Man stabbed in Winters

WINTERS - One man was stabbed and taken to an Abilene hospital where he remains in the intensive care unit after a two-man incident last Saturday, January 8, on W Pierce Street. Victim and attacker had been previously drinking that evening, along with a larger group barbecuing in the house.

Chris Perez, a man from Arlington St. with a lengthy criminal record including a sex offense appears as the victim. He has not been able to talk to law enforcement officials due to a 12-inch slice-type wound across his abdominal area.

Steven Cavazos, also from Winters, was taken in custody by Winters Police Chief Nathan Johnson and Officer Juan Parra immediately after the stabbing without incident. Cavazos remains in custody charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

According to the investigation Perez and Cavazos had been drinking along with a larger party at a barbecue held at 202 W Pierce, in Winters. Perez was asked to leave, but he came back and was dropped outside the house. He stayed there until he was asked to leave the property. No Police assistance was asked at the time.

It was until after the two men got into a fight with Perez getting the worst part that the Police Department was called. Both men were highly intoxicated.

EMS provided fist aids to the victim. Due to weather conditions he couldn't be airlifted and he was taken by ambulance to Hendrick Medical Center, in Abilene.

Perez was taken into surgery on Sunday from about 1-4 a.m. and then taken to the intensive care unit. Until press time he was reported in stable condition.

This is the first stabbing incident in Winters since 2009. In 2010 some violence incidents were registered but nobody had been shot or stabbed until now.

Colorado City teen missing two weeks

COLORADO CITY - On December 28, 2010, Billie Jean Dunn contacted Colorado City Police Department and reported Hailey Darlene Dunn missing. Hailey is 13 yrs. old and is a Colorado City Middle School student. She is 5 ft. 1 in. tall with hazel eyes, hair is brown with blondish streaks and weighs 120 lbs. There is a reward offered for information leading to the where abouts and safe return of Hailey Dunn. Nine agencies are actively working this case with 30 law enforcement officers, many more working behind the scenes. Hailey Dunn's case does not qualify for the Amber Alert. However, digital billboard space around the state have been donated by Lamar Sign Company. This shows Hailey Dunn's face and description. This company is also planning a vinyl billboard display.

From building students to cabinets

WINTERS - After a prolific 31-year career in education an outstanding teacher born, raised and current resident of Winters is retiring in 2011. Abilene's Reagan Elementary Principal Mike Kozelsky started the year turning the page to a new chapter, he is now dedicated to a long-time passion, building cabinets.

Kozelsky was born in Winters, in 1950, and graduated from high school in 1969. He grew up on a farm and spent many hours chopping and pulling cotton, raising sheep and hogs, and driving a tractor as well.

Life on the farm was tough, he recalls, when he was 7-years-old the whole family was out on the field chopping cotton and complained about his back "My mother told me that I was too young to have a back." Growing up on a farm also was adventure and exploration, but he had to work.

In addition to being a farmer his dad was a cabinetmaker. His father's first cabinet shop was at the farm, but

in 1960 he built a shop in Winters.

"I started working working regularly in the shop when I was 10 years old, including after school, weekends and summers," said Kozelsky.

The routine continued until high school, during that time he learned how to use woodworking tools and developed a love of building things that persists to this day. By the time he graduated from high school he was already a skilled worker and his father relied on him to help at the shop.

In May of 1971 he married Carol Jacob "she was a blessing." They will celebrate their 40th anniversary in June of 2011. The couple has three adult children, Kathryn, Scott and Jeanna. They have also been blessed with one grandchildren.

Kozelsky started teaching in 1973 teaching Industrial Arts at the Snyder High School, in Snyder, Texas. He spent there 11 years there teaching drafting, woodworking, metal working and electronics. In 1984, while his father was getting ready to retire, he decided to move back to Winters and

put his education career on hold.

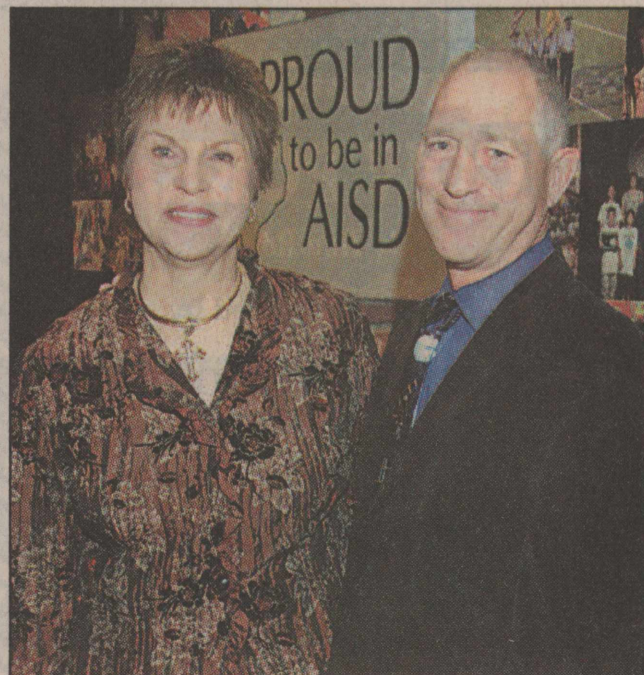
His vocation and the economy sent Kozelsky back to the classroom in 1991. He went to work in Marble Falls teaching Building Trades for one year. "That was a wonderful school," he recalls, his family stayed in Winters, they kept the house while Mike was in Marble Falls.

