## Red River Co. Gets Drug Dog

Red River County Attorney Jack Herrington and Sheriff Bob Edrington announce the purchase of a fully trained "drug dog", "Goose" is a sixteen month old black labrador retriever who has been trained at Scentry Place in Grandbury. The name Goose comes from the movie Top Gun. Goose is the daughter of Maverick. Sheriff Edrington states, "Goose will be a valuable tool for my department in the war on drugs. Other counties who have used drug dogs have had remarkable success in the detection of drugs and the arrest of

those dealing in drugs."

Herrington split the \$5,000 cost of the dog with Edrington. The county attorney's office has discretionary funds available from drug forfeitures and hot checks which can be used for the expenses of his office and for other criminal justice purposes. "I feel my contribution for the purchase of this drug dog is an investment in our children's future. Acquiring this dog is another step in our joint efforts to combat the drug element in Red River County," Herrington said.

The sheriff's part of the cost will come from his Drug Forfeiture Fund.

## Scouts Hear Program From Fireman/EMT

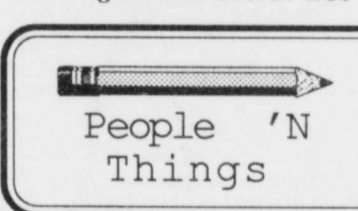

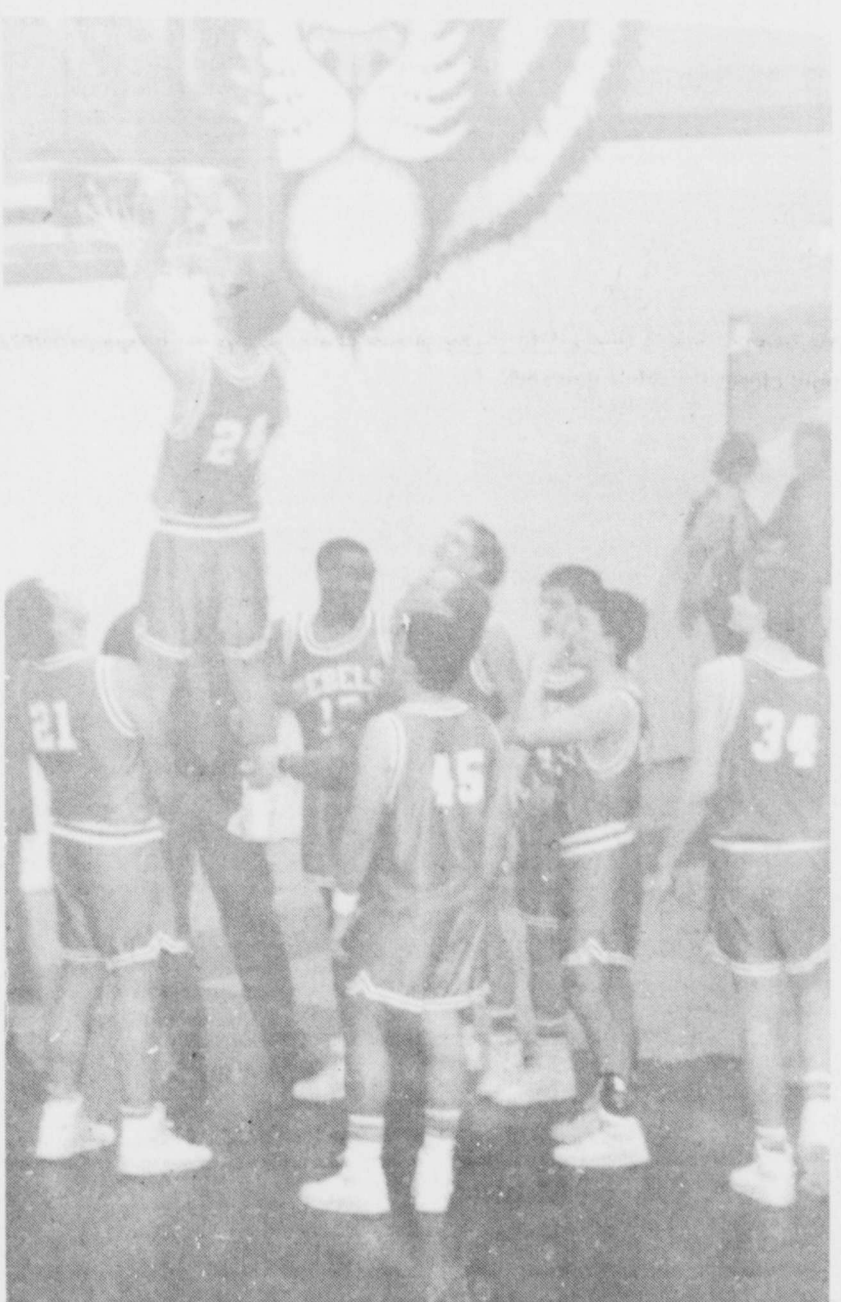

This week I went to Deport, and interviewed one of my favorite people. I could have written an article about my daughter-in-law, Lila Screws, without an interview, but I wanted her to write her recipes for me, and I wanted to take her picture. If I didn't goof up the picture, you are looking at a picture of a very pretty girl. She and our son, Mike, have been married almost 13 years and they have three daughters, Bren 11, Kara 8 and Halli 4.

I wanted to feature Lila earlier, but they were building a new home and moving in. I didn't want to intrude on what had to be a very hectic time. The new home is lovely. I think Halli's description is probably the best I've heard, she says it's "bootiful".

Lila works at Deport School as an aide. She keeps records for the children's breakfast and lunch programs. She also assists the teachers as needed. Lila has been working full time at the school for a year. Before that she was a substitute teacher and did private babysitting at home. She says she loves her job, and loves working with the children and teachers. Mike is employed at Campbell Soup in Paris. Lila and Mike both attended Paris Junior College and Lila attended ETSU.

Lila's favorite things to cook are sweets. Her favorite form of relaxation is her aerobics class at The Body Works in Bogata. She also enjoys staying outside as much as possible during pretty weather. She says that when the girls and Mike play ball, she

