I suggest you go sit down next to your driveway, and look at the rocks. If you have a concrete driveway, or asphalt, go find a neighbor who isn't so lucky and look at their driveway. Failing all that, try finding a gravel road.

"Why" you have surely queried by now, "would I go and sit on the ground and look at a bunch of rocks?"

Well, because it is interesting and fascinating!

It began some time ago, when we got a load of gravel on our driveway, and our neighbors got a load of gravel on their driveway.

Our neighbors got smooth, round rocks. I picked up a handful and was delighted to find that they came in greys, browns, reds, pinks, creamy whites, cold gray, and a host of other colors. Each rock had different stripes and whorls, each was absolute unique. I even borrowed a bagful to put around the top of some potted plants (keeps cats from digging, but that's another story).

I assured my neighbors that they were welcome to a paper bag full of OUR driveway rocks.

I explained to my husband that the rocks we had were boring...they were simply gray and white rocks, all crushed up.

But Sunday afternoon I was motivated to start tossing some of the loose stones back into the middle of the driveway to keep the mower from hitting them.

That's when I began to notice the mystic tales contained in those stones!

The white chalky stones were evidence to the fact that all of this area once was under the sea. Imprinted within those stones were all manner of fossils.

There were big shells, little shells, fish fins and corals.

Several pieces were round and long, like coral, and where they broke there were delicately sparkling crystals, all arranged in a slender spiral!

There were the beginnings of geodes, those round rocks that contain beautiful hollowed out spaces filled with glittering structures.

There were striations of wrinkled stone that spoke of massive sea-bed pressures.

It was startling what mute tales from millions of years ago were there, just for taking a little closer look.

Soon I was engaged in a kind of treasure hunt, picking up chunk after chunk to see what I could discover.

It may seem an odd sort of past time...but it's inexpensive, fun, and there really IS a lot to be learned about the past in those fossils.

Don't think I'm too crazy...take a look at those rocks. I'll guarantee that more people will be interested than won't be.

## Rozell Races In Regional Cross-Country Enduro Circuit

On March 10, David and Tiffany Rozell of Bogata traveled to Murfreesboro, AR with Jim and Brandon Thomas of Paris and Donnie Glover and Mark Reed of Clarksville to compete in a regional cross-country enduro circuit race.

Brandon, Mark, and Donnie took home trophies in their respective classes.

"It was a real tough race, Lake Greason was up two feet, practically making some of the low-lying trail virtually impassible," said David, who brought home the overall A championship trophy on Sunday evening.

The trail consisted of some 60 miles of breathtaking scenery around Lake Greason.

David has competed in one prior race this season in Muenster. There he won his class and missed the overall

