

Of course, it wasn't Koolaid he had taken a swig of, it was hum mingbird food!


While I was howling with laughter my husband was looking at me with a mixture of irritation and perplexity. Obviously, he couldn't see what was so amusing about drinking something ruined.

Coach Wood then presented the Rebel-Lady Rebel Booster Award to Jerry Russell for his support for all the RHS teams.


The program was concluded with the graduating seniors receiving their trophies for participation in the Rivercrest Athletic Program.




Naomi attends the First Baptist Church in Bogata and teaches a Sunday School class, which has been more than a 35 year tradition. She also helps with Bible School in June.





Statement of Intent to Change Rates


In accordance with the regulations of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, Texas-New Mexico Power Company announces the Company's intent to change rates for its entire Texas operations. The effective date of such change is May 17, 1991. All classes of customers will be affected by said proposed changes. The proposed rates will produce an increase in gross revenues to the Company over test year revenues adjusted for test year customer growth and weather and annualization of test year rate increases of \$35,836,827, or 9.63%. TNP is proposing an alternative rate base treatment for Unit 2 of TNP One, the second unit of the Company's generating facility located in Robertson County, Texas. Under this alternative, sale-leaseback treatment will be given to Unit 2, thereby including a lease payment in the cost of service, as opposed to traditional rate base treatment. If adopted, the sale-leaseback plan results in an increase in gross revenues of \$31,210,197 or an 8.38% increase over adjusted test year revenues during the first year of the plan. Texas-New Mexico Power Company provides electrical service to more than 165,011 customers located within the state of Texas.

A complete copy of the requested rate filing package is on file with the Public Utility Commission of Texas in Austin, Texas, and with all cities served by Texas-New Mexico Power Company which have retained original jurisdiction. You may inspect a copy of the filing during normal business hours at each business office of Texas-New Mexico Power Company in your area.

Gate Case Settlement Is Apparent In Red River County

River County Commissioner H. Drue the property fully accessible. The Pirtle and Johntown-area resident Dan Kelley has apparently been reached, thus settling an argument that partially entailed the classification of the Moon Ranch Road and Kelley's right to keep a gate across it.

Kelley's attorney, "We settled the lawsuit, but Judge Baker (District Judge K. Baker from Carthage) hasn't yet settled the judgment. The document has to be prepared and signed by all parties before this is finished."

According to Cornett, partial details of the settlement include provisions for the county to maintain the road and install cattle guards to keep Kelley's cattle on the property. In addition, the county will not require Kelley to fence in both sides of the

A tentative settlement between Red road, thereby allowing him to keep road runs through the middle of Kelley's property.

Also part of the settlement, according to Cornett, is the dropping of criminal charges against Kelley for blocking a public road. Kelley was According to Leighton Cornett, arrested on the day that county officials removed the gate from the road. Authorities said Kelley used a vehicle to block the thoroughfare. The dropping of civil charges by Pirtle in a related suit is also said to be a part of the settlement.

According to Pirtle, the settlement is made up of nine parts. J.D. "Don" McLaughlin, counsel for Pirtle, was hesitate to discuss the settlement, claiming he didn't want to jeopardize the outcome by going into details.