is their biggest fan. They are members of the First Baptist Church in Deport.

I asked Mike before he and Lila married if she knew how to cook. He said that he knew she could make french fries and cookies, but wasn't sure about anything else. When they married, they spent a lot of time on the phone getting recipes for things that Mike liked. The reason they had to call so often was because they wouldn't write down the recipes when they got them.

Lila's parents, Glen and Mamie Fletcher, live in Roxton. Mrs. Fletcher is an excellent cook. Their problem wasn't a lack of good advice on cooking, it was just the fact that kids seem to get a feeling of security and continuation from keeping some of their own family traditions. Lila was very good natured about Mike calling Mama and me for recipes. She is still good natured about it, because they still don't write the recipes down.

Lila says her family's favorite meal is smoked sausage, hot links, pan fried potatoes and pinto beans. She is sharing recipes for a German Chocolate pie and oatmeal scotchies that she got out of a cookbook her brother, Jeff, gave her, The Great American Bake Sale. The chess cake and Mississippi Mud cake recipes came from a North Lamar School cookbook. The sour dough biscuit recipe was Mama's.

I hope you enjoy the recipes. Have a good week.

### German Chocolate Pie

By Lila Screws

- 1 cup granulated sugar
  - 1/2 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
  - 1/2 cup evaporated milk
  - 1/2 cup chopped pecans
  - 1/2 cup shredded coconut
  - 2 eggs, beaten
  - 1/4 cup melted butter
  - 9" unbaked pie shell
- Preheat oven to 400. Blend all ingredients except crust in mixing bowl. Pour into pie shell. Bake 30-35 minutes, until filling is set. Let cool, then chill several hours before cutting.

### Oatmeal Scotchies

- 2 cups all purpose flour
  - 2 tps. baking powder
  - 1 tsp. baking soda
  - 1 tsp. salt
  - 1 cup butter or margarine, softened
  - 1 1/2 cups firmly packed brown sugar
  - 2 eggs
  - 1 Tbsp. milk
  - 1 1/2 cups quick cooking rolled oats
  - 12 oz. pkg. butterscotch morsels
- Preheat oven to 375. In medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder, soda and salt. Cream butter and brown sugar. Beat in eggs, milk and oats. Stir in dry ingredients and butterscotch morsels. Drop by tablespoonfuls 2 inches apart on greased cookie sheets. Bake 10-12 minutes until golden brown. Cool 5 minutes. Gently lift with spatula and cool completely on racks.