In June of 1992 Kozelsky received an offer to teach in one of Abilene's middle schools. He became an Industrial Technology teacher at Franklin Middle School. His wife Carol left her job at the Winters School administration building to start working at Clack Middle School, also in Abilene.

They kept their house in Winters, commuting back and forth, and their kids kept on going to school here until graduated.

Kozelsky grew up at the beginning of the space program, and his favorite subjects in school were science and engineering. He enrolled in the Texas

Commissioners hold first meeting

RUBEN CANTU-RODRIGUEZ WINTERS ENTERPRISE WINTERS - Runnels County Commissioners Court held its first meeting of the year with County Judge Barry Hilliard presiding for the first time.



Barry Hilliard, the new Runnels County Judge, presided his first Commissioners Court meeting on Monday, January 10.

Commissioners approved County Treasurer's report and Auditor's report, approved payment of all current accounts and ratified payment of accounts pre-approved between court dates by members duly appointed by the Commissioners Court.

Tax Collectors monthly report was deferred to the next Commissioners Court meeting.

Commissioners took no action on specific term lengths for the commissioners of the Runnels County Emergency Services District No. 1, in Miles, until further information on terms is obtained.

Commissioners approved a grant agreement with the Texas Department of Agriculture Home Delivered Meal Grant Program. Runnels County

will receive \$18,482.16 for home delivered meals.

Commissioners also considered applying for credit cards for the County Judge, County Commissioners, County Attorney, County Clerk, County Auditor, County Treasurer, District Clerk and Justices of the Peace. County Auditor Cindy Winchester volunteered to obtain further information about this item.

A motion was presented to elect Commissioner James Thurman Self as

County Judge pro tem, Precinct 3 representative was elected unanimously.

Commissioners approved the County Treasurer's quarterly investment report and the request of Precinct 2 Commissioner Ronald Presley to trade in a 1992 Volvo truck-tractor. Commissioner Presley will be buying a 2001 Mack truck-tractor.

Agenda items included discussion about the burning ban currently in effect. Commissioner discussed about weather conditions and decided to maintain the ban issued for 90 days. The ban is due on February 13, 2011.

Commissioners approved County Treasurer Ann Strube as the county official to file quarterly requests with the State Comptroller's Judiciary Section for county reimbursement of juror payments.

Commissioners Court approved the official bond of Jana Foster as Runnels County Assistant Auditor. Next meeting of the Runnels County Commissioners Court will be held on Friday, January 21.

Commissioners evaluate and maintain burn ban

WINTERS ENTERPRISE WINTERS - County Commissioners evaluated and decided last Monday, January 10, to maintain, without further modifications, the burning ban currently in effect in Runnels County.

Commissioners have received numerous calls asking about the ban conditions and exceptions. On November 15, 2010, Commissioners Court ordered that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated areas of the county for a 90 day period. This period is due on February 13, 2011.

The order doesn't prohibit outdoor burning for household trash or rubbish from property that is both designated to be a private residence, and used exclusively as a private residence.

The order doesn't prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for firefighter training; public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under and that meets the standards of the

Natural Resources Code.

Any individual gainfully employed in a trade or profession that involves the use of combustible materials or use of possible fire sources in the outdoor environment directly related to the successful operation of the business' goals and or objectives may continue to conduct business as usual, utilizing the materials and or potential fire sources in the outdoor environment as the deem necessary; provided that the individual shall take all necessary safety precautions to prevent the ignition of any fire that are not essential to the conducting of day to day business activities and further provided that at least two persons are present on a ready source of sufficient water is available to extinguish any fire cause by a spark from such activities.

Outdoor cooking in barbecue pits is allowed as long as the fire source for the pit is completely enclosed. No outside flame is allowed. The barbecue pit shall not be left unattended at any time while there are live coals or wood in the pit.

Violation of this order is considered a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.
