britain in the 1960s.

## Fishin' with Dave

**Fishing Report**

Bass fishing at Ivie continues to take center stage with another bunch of big fish being brought to the scales. This past week I had the chance to take a writer from Texas Fish and Game magazine out on the lake for a photo opportunity. During the day we took an 11.57 bass and five more that went between seven and nine pounds for a total weight of over 38 pounds for the days outing. That would have won most tournaments this year. We also caught a bunch of smaller fish in the 3-5 pound range, and that day we could do no wrong. However, on another trip last week we could manage only a three-pounder and some smaller bass.

Catfishing is also picking up as the cats begin to get in the shallow water to spawn

and can be taken on cheese bait under a cork. Crappie have begun to get in the trees down about 15 feet just off the river channel with jigs and minnows doing the major damage to the good-eating fish. Blue cats are also on the flats, and the jug line guys are doing well with cut shad and cut carp.

Speaking of cut up stuff, I didn't know you could buy a pair of jeans with holes already in them, built-in wrinkles, and the already worn out look. When I was a kid a half century ago (or a little more), we got a new pair of bright, stiff jeans, and when they got ripped or worn, mother would use an iron-on patch or sew something over the hole. We should have saved all those jeans, put some weird name on them, and sold them for much more than they cost originally. With all the things being sold that look worn out

and well used, it would also seem that some of us would be worth more now than we used to be. I don't think that some of my old fishing tackle is worth more because it's a bit worn.

This certainly has an impact on the wildlife and fish in the area as well as the beaches and the associated businesses. There's much talk about the way our current administration is handling the situation, and once again I suppose past President Bush will be the one to blame since the well was most likely drilled on his watch.

## Winters man charged with multiple burglaries

BROWNWOOD, Texas.- Serial numbers on a camera and trumpet taken in vehicle burglaries led sheriff's investigators to a San Angelo pawn shop and a Winters suspect who was arrested on 18 charges.

Daniel Stambaugh, 31, of Winters, was taken to the Brown County Jail last week on charges of assault on a public servant, unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon, evading arrest, theft of a firearm and on multiple Comanche County charges of burglary of a vehicle, jail records state.

Deputies arrested Stambaugh Wednesday afternoon outside a home in the Grosvenor area, where he had been sitting on the back porch with his girlfriend, sheriff's investigator Scott Bird said.

From Stambaugh's car, deputies recovered numerous items including cameras, jewelry, checks, guns, GPS, radar detector and documents. Stambaugh is suspected of taking in vehicle burglaries in other counties, according to Bird.

"All the vehicles that were burglarized were unlocked, so please, everyone, lock your vehicles," Bird said.

Events moved quickly Tuesday after Bird and investigator Jason Benefield tracked owner-provided serial numbers from the stolen Canon Rebel camera and three lenses and the stolen trumpet to the San Angelo pawn shop. The investigators drove to San Angelo and recovered the stolen items, and records showed Stambaugh was the person who pawned them, Bird said.

The investigators went to a home in the 1500 block of Durham to speak with another person who was also a suspect in the case, and Stambaugh was there when they arrived, Bird said. Stambaugh made statements to the investigators, and Bird told him he was under arrest.

"He runs," Bird said. "I was able to catch him. We took him to the ground."

The 190-pound suspect, who Bird described as "thick," fought with Bird and Benefield, and the investigators could not get him under control. "It was a full-out fight," Bird said.

The suspect got loose and ran, and the investigators could not catch him. They contacted Early K-9 handler Johnny Brown and asked him to bring the Early Police Department's dog, Tessa, to the scene to try to track Stambaugh.

There had been too much foot traffic in the area for the dog to get a scent, but Brown ran the dog on Stambaugh's 2006 Cadillac. She alerted on a narcotics scent, Brown said. No drugs were found in the car, but that led to the discovery of stolen property including two rifles.

But the investigators still didn't have their suspect in custody. They obtained an

arrest warrant later Tuesday, signed by Justice of the Peace Bryan Thompson, for assault on a public servant and possession of a firearm by a felon - two of the 18 charges on which Stambaugh remains incarcerated.

Wednesday morning, they interviewed Stambaugh's girlfriend, Miranda Ketcham, at the sheriff's office. She said she didn't know where Stambaugh was and said she hadn't seen him in a couple of days, Bird said.

"We believed she was deceptive," he said. Later Wednesday, Bird got a tip about Stambaugh's location, and he and Benefield went to the Grosvenor home.

When the suspect saw the investigators, he started to run. Benefield ordered him to the ground at gunpoint, and Stambaugh was arrested.

The stolen camera was returned to the owner, with the photos of her daughter's basketball game intact, Bird said.

### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF A PANIC ATTACK?

The symptoms of a panic attack appear suddenly, without any apparent cause. They may include: racing or pounding heartbeat, chest pains, dizziness, light-headedness, nausea, difficulty breathing, tingling or numbness of the hands, flushes or chills, dreamlike sensations or perceptual distortions, terror—a sense that something unimaginably horrible is about to occur and one is powerless to prevent it, fear of losing control and doing something embarrassing, fear of dying.

A panic attack typically lasts for several minutes and is one of the most distressing conditions that a person can experience. Most people who have one attack will have others. When someone has repeated attacks, or feels severe anxiety about having another attack, he or she is said to have a panic disorder.

### WHAT IS PANIC DISORDER?

Panic disorder is a serious health problem in this country. At least 1.6 percent of adult Americans, or three million people, will have panic disorder at some time in their lives. The disorder is strikingly different from other types of anxiety in that panic attacks are sudden, appear to be unprovoked, and are often disabling.

Once someone has had a panic attack—for example, while driving, shopping in a crowded store, or riding in an elevator—he or she may develop irrational fears, called phobias, about these situations and begin to avoid them. Eventually, the pattern of avoidance and level of anxiety about another attack may reach the point where the individual with the panic disorder may be unable to drive or even step out of the house. At this stage, the person is said to have panic disorder with agoraphobia. Thus panic disorder can have as serious an impact on a person's daily life as other major illnesses—unless the individual receives effective treatment.

### IS PANIC DISORDER SERIOUS?

Yes, panic disorder is real and potentially disabling, but it can be controlled with specific treatments. Because of the disturbing symptoms that accompany panic disorder, it may be mistaken for heart disease or some other life-threatening medical illness. People frequently go to hospital emergency departments when they are having a panic attack, and extensive medical tests may be performed to rule out these other conditions.

Others often try to reassure the person who is having a panic attack that he or she is not in great danger. Expressions such as "nothing serious," "all in your head," or "nothing to worry about" may give the incorrect impression that there is no real problem and that treatment is not possible or necessary.


### WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR PANIC DISORDER?

Thanks to research, there are a variety of treatments available, including several effective medications and, also, specific forms of psychotherapy. Often, a combination of psychotherapy and medications produces good results. Some improvement may be noticed in a fairly short period of time—about six to eight weeks. Appropriate treatment of panic disorder can prevent panic attacks or at least substantially reduce their severity and frequency, bringing significant relief to 70 to 90 percent of people with panic disorder.

In addition, people with panic disorder may need treatment for other emotional problems. Depression has often been associated with panic disorder, as have alcohol and drug abuse. Recent research also suggests that suicide attempts are more frequent in people with panic disorder. Fortunately, these problems associated with panic disorder can be overcome effectively, just like panic disorder itself.

Tragically, many people with panic disorder do not seek or receive treatment.
