## Familiar Faces

One of the most familiar faces of Bogata is that of Dr. E.E. Brooks.

For the past 39 years of practicing medicine in Bogata, his familiar face has always been accompanied by his helping hands and giant-sized heart.

Few people who have lived for any period of time in the Bogata area during this 39 years, have failed to experience his medical knowledge and caring, untiring bedside mannerisms.

His decision to become a doctor was reached with the aid of a role model; his grandfather, a physician who practiced medicine in Colorado in the early 1900's, later moving to Texas to retire. E.E. Brooks grew up listening to stories of his grandfather's medical accomplishments and practice. From an early age, E.E. Brooks knew he wanted to follow this field.

Bogata almost didn't get Dr. Brooks. The committee searching for a physician approached his brother, Jim, who graduated from a different medical school in the same year, decided to continue to practice in Ft. Worth. Therefore, Dr. Brooks started his practice in Bogata in July of 1952.

The greatest accomplishments that Dr. Brooks feels he has achieved in his 39 years of service is the acceptance of the people to have confi-

dence in his practice. He has had the joy of using his personal medical knowledge and viewing first-hand friends and other patients respond to his personal treatment and know how and, over a period of time, being healed of a disease or injury. On the other hand, he has seen occasions when apparently every medical and treatment ability failed to cure someone. This situation touches the heart and mind of any small town physician and Dr. Brooks is no exception.

On a humorous side, Dr. Brooks shared a situation several years ago when he was summoned to a remote home, late at night, deep in the Sulphur River bottom. Directions were practically impossible to follow and at the end of the road pavement, he was met by family members with a mule to ride through the bottoms to the sick patient.

Dr. Brooks hopes when his medical practice has ceased, people will look back at his many years of service to humanity, as being at least "adequate to their needs".

When time comes for a need to pass the medical torch of Bogata to another physician to serve their needs, to be a part of everyday life, it will probably be the desire of the citizens of Bogata and surrounding areas to try to locate another E.E. Brooks.

## February Sales Tax Rebates Break Records

"Texas cities and counties will enjoy a tidy post-Christmas bonus, because this month's total local sales tax rebates are the largest in the state's history," Stat eComptroller John Sharp said today.

The Comptroller's office today mailed checks totaling \$177.4 million to cities and counties across Texas that collect the local sales tax.

"February's total rebates are always large because they include sales taxes collected by annual, quarterly and monthly taxpayers, but these broke by \$19.5 million the old record set in February of 1989," Sharp said. "That's an increase of 12.4%."

Reports filed by monthly taxpay-

ers reflect sales made in December.

"Christmas retail sales may not have been as bright as some folks had hoped, but the state's economy still looks good when compared to the nation as a whole," Sharp said.

Local sales tax rebate checks to cities increased 11.5% over last February's payment of almost \$144 million for a total of \$160.5 million.

Locally, Bogata received \$4,962.36 for a 19.46% increase. Clarksville received \$29,014.76 for a 1.47% increase while Detroit received \$1,854.92 for an 11.65% increase.

Mt. Pleasant received \$150,593.88, for a 5.01% increase.

Talco received \$2,572.75 for a 4.67% decrease from the 1990 February payment.

Blossom received \$4,415.28 for a 26.18% increase.

Deport received \$2,919.64 for a 14.47% decrease over the 1990 payment for the same period.

Paris received \$357,424.65 for a 6.77% increase.

Checks to counties totaled \$16.9 million, up 23% from last February's checks of \$13.7 million. The hefty increase is largely due to more counties now collecting sales tax than did at this time last year.

Houston received the state's largest check of \$26.8 million. Dallas received the state's second largest payment of \$15.7 million and San Antonio received \$8.9 million and Austin received \$6.4 million.

Merchants collect the state and local sales taxes and send them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state retains its share and rebates cities and counties their local portion of the sales tax each month.

All city and county sales taxes must be approved by area voters. Most areas put the money in their General Fund and use it for local operations like fire fighting, maintaining roads and law enforcement.

### Banana Nut Cake

1/2 cup softened butter or margarine  
1 1/2 cup sugar  
2 eggs, lightly beaten  
4 tablespoons butter milk  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
1 cup mashed ripe bananas  
1 1/2 cups all purpose flour  
1 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. soda  
1/2 tsp. baking powder  
1 cup chopped nuts

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, buttermilk and vanilla and heat well. Stir in bananas, combine dry ingredients with creamed mixture. Stir in nuts. Bake in greased 9x5x4 loaf pan at 375 for 50-60 minutes. Or bake in mini-loaf or small loaf pans without frosting for banana bread.

### Cream Cheese Frosting

1 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese softened  
1/4 cup melted margarine  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
1-1 lb. box powdered sugar  
Combine and blend well. Frosting for 1-13x9x2 cake.

### Mammaw's Pecan Pie

This recipe makes enough filling for 3-9" or 2-10" pies.  
3 cups sugar  
2 1/4 cups syrup (1/2 lt. & 1/2 dark karo)  
6 tablespoons flour  
3/8 tsp. salt  
1 1/2 cups chopped pecans  
9 eggs  
1 1/2 c. milk  
6 tablespoons butter  
3 tsp. vanilla

Mix sugar, flour and syrup together. Add milk and well beaten eggs, then add salt, vanilla, pecans and melted butter. Mix well and bake at 400 for 15 minutes, then lower oven to 350 for 30-35 minutes. Test with knife inserted in middle should be clean when done.

