A while back during the winter we pulled up some posts and made a new entrance way into our place.

While mowing the other day, I spied a post hole left from the original fence, and immediately stopped to fill it with dirt and tamp it down.

Why so conscientious? How come everything came to a halt until that little bitty hole was all filled up?

The answer goes back about 15 years, back to a hot, summer evening a lot like those we've been having lately. It was then that I discovered about post holes.

Thomas and I had been doing some cross fencing at the pasture, and had drilled a series of nice, deep post holes with a PTO driven digger.

Somewhere along the line we changed our plan a little bit, and ended up with one nice, neat little hole extra.

It had been a long, long day, and I was hustling along in the near-dark to pick up some fencing tools.

It was one of those glorious evenings...the night hawks were swooping, the locust were shrilling, and the sun was fading away into the evening coolness, leaving behind only a faint pool of orange.

I was thinner, clad in shorts, and moving along at a pretty good clip.

It was one of the most heart-stopping moments of my life.

Suddenly, instead of nice, firm earth, my left foot came in contact with absolutely nothing.

It kept right on meeting nothing until I found myself with that leg bottled up in the unused post hole. The right leg was stretched out behind me, the left foot wasn't touching the bottom of the hole, and I was helpless!

Besides that...it hurt. In fact, for a minute or two I was convinced that my leg was broken.

Thomas wasn't in sight. I tried levering myself up with my arms...no luck.

I tried wiggling...that hurt. There were sharp bits down in that hole...and they were sticking into my leg.

So I resorted to the only recourse left to me...yelling for my husband at the top of my lungs.

He came on the run, screamed to a halt and looked at me.

I suppose coming upon one's wife down at ground level, looking as if the earth had swallowed her is a little bit of a shock.

In the deepening dusk he had a mighty surprised expression on his face. Then he started to laugh. He took his time about that laugh. All the time I was squirming around like a bug on a pin, trying to get him to help me out of my predicament, and he was laughing!

Finally, he pulled me free of the post hole, much like extracting a cork from a bottle.

A goodly portion of my skin stayed behind in the hole.

I stood there, blood running down my leg, gravel stuck into it, madder than a wet hen, and he couldn't stop laughing.

I wanted to get mad, I really did, but decided it wouldn't be very smart. Murder is illegal, and that was the only thing that came to mind! And he did get me out, at least.

So instead I turned away, dusting some of the gravel off my leg, grabbed up a shovel and began filling the blasted, blankety-blank hole up!

I've never left one unfilled since. Even if they aren't but three inches around, and a foot won't fit in them...I fill em up!

And that my friends, is the saga of the post hole!

Two Wounded, One Takes Own Life In Tragic Shooting

A Tuesday afternoon shooting ended with the assailant taking his own life, after shooting his wife and daughter.

According to Red River County Deputy Carl Motley, the Red River County Sheriff's Department received a call at 5:17 p.m. Tuesday, that Debbie Ann Hammond, age 34, and her oldest daughter, Kristin, age 15, had been wounded when John Howard Hammond, estranged husband of Debbie, had come into their home on North Main Street in Bogata, and shot them. A younger daughter, Julie, apparently ran next door for help, and neighbors came and helped them call the ambulance and police.

Hammond then became the object of a two-county search by law enforcement officials, as warrants were issued for his arrest on two counts of attempted murder.

Hammond was spotted once by a citizen in Jolntown shortly after that, but then wasn't seen again for some time.

At approximately 7:00 p.m. that evening, a Titus County Deputy met the suspect, who was driving a 1987 black Chevrolet pickup, on Highway 71 east of Talco. The deputy turned around to follow the suspect, who then turned onto a small county road known as the Iron Bridge Road.

Highway Patrolmen Jerry Conway and Byron Martin, a Titus County Constable and Titus County Deputy Ricky Pool set up a roadblock on the iron bridge.

According to official reports, Hammond, who was driving between 30 to 35 miles per hour, came around the curve just before the bridge, and spotted the roadblock. He then

stopped the pickup, placed it in park, and shot himself in the right temple.

Hammond was transferred by ambulance to Titus County Memorial Hospital where he died at approximately 9:00 p.m.

Debbie and Kristin Hammond were treated and released from St. Joseph's Hospital in Paris after sustaining gunshot wounds, Mrs. Hammond in the left upper thigh, and Kristin with a wound to the foot and a graze across the back of her leg.

The wounds were apparently made by a .38 caliber pistol. A .38 caliber pistol was found in the truck with Hammond.

Titus County has ordered a routine autopsy in the matter, since the fatal shooting incident occurred just across the Red River County line in Titus County.

City Council Approves No Smoking Ordinance For City Hall

During the June 12 meeting of the Bogata City Council, an ordinance forbidding smoking in the City Hall building was approved. The ordinance will be read at the July meeting.

Council voted to have Brannon Corporation of Tyler to apply for a grant for City Park from Texas Parks and Wildlife.