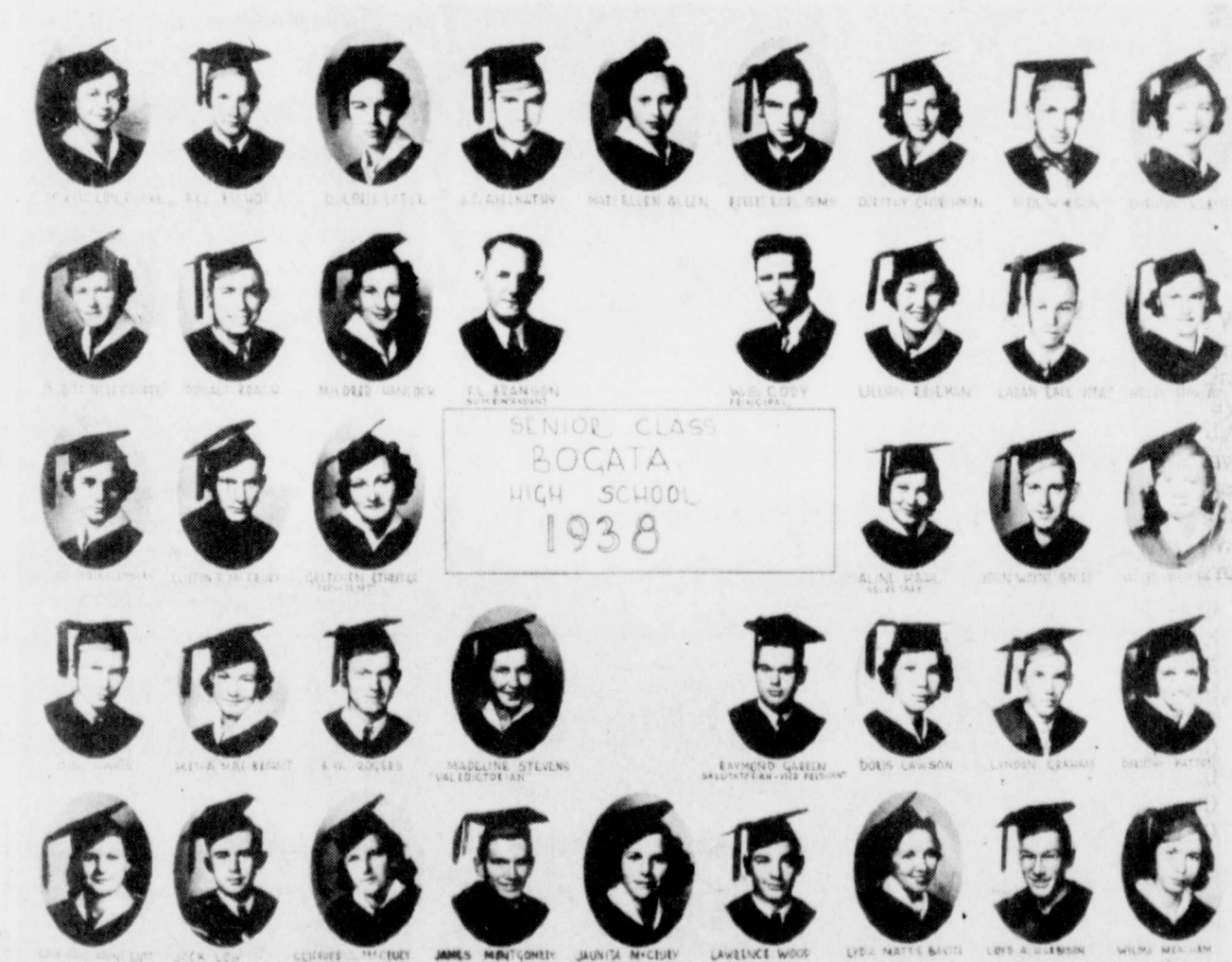

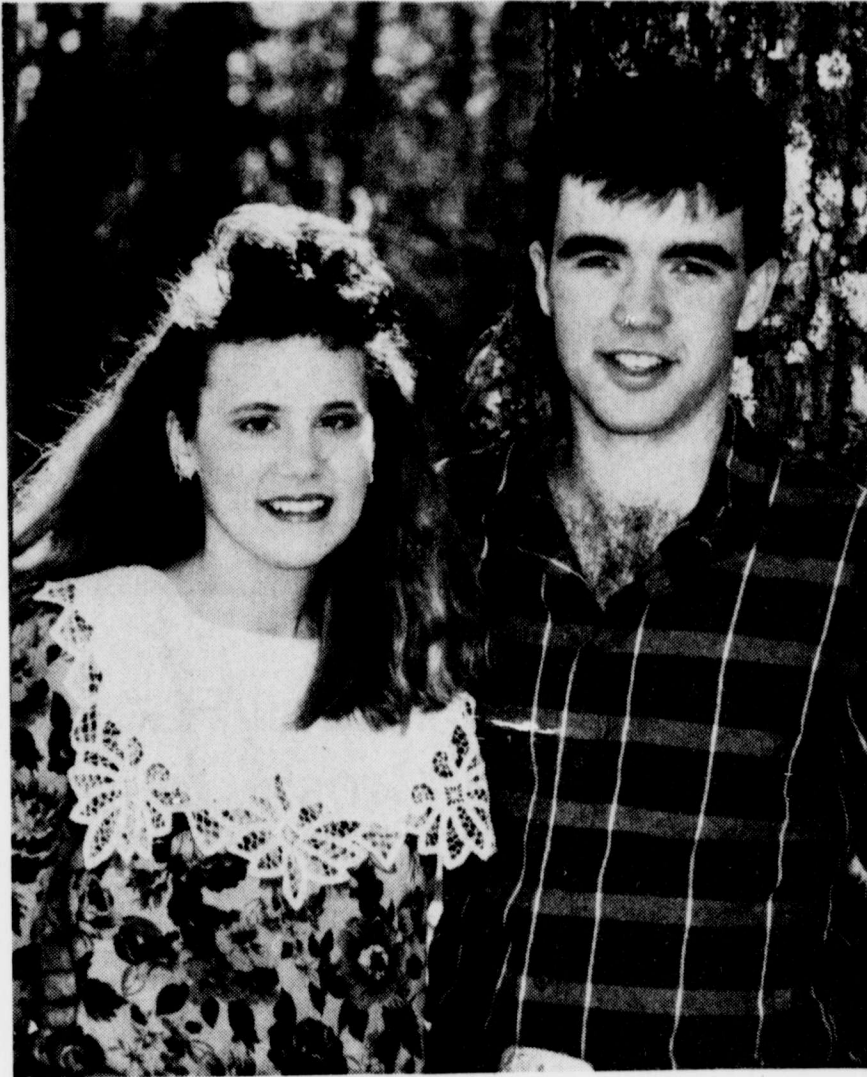

Bruce Gravel, 29, of