## Talco-Bogata CISD Board Addresses Business

The Board of Trustees of the Talco-Bogata CISD met in Regular Meeting, April 19, in the Bogata Cafeteria.

Trustees present were: Jerry Russell, Frank Stubblefield, Mollie Williams, Ricky Franks, Buford Hervey, and Sandre Ingram. Eddy Brown was absent. School personnel present were: Superintendent Freddy Wade, Ray Miller, Jimmy Lee, Johnny Gable, and Janice Franks.

Others present were: Kay Kennedy, Utley Nowlin, Gerald Foster, Bill Supan, Jerry Smith, Pat Moles, Teresa Allison, Debora Mears, Kathy Hinsley, Jo Hinsley, and Lillian Taylor.

Jerry Smith spoke on behalf of the Varsity Cheerleaders' parents and asked the board to buy new uniforms. No action was taken at the meeting, but has since been approved. Minutes of the previous meetings were approved. The financial, cafeteria, and tax reports, and payment of bills were read and approved.

The Co-operative Purchase Agreement with Region VIII was approved. The Resolution concerning line of credit was approved.

Mr. Nowlin presented information concerning Pre-Kindergarten for the 1993-94 school year.

Mr. Foster presented changes to cut cost of Bogata Addition, Mrs. Kennedy presented information on the TAAS results, and Mr. Wade gave the board information concern-

ing the problems with slow payments on the health and dental insurance.

It was decided that the May election results will be canvassed on May 3. A resolution for the inactive tax roll was discussed. It was tabled until more information is available.

It was decided to sell the property on SW 7th St. in Bogata for taxes. The waiver for implementing the Algebra 1-4 two year program was approved. The bus driver shortage was discussed and Mr. Wade is to come up with a salary schedule for the bus driving and extra trips.

The motion to approve 6 teachers for Level III and 28 for Level II and paying Level III \$3,000.00, and Level II \$1,500.00 carried.

It was approved that Mr. Wade's salary should be raised by \$1,500.00. A motion to increase the high school principal's salary by 3% and elementary and Junior High principals by 5% failed for lack of a second.

A motion to increase high school principal salary by \$1200.00, and elementary and jr. high principal's salaries by \$1100.00 was approved. A motion to place the business manager on step 3 of the Bachelor's Teacher scale was approved, with one trustee abstaining from the vote.

The board went into executive session at 12:20 AM. The meeting was re-opened at 1:05 AM.

The meeting adjourned at 1:10 AM.

A couple of weekends ago when I was being kind enough to taste of all the chilli at the CASI Chilli Cook-Off in Deport, I ran across Gilbert Arriaga and his Chilli. I had heard about his cooking, but had not had occasion to do much sampling. The chilli was delicious. I asked if I could feature him and his cooking in this column. He said that I could. Then we tried to make plans to get together. This was not as easy as it would seem. He finally just gave up and came down to the office and we visited here, which worked very well.

Gilbert and Melissa live in Deport. He works in the Quality Lab at Kimberly Clark in Paris. He has been employed there for 9 years. They also spend a lot of time with their favorite pastime, which is going to the pasture, where they have goats, horses, and geese. The horses are Melissa's. She's a real outdoors girl. She had once thought about being a Veterinarian, but decided she didn't want to go to school that long. The Arriagas haven't been married but a couple of years. Gilbert was a widower. He told me a cute story about when he and his deceased wife, Edith lived in West Texas. He said they almost ran out of anything to cook, but Edith had taken everything she could come up with and made Bologna Stew. I'm sure most wives could identify with that predicament at some time or the other. I know that I can.

Gilbert was raised in Dallas. His family always lived in a Mexican Community. He learned to cook by

his mother and grandmother. He said that most of the dishes they fixed had a small amount of diced meat in them and large amounts of vegetables, rice, pasta, or beans. He didn't have a hamburger patty or a steak until he was in junior high. He was also introduced to bread at the same time. He had always eaten tortillas with his meals. His favorite dishes now are either, roast beef or chilli.

The Arriagas travel all over Texas to cook-offs. Gilbert is a Life member of CASI. He also likes to cook stew and beans at charity events.

Gilbert has had to alter his recipes in the last few years to accommodate a diabetes condition. He tries to make most of his food without refined sugar and with most of the fat eliminated. He has promised to send me sugar free recipes as he tries them out, and makes sure they taste good. He has also had to add a 20 minute exercise routine to his schedule every morning to improve his health.

Every year at the Red River Valley Exposition and Fair at the Paris Fairgrounds, Gilbert has a booth with good things to eat. This year he plans to use a French theme. He will have French Cuisine, a Matre de, and possibly even Can Can girls. Sounds interesting.

I appreciate Gilbert's being nice enough to help me out by coming to the office. I hope you all enjoy the recipes. They look really good. We'll be looking forward to the sugar free ones after he weeds out the ones which aren't wonderful.

