Prison Hopes Closer To Reality

Hopes for an end to Red River County's economic recession have had their ups and downs over the past few years.

Repeatedly cheers have been heard for the news that an industry, a lake, a new factory, would bring jobs to replace the ones that have been lost.

So that Red River County residents may show their support and encouragement of the local prison facility, a reception has been planned for Saturday, August 12 at 5 p.m. in the Chamber of Commerce meeting room in Clarksville.

At the present time, Red River County is in contention with Atasca as the prison's location site, and county

and city officials feel that a positive show of community support might strengthen Red River County's position when the final selection is determined.

Representatives of CCI, (Corrections Concepts, Inc.) management will be present to meet and talk with area residents concerning the facility and its impact on the community. Some 54 CCI representatives have been invited and are expected to attend.

CCI will manage the facility and pay a specified amount per prisoner to county coffers thus enriching the county, broadening the local tax base, enticing new industry, and employ-

ing over 100 local residents at the prison location.

In addition to CCI personnel, Executive Director Bill Brooks and members of the Texas Board of Pardons and Parole, Senator Ratliff, Representative Telford and the Correction's Committee of the Texas House of Representatives have been invited to the affair.

Eight local churches have invited members of the CCI group to speak in morning services on Sunday, August 13.

All area residents and interested persons are urged to attend the meeting.

He then attended Louisiana College from 1983 to 1985 and graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Science Degree. He attended Baylor College of Dentistry in Dallas from 1985 to 1989 and graduated magna cum laude and ranked fifth of 97 students who graduated.

Dr. White's awards include the Eagle Scout Award from the Boy

Scouts of America in 1978, Who's Who in American Junior Colleges in 1982-83, Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities in 1984-85, named Outstanding Young Man in America in 1986, was winner of numerous achievement and academic scholarships, and was named to the President's Honor List from 1981-1989.

Hay Hauling Accident Claims Life Of Bogata Teenager

A hay hauling accident claimed the life of Terrance Hampton, age 15, of Bogata on Saturday, August 5, when the trailer loaded with hay ran over him.

According to the Department of Public Safety Investigating Officer, Jim Trammell, the boy was riding on top of the stacked hay near the center of the trailer on a county road off 909 east of Bogata when the hay shifted, throwing the boy between the truck, driven by Oral Lee Ford of Bogata,

and the trailer. He was taken to Red River General Hospital by St. Michael's Ambulance Service where he was treated and died. The accident occurred around 12:00 noon.

The victim was the son of Nancy Hampton and the grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Elbert (Smokey) Lockhart of Bogata. He was a student at Bogata Junio High. Funeral services were pending with Brown Rigg Funeral Home in Clarksville.

Cuthand Homecoming Memories - 1989

Old friends and families gathered together on Sunday, July 30 for the annual Cuthand homecoming.

This quiet little place with only a Methodist Church and cemetery are all that remain of what used to be a busy place. It is still a busy community with a growing Methodist Church of about 50 old and new members, a volunteer fire department, a community center where the ladies still meet and quilt for the benefit of keeping the cemetery in good condition. Benefits are held regularly to support this project and the fire department throughout the year. Donations and memorials help keep this very old cemetery in good condition.

Some remember 50 years ago there was a lot going on there. This old place had churches, two cotton gins, three grocery stores, a dry goods, hardware and grocery combination, barber shop, ice house, telephone "central" post office, cannery, grist mill for grinding corn and school with several teachers that taught through the 11th grade. You could finish high school there.

The first post office was called Enterprise, which was a mile and a half south of the now community, later moved to Garvinsville, which is now Cuthand. Some of the people that had stores there were Bill Garvin, Dick Elder, Zeke Mauldin, W.A. Mauldin, W.T. Mauldin, Bart Duyt, Jim Good, Uncle Hick Blissard, Andy Mankins, George Holdaway, Sam Morse, H.B. Mauldin, A.G. Pittman, Jim Eaves, Lee Blissard, Everet Latimer, John Leach, Bill Hufstедler, Lenard Byrd, Tom Maulding, Jim Finch, Pete Robertson, Jesse Bratton, Lenard Bond, Luther Kelso, Roy Mankins, Ruby Williams, Lonzo Eudy, Rosco McCulloch, Elmer Arnold, Clive Blissard and Vernon Harville. Vernon was the last store owner.

The first school was a log cabin on Ben Ringo's farm, 1/2 mile from Cuthand now. The first church was Whiteoak Baptist, organized under a White Oak tree by Parson McCulloch.

Cuthand was settled by wagon trains with families by the names of Morse, Smith, Ware, Delevan, Monroe and Garvin and probably a lot of other names not ever recorded. This data comes mainly from Carrie McCulloch, which she obtained from her mother and an uncle who was a teenager on the first wagon train.