### Chess Cake

- 1 stick oleo, melted
  - 2 eggs
  - 1/4 cup oil
  - Butter cake mix
- Mix all together, spread in 13x9 greased pan. 1 stick oleo, room temperature 1-8 oz. cream cheese, room temperature 2 eggs, beaten 1 box powdered sugar
- Mix and spread over first mixture. Bake at 325 for 1 hour.

### Sour Dough Biscuits

- 1 tsp. sugar
  - 1/4 very warm water
  - 1 pkg. rapid rise yeast
  - 1/2 cup sugar
  - self-rising flour
  - buttermilk
- Put yeast and 1 tsp. sugar in water and stir. Let it dissolve for about 30 minutes. In large mixing bowl, put 1/2 cup sugar and 2 cups buttermilk. Now add the yeast mixture and stir. Add enough self-rising flour to make it doughy where you can knead it. Pour the dough out on floured dough board or any flat surface and work it. Add a little flour to the dough if it is too sticky. Roll dough out about 1/4-1/2 inch thick. Cut out the biscuits and put in oiled pans. Preheat oven to 425 and cook til brown. You can freeze the uncooked biscuits in oiled pans until ready to use. Be sure to set them out early enough for them to thaw completely.

**Blood Drive Is This Saturday**

This Saturday, March 6, from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. there will be a blood drive for Rev. C.G. (Glenn) Renfro. This will be held at the Deport American Legion Building at the north end of main street in De-

port.

A blood goal has been set of 50 units of blood.

A number of questions have been asked concerning who can and cannot donate blood. The question has been asked if blood could be purchased.

Blood cannot be purchased through Stewart Blood Center. It could be purchased, they think, through the hospital.

As to who can donate blood, virtually anyone.

People who are on high blood pressure medicine can usually give blood, even if they are on medication. Blood pressure will be checked, and if it is abnormally high they will not take blood. There are other conditions which would keep someone from donating, such as pregnancy.

The best thing to do is call Stewart Blood Center's office in Paris at 785-9399 or ask your questions the morning of the blood drive.

To those with a "needle phobia" it is well to note that they will not persist in trying to take blood if a vein is difficult to find. They also say that they do this all day, and frequently are told how easy and painless they make the procedure.

The entire blood donation takes about 20 minutes, ten minutes to fill out the medical history card and ten minutes to take the blood.

Rev. Renfro has been a very important part of this area, ministering to hundreds during their time of need.

Now, he faces serious kidney surgery, which can require large amounts of blood.

This is a chance to say, in some small way, "Thank You" to him. And, if he does not require the blood, there are many others who will benefit from the blood taken.

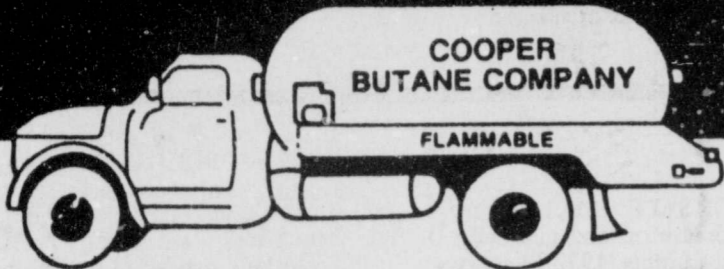

### Comments From Your County Attorney

The District and County Attorneys Association of Texas has made numerous recommendations to our legislature with regard to criminal justice. I strongly agree with most of these proposals. Some of these recommendations are as follows:

1. The policy of the State of Texas should be to provide adequate resources to allow local communities to punish as many offenders locally as possible.
2. All parolees and probationers must be busy at work, community service, or a day reporting center for a minimum of 40 hours a week.
3. Have felons serve a much greater percentage of the time assessed upon conviction.
4. Truth should be told to juries and the public by telling juries about the actual time served by a felon on a particular sentence.
5. Increase the range of punishment for repeat offenders.
6. Incorporate parole supervision into the local probation department in order that the local court and judge can oversee the parolee and send him back to prison if he violates his parole.

These ideas and proposals can help insure that those convicted of crimes don't get a free ride. I am in contact with the leaders of our association in Austin with regard to these issues. Your comments and suggestions are welcomed. The policy of my office is to seek stronger laws to protect you and me, the law abiding citizens of Red River County, and to aggressively prosecute those who insist on breaking the laws.