Mesquite, died Monday, March 19 at Plan Medical Center in Plano.

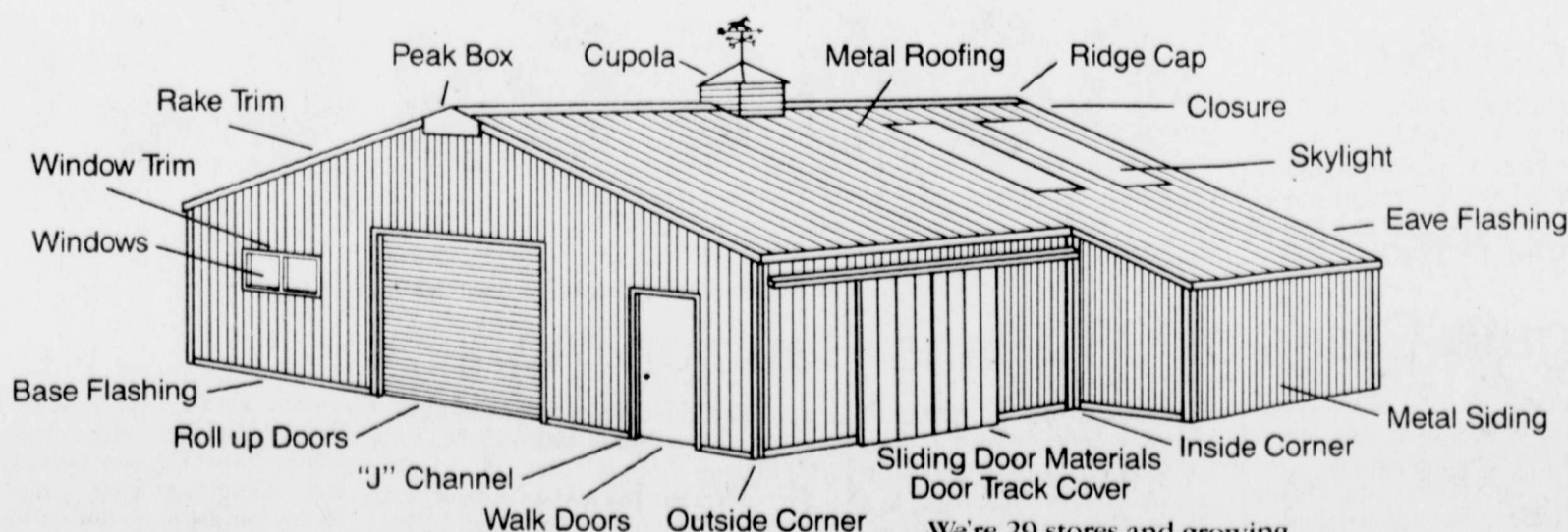
