Jr. Stock Show opens hearts, checkbooks

BALLINGER- With new facilities and area students showing their skills as future farmers and ranchers, last Friday, January 13 and Saturday, January 14 was held the 2012 Runnels County Junior Livestock Show.

Exhibitors showed their cattle, swine, lambs, goats and rabbits in the new arena, located in the addition of the Ballinger Community Center. The public enjoyed the show and also the meals prepared by the organizations participating.

Ken Fischer, President of the Runnels County Junior Livestock Association thanked the City of Ballinger and its officials for the construction of the new facility. The building was made possible through a partnership between the city, which provided the lot and the building, and the association providing all the electric wiring, arena set up and sound system.

The show featured over 100 Runnels County 4-H and FFA livestock exhibitors showing 316 entries. The county show

was comprised of 36 steers, 130 swine, 63 goats, 50 lambs, 7 heifers, 23 rabbits and 7 fryers.

Chelsea Toliver, of Ballinger 4-H, was awarded Grand Champion Steer honors. Jessica Kalina, of Miles 4-H exhibited the Reserve Grand Champion Steer. Hadley Hatler, of Ballinger 4-H showed the Grand Champion Heifer, and Ethan Bredemeyer, of Winters FFA got the Reserve Grand Champion Heifer.

The Cattle Showmanship buckles were for Ethan Bredemeyer in the Senior division and Marcus Toliver in the Junior

In the lamb show Brenna Edwards, of Winters FFA exhibited the Grand Champion Lamb. Rachel Gibbs, of Ballinger 4-H claimed the Reserve Grand Champion Lamb. Courtney Gibbs, of Ballinger 4-H, was awarded the Senior Sheep Showmanship award; Shane Flanagan, of Ballinger 4-H got the Junior Showmanship award.

Courtney Gibbs showed the Grand Champion Meat Goat, while Rusty Fischer, of Ballinger 4-H showed the Reserve Grand



The bridge that hauled a whole town

WINTERS- The South Orient Railroad Bridge over the Colorado River, in Ballinger, has been finished for some time. The nearest public view is from the U.S. Highway 67 bridge, approximately 830 feet down stream. The traveling public can see the truss while traveling at

The County of Runnels is drained by a number of streams, the Mustang, Oak, Elm and Valley Creek as well as the Colorado River. Centuries prior to the arrival of Europeans, Jumano Indians inhabited the area. It was in the 1650s that the Indians interacted

with the Spanish. By 1680, the area had been explored by Juan Dominguez de Mendoza. The San Clemente Mission was established by De Mendoza in 1684. The mission was abandoned by the Spanish only two months after it was established. The Apache Indians succeeded in driving the Jumanos from this area. By the mid 1750s the Comanche Indians pushed out the Apaches. Although the Comanche domination continued throughout much of the 19th Century, there was sparse settlement by Anglos by 1858, when the Texas State Legislature had established Runnels County. The Anglo settlers

begin to increase in the 1870s.

The Texas Rangers along with the U.S. Military cleared the Comanches from the area pushing them into Oklahoma. In 1880, Runnels County was formally organized. The settlement on Elm Creek, known as Runnels City was named as its seat of

government. It was in 1880 also, the county's population was only 980 with 5 percent of the land in cultivation. Most of the residents raised livestock during this period. Local businessmen and politicians lobbied the San Angelo-Abilene railroad to extend a line through the county to designate Runnels City as the

WINTERS- Effective January 1, 2012, the City of Winters is charging citizens a \$10 fee for the limb pick up service. This fee will be added to the water bill when customers request the limb pick up. The charge will be added on top of the drop off regular fee at the convenience center.

The new measure, approved by the City Council at the December 19, 2011 meeting, went into effect on the first day of the year. Customers calling to schedule a date for the limb pick up are being informed of the new fee.

"A charge for limb disposal of 10 dollars plus the normal cost to drop off the same volume

of yard debris at the convenience center will be added to the water bill when customers request the City to pick up limbs," said City Acting Secretary Shelly Antilley-Guevara.

"As an example, if the convenience center fee for a given amount of debris totals \$15.00, pickup of that same amount totals \$25 and will be added to your next water bill."

The drop off fee at the convenience center will remain the same, with different rates depending on the amount of debris being dropped off. The \$10 fee for the limb pick up will be a fixed fee.

Deadline Extended for Conservation Stewardship Program

LYONS, NE- USDA's National Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) recently announced that the deadline for producer applications for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) has been extended to January 27, 2012. While CSP is a continuous sign-up program and pro-

ducers can apply to enroll at any time of the year, NRCS applies a cut-off date for applications to be considered during a particular fiscal year. Once the cut-off date is past, producers may continue to apply for the program, but they will not be considered for entry until the spring of the following year, in this case spring of 2013. In order to enroll in 2012 applications must filed by January

The Conservation Stewardship Program is a voluntary stewardship incentives program, administered by US-DA's NRCS, designed to reward farmers, ranchers, and forestry producers to maintain existing conservation on working lands, as well as for the adoption of additional conservation measures that provide multiple environ-mental benefits that run beyond the farm or ranch. This program pays producers for clean water, better soil management, improved habitat, energy efficiency, and other natural resource benefits.

