Time To Fertilize Pastures
By Herb Brevard
Producers need to fertilize winter
pastures as soon as conditions permit,
says Dr. Sim A. Reeves, J.,
agronomist for the the
aras
Agricultural Extersion Service. With
all the wet weather during the past
two months, nitrogen put on last year
has either been leached or used by the
plant.
In order to get additional growth
from the forage as weather improves,
additional nitrogen is needed. Reeves
suggest applying at least 50 to 75
pounds of actual nitrogen per acre.
This apppication should carry the
plants to the latter part of March. If
weather conditions continue to be norweather conditions continue to be nor-
mal, another application of nitrogen
will be needed mall, ano eneed in late March or early
wipril.
Clover should begin growing later this month as the weather warms.
Hopefully, some clover pastures can Hopefully, some clover pastures can
be grazed by late February. The
clover does not need nitrogen if the clover does not need nitrogen if the
seed were properly inoculated prior to planting or if the clover is
reseeding.
