PUBLIC NOTICE BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SPECIAL ELECTION AUGUST 10, 1991

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 42 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the newly created county education districts to hold elections to exempt from ad valorem taxation a percentage of the market value of the residence homestead of a married or unmarried adult. The percentage exempted could not exceed 20% of such market value, and the amount exempted could not be less than \$5,000. The amendment would also authorize county education districts to hold elections to exempt from ad valorem taxation not less than \$3,000 of the market value of the residence homestead of a disabled person or a person sixty-five years of age or older. Finally, the amendment would authorize elections in county education districts for the taxation of certain tangible personal property exempted from ad valorem taxation by the legislature.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to allow the voters of a county education district to adopt certain exemptions from the district's ad valorem taxation for residence homesteads and to provide for the taxation of certain tangible personal property."

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 5 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the legislature to pass general laws authorizing Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board or its successor to issue and sell up to \$300 million of general obligation bonds to finance educational loans to students. The maximum net effective interest rate to be borne by the bonds would be set by law. The amendment would also authorize the legislature to provide for the investment of bond proceeds and to establish an interest and sinking fund to pay the bonds and provide for the investment of such fund. Bonds authorized under this amendment would be paid from the first money coming into the treasury in each fiscal year that is not otherwise appropriated by the constitution, less any amount in an interest and sinking fund established at the end of the preceding year that is pledged to the payment of the bonds or interest.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds to provide educational loans to students."



To The Editor: In 1973 my wife and I bought a tract of land in the Pine Branch Community, Red River County, consisting of 71.5 acres. In 1976 we sold almost 11 acres. In 1984 we received a letter from a law firm stating that we were delinquent on taxes for th eyear 1974, on this same land, but on 60.56 acres and that we should pay this immediately or risk having to pay penalty, interest, attorneys fees and court costs. Whoa. Look back! In 1974 through 1976 this tract consisted of 71.5 acres. Shouldn't that have been ared flag? We knew we did not owe any back taxes. In those days there was a discount if paid early and we

always paid our taxes when we

received the statement. We imme-

diately contacted our attorney,

since it had been 10 years and we no longer had records for that year. He sent a letter and proof that we had paid the tax. We, nor our attorney, received a response to this letter. A few months later we received another letter form the law firm stating the same thing only with penalty and interest added. Our attorney sent proof and an answer to this letter and still no response from the law firm. Some months later we get still another letter from the law firm with more penalty and interest added. I took the letter to the county tax office and asked if someone could help me, that we did not owe the tax and that we continued to get these threatening letters. They told me the only thing I could do was pay

them and that would take care of it. For years we continued to receive these statements with penalty and interest added each time. I finally wrote a letter to the law firm-no

In May of this year I went to the county tax office and asked them what could be done to get this stopped. They said "pay it." I said I would not because I did not owe it. I then called Janice Gooding at Gooding Title Company and aske dher to help me. She worked a day and a half and found proof we had paid all our taxes for that and every other year. She took that proof to the tax office and presented it to them. In a matter of a few minutes the tax office checked their records and confirmed they were indeed paid-paid October of 1974! Couldn't they have checked thi syears ago? It would have only taken a few minutes and isn't party what they are paid to do?

The lady at the tax office called

me and said "Mr. Gayler we are terribly sorry for this inconvenience, you were double billed for taxes in 1974. Since we went on computer in 1984 this has happened many times."

The point is, how many of those many people who were double billed, after being threatened with penalty and interest, attorneys fees and court costs, rushed up there and paid taxes they had already