"We hope more farmers and ranchers will take advantage of this extension for the CSP application deadline. To meet this deadline, they just need to submit the basic application form to their local NRCS office," said Traci Bruckner, Assistant Director of Rural Policy at the Center for Rural Affairs. CSP is one of the most popular conservation programs. In 2010 alone, nearly 21,000 applicants enrolled in CSP, putting additional conservation on 25.2 million acres.

Several cruises ago, a guest claimed to work at a sardine factory, where his job was to "close their eyes before the cans were sealed." On the Carnival Magic was an older man who had traversed the Mediterranean on several of the vessel's summer runs before its assignment to Galveston. He offered valuable tips for the Lido deck. "Go straight to the

Mongolian wok station," he advised, noting that word of its popularity would get around in "tweet time." (He "made it big" printing individual "birth certificates" for Cabbage Patch Kids dolls when the craze started in the late 1970's.)...

A small island "where the coast begins," Galveston is BIG in attractions easily "connected" with a few extra days on either end of cruises. It is rich in history, entertainment and creativity, the latter underscored by wood sculptors who took over where Hurricane Ike left off. Stumps remaining where towering trees once stood now are carved, polished works of art, more than worthy of searches through neighborhoods.

The Galveston Island Convention and Visitors Bureau has all the "scoop" on what-to-see-and-do. (More information at galvestoncvb.com) I've

never seen hosts and hostesses so passionate about their island attractions. If they'd made lemonade of all the lemons they've been dealt, starting with the devastating Galveston Flood in 1900, there'd be hundreds of lemonade stands in place. Galvestonians are made of sturdy

Upon arrival of a press contingent there to greet the Magic, Santa Claus and a couple of elves parachuted into worldclass Moody Gardens to signal the beginning of the Christmas season. I spotted the popular threesome from time to time at the Festival of Lights, their heads bobbing above the masses. Maybe they were "pogo-sticking" around the magical island....

BOERNE- The Vienna Boys' Choir is a choir of long-standing tradition; it is one of the oldest boys' choirs not attached to a church or a college. It was the choir attached to the Austrian court with roots going back to the 13th century, but records from the early phases are tenuous and scarce. In the late 15th century, the choir was part of the court music of Maximilian I, the Holy Roman Emperor, who moved the court from Innsbruck to Vienna and thus is credited with the foundation of the Chapel

The Wiener Sängerknaben (Vienna Boys Choir) has its own school.

Almost 250 children study and rehearse in the Augartenpalais, a baroque palace and former imperial hunting lodge in Vienna. Beginning with kindergarten, boys and girls are provided with a complete musical and general education through the elementary grades. At age 10, the most talented boys are selected to join the choir and enter the choir's grammar school. All boys are assigned to one of the four touring choirs. Academic lessons are taught in small groups. The school has a band, and offers extracurricular

In 1886, the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railway (GCSF) chose to 290119 (tion about Ballinger, dated May) John extend its line from Brownwood .moo. 1886, the site of Ballinger blocks del through Runnels County and selected a site on the Colorado River that was 6 miles south of Runnels City for the location of its terminal. The GCSF Railroad was originally

established in 1873 but in 1886, it was acquired by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad Company (ATSF). Although owned by the ATSF Railroad, the GCSF Railroad was operated as a subsidiary and ran as a separate operation.

By April 1886, a bustling tent city of 200 residents had developed at the GCSF Railroad terminal site. The railroad named the terminal site Ballinger after William Pitt Ballinger, a prominent lawyer. In an account in a Dallas Newspaper,

the reporter gave this informaare large and clearly defined, wide 'streets have been cut through the mesquite shrubs." A 300 x 300 foot

square had been reserved for a

courthouse square in the center.

Just beyond the courthouse square, a public park was marked off. The depot was located just to the north. The first lots were sold June 29, 1886 by the GCSF Railroad for \$1,070 each. The new town, by 1888, was designated the county seat of government. By 1900, the city population had reached 1128.


Ballinger's location at the confluence of the Colorado River and Elm Creek caused the town to be susceptible to major flooding. Some of the most disastrous flooding

occurred in August of 1906. Water from continuous rains caused the Colorado River and Elm Creek to overflow, flooding the business and residential areas in Southern Ballinger. Because of the flooding, train service ceased through the town. The flood waters had reached the

rails of the Gulf Colorado Santa Fe Railroad Bridge over the Colorado River and Elm Creek. Railroad records indicate the railroad bridge over the Colorado River was replaced in October 1906 most likely because of damage by the flood waters. Also evidence suggests that an earlier ca. 1886 flood resulted in the replacement of the original GCSF Railroad Bridge. However, no railroad records exist to support this claim.

On Oct. 18, 2011, Mr. Rhoades registered Veteran's Outreach Mission Inc. with the Dallas County court clerk at the address of 1100 W. Main Suite 115 Grand Prairie, TX. That location comes back as a hotel room. I want the legitimate veteran groups in our area to be made aware of this scam and any possible conflict with their efforts to assist veterans. 