### Oil Pastry Crust

1 cup sifted flour  
3/4 tsp. salt  
1/4 cup oil  
2 tablespoons cold water

Mix ingredients together and roll between two layers of waxed paper. Makes a single crust.

### Apricot Instant Tea Mix

1-18 oz. jar Tang  
1 cup sugar  
1/2 cup presweetened lemonade mix  
1/2 cup instant tea  
1-e oz. apricot jello

2 1/2 tsp. cinnamon  
1 tsp. ground cloves  
Mix and store in airtight container. To serve: 1 1/2-2 tablespoons, mix to 1 cup boiling water.

### Sweet & Sour Coleslaw

1 large head cabbage, finely shredded  
1 large onion, thinly sliced  
3/4 stalk celery, thinly chopped  
1 bell pepper, thinly chopped  
Heat to boiling:  
1 cup vinegar  
1 cup sugar  
3/4 cup oil  
1 tsp. celery seed  
1 tsp. mustard seed  
Salt and Pepper  
Pour over vegetables. Refrigerate overnight.

## EIA Rules And Regulations Changed

Effective February 25, 1991, several rules concerning EIA (Equine Infectious Anemia) were put into law, according to the Texas Animal Health Commission.

For the purpose of entering shows, fairs and exhibitions, the new ruling is:

Equine originating in Texas and: (1) Entering racetracks-Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and a negative test for EIA conducted within 6 months

prior to entering the track; or, (2) Entering interstate shows, fairs and exhibitions (those functions that admit horses from outside the state)-Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and an egative test for EIA conducted within the previous 12 months; or, (3) Entering all other events-Must only have a negative test for EIA as shown on VS Form 10-11 conducted within the previous 12 months.

## Social Security Notes

By Ray Hudson, District Manager

Most Social Security and Supplemental Security Income overpayments result from beneficiaries not promptly reporting changes that affect the amount of, or entitlement to, their checks. Failure to make a timely report can result in a penalty as well.

The single biggest cause of Social Security overpayments is beneficiaries not reporting, or under reporting, yearly earnings. Some benefits must be withheld if 1991 earnings will exceed \$9,720 for those who are 65-69 years old, or \$7,080 for those under age 65. This report must be made directly to Social Security by any beneficiary under age 70 whose earnings will go over these limits.

There are special rules that apply to disability beneficiaries including disabled widows and disabled adult children, who work. For these people any work must be reported, regardless of the amount of earnings. We need to know about any medical

improvement as well. SSI recipients must report any change in their income and resources, as well as any change in living arrangements. As other income increases, the SSI check must decrease. There is a resource limit each year that must be carefully observed. A living arrangement change can also cause the SSI check to increase or decrease.

Other events that must be reported by all beneficiaries are: death or marriage of the beneficiary; a change of address; and a beneficiary who is no longer in custody of his or her representative payee.

We send a booklet about events that must be reported along with every benefit award letter. It is the beneficiary's responsibility to make these reports promptly in order to avoid overpayments and possible penalties.

You can make a report by calling your nearest Social Security Office.

AMENDING A TAX RETURN

I I you wish to correct information on an individual tax return that you have already submitted to the IRS, you need to file Form 1040X with your local IRS Service Center.

Examples of what you may want to change:

- Filing status from married filing separate returns to a joint return.
- Incorrect figure used for an income item. You may have used the wrong number, or you may have received corrected information after your return was filed.
- Incorrect figure used for a deduction item.
- An exemption allowance. For example, you may have claimed a dependent that your ex-spouse was entitled to claim, or you may have forgotten to claim your mother whom you support.
- Replacement of residence. At the time you filed your original return you may have expected to purchase a new home within two years of the sale of your old residence. Now you have the information about the replacement-or you know that you will not be replacing the home.
- One thing you may not change after an original filing is filing status from a joint return to married filing separate returns if the due date for the original return has passed.

Generally, the amended return must be filed within three years after the date the original return was submitted or within two years after the time the tax was paid (if the date is later). For most taxpayers, April 15, 1991, is the deadline for amending 1987 federal individual income tax returns.

Unless you have experience preparing amended returns, you should seek professional assistance. Amending a return requires an understanding of the amendment process as well as an understanding of the original return.

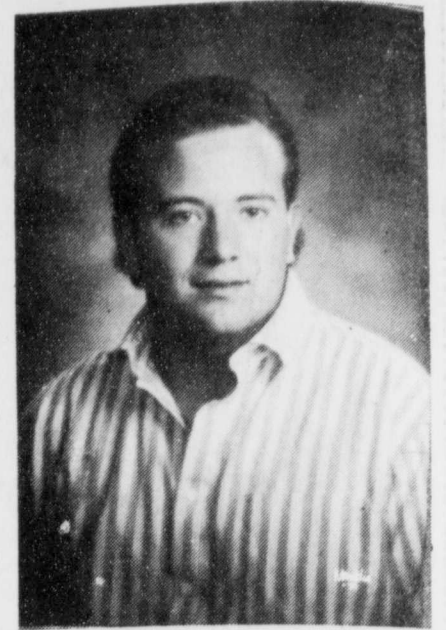