After discussion on getting someone to clean the City Hall, the matter

was tabled until the next meeting.

The council approved a pay scale as follows: \$4.00 per hour for starting employees, an increase of \$.70 per hour after a probationary period of six months. After a period of one year's employment, employees will go to top salary. Council also approved a 4% cost of living raise for all permanent full-time employees.

The City Judge's report was as follows: three exhibition of accelera-

tion; three failure to stop at stop signs; one failure to appear; one failure to produce driver's license; and one no liability insurance.

Councilman David Rozell reported that the former Lioness Club donated two air conditioners for the Community Center and asked consideration by the City of insulating the building. The item is to be discussed at the next council meeting.

Rick Yocham Wins Bogata All Around

Bulls 29-Cowboys 0 At Bogata Rodeo

Rodeo-goers saw the tops in rodeo competition when they attended the Bogata Rodeo on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 22-23-24, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association.

Two hundred twenty-one cowboys and cowgirls competed for over \$12,000.00 in prize money and points toward the 1989 championships.

The bareback riding championship went to Katy, TX with Jimmy Rivette, who scored 85 points on Friday night of the rodeo and who earned \$391.04 while Joe Beard of Conway, AR won a second with 84 points.

The saddle bronc riding championship was won by David Warren of Clarksville, TX who marked 81 points on Friday night of the rodeo. The bronc riding paid Warren \$392.80, while second place went to Audie Reagan of Shreveport, LA.

The calf roping was won on the first night of competition by young Robby Woodrell of Sapulpa, OK who turned in the fastest time of the week, an 8.53 second run, during slack competition on Thursday night. Woodrell's time withstood 46 other competitors and he took \$685.82 back to Oklahoma. Winning second with an 8.93 second run was Ricky Beall of Coalgate, OK.

The steer wrestling event was won by another youngster from Oklahoma, Coty Battles of Stringtown, who competed in Thursday's slack, and threw his steer in 4.62 seconds. Battles check was for \$565.50. James Ault of Hot Springs, AR won second place with a 5.37 second run.

The barrel racing was dominated by Oklahoma cowgirls, with only one Texas cowgirl placing in the competition. Winning first was Susie Pruitt of Ardmore, OK, who competed on Friday night, and clocked a 16.12 second run. Susie won \$490.30 for her first place win. She was followed by the 1988 CRRRA Champion

Barrel Racer, Juliana Morgan of Sapulpa, OK who ran a 16.24 second pattern. Winning fourth was the Texas cowgirl, Brenda Russell of Bogata, who ran a 16.35 second run.

The team roping went to the Clarksville-Bogata team of Ryan Hammett and Todd Williams, who roped their steer in 6.23 seconds, also on Thursday evening of the rodeo.

Second place was won by Dee Keener of Inola, OK and his team partner Jeff Lashley of Muskogee, OK.

But the bull riding event was the talk of the town. In the three performances of the rodeo, 29 bull riders tried their hands at the Wing Rodeo Company bulls, and 29 bullriders bit the dirt. Ten of the Top 15 bull riders in the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association entered the competition and all 10 failed to qualify on the awesome bull herd that was assembled for the Bogata Rodeo.

The All Around buckle, sponsored by the Cattlemen's Club and Restaurant in Clarksville, was won by Rick Yocham of Bartlesville, OK, who won third in the calf roping and sixth in the team roping events. Yocham was the only contestant to place in two events.

Crowds were up over last year, with the usual standing room only audiences for two performances.

Specialty acts were presented by Dale McCracken of Branson, MO, more commonly known as "Gizmo", and Donny Sparks of Texarkana, TX was the rodeo's bullfighter.

Doug Williams of Idabel, OK served as the emcee for the Bogata Rodeo and Jacky Gray of Bogata and Randy Franks of Clarksville were the pick-up men. Cindy Allen of Manchester was the Arena Secretary and Charlie Lewis of Bogata served as the official rodeo timekeeper.

The Texas Express entertained the audiences pre-rodeo each evening and during the performances.



Bogata Bank Offers Agricultural Data Service

The Peoples National Bank of Bogata has recently installed an Agricultural Data Service making it possible for community and area residents to receive quite service on all agricultural commodities and the stock market, including Tokyo and London. Those wishing to take advantage of this service can do so by stopping by the bank and receiving a computer print-out of data needed on any agriculture commodity. Commentaries are updated every 10 minutes making it possible to receive more accurate information.

In demonstrating the system Friday, June 23, bank chief executive officer and Board Chairman, Ronnie Abbott, received the Stewart-Peterson Advisory Report showing soybean prices to be \$7.27 per bushel.

The report also provided the outlook for soybean prices and recommendations.

Besides pricing, the system is also capable of producing graphs showing trends going back as far as four months.

Cattle information can also be obtained from the system which lists major cattle markets.

"We believe the service will be a great asset to area farmers and we hope it will benefit the entire community as well as the bank," said Abbott.