**DIABETIC OR WEIGHT CONSCIOUS MOUSSE PIE**

1 - Pkg. D-Zerta Whipped Topping (Nutra Sweet)  
1 - Box Sugar Free Instant Vanilla Pudding  
1 - Graham Cracker Pie Shell  
2 - Large Bananas or 1 banana and 1 cup sliced strawberries (mixed)  
2-Pkgs. Sweet & Low, or Nutra Sweet

Mix pudding according to directions on box. Set aside. Prepare whipped topping by directions on box. Fold 1 cup of whipped topping with pudding. Slice bananas and layer in graham cracker crust. Sprinkle sweetener over bananas or fruit. Pour pudding over fruit. Then top with remaining 1 cup whipped topping, refrigerate. Variations- Use 2 bananas and chocolate pudding. Do not stir fruit with pudding. Just place in the bottom of the crust

**Mexican Chicken Goulash**

1 1/2 Tbsp. oil  
3 Boneless chicken breasts (cut in bite size chunks)  
2 Small diced zucchini Squash  
1 Small can Whole kernel corn  
1 Small can stewed tomatoes  
1/4 chopped onion  
1 tsp. Garlic Powder  
1 tsp. Cumin Powder  
1/2 tsp. Parsley or Corriander  
1 Can Chicken Broth

Fry chicken pieces in oil until chicken is half done. Add onions and saute with chicken. Add chicken broth and rest of ingredients. Cook on medium until done.

**Quick Cowboy Salsa**

1/4 chopped or diced onion  
1 Tbsp. oil  
3/4 cup of your favorite salsa  
Saute onions in oil over medium heat until tender. Add salsa to sauteed onions and bring to a boil for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and serve over eggs of any style or may be served over any type of steak, or pork chops.

Recipe will yield approx. 1 to 1 1/2 cups of salsa.

**Cheese Enchiladas**

2 1/2 cups of shredded cheese (Longhorn, Monterey Jack, or favorite cheese)  
3/4 cups of chopped onion  
1 can Old El Paso Mild Enchilada Sauce  
1 pkg. of 12 Corn Tortillas

Combine 2 cups of cheese and 1/2 cup onion or more and set aside. Dip tortillas in hot oil to soften, approx. 2 seconds on each side and stack on a plate. Dip each tortilla in the enchilada sauce and top with cheese and onion mixture. Roll-up and place seam side down, pour the rest of the sauce over the top of the enchiladas. 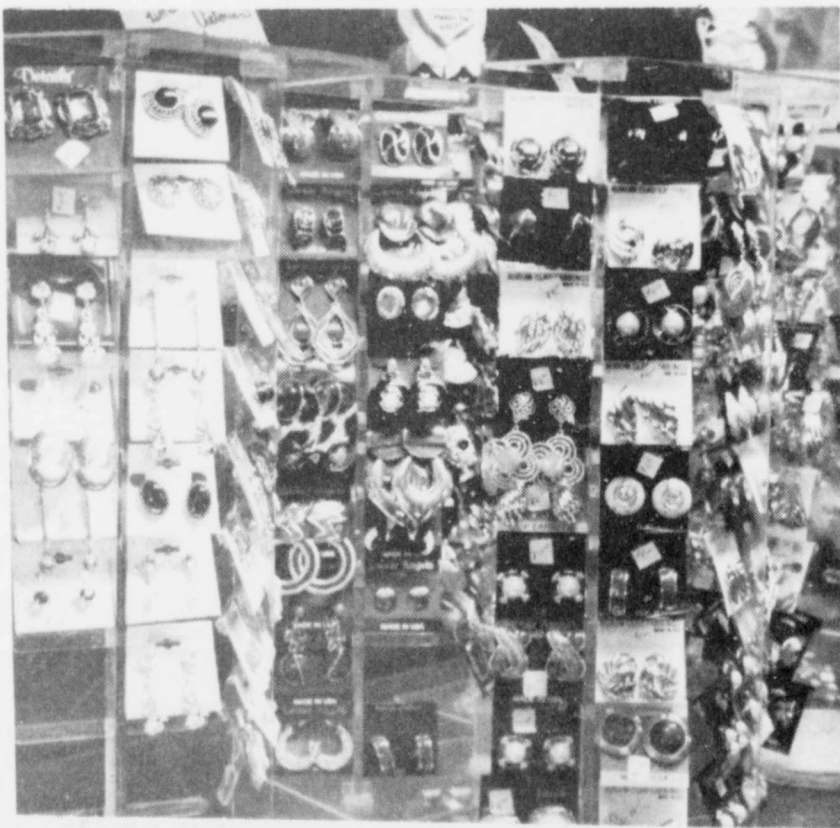

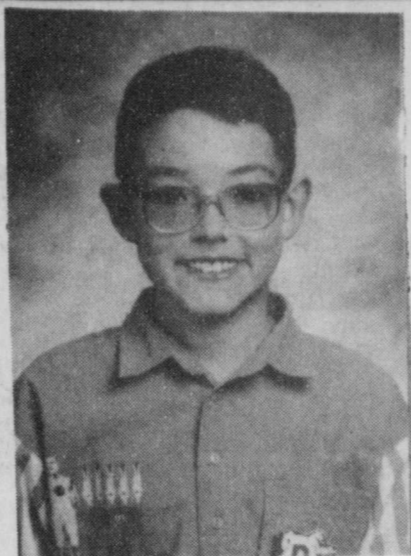

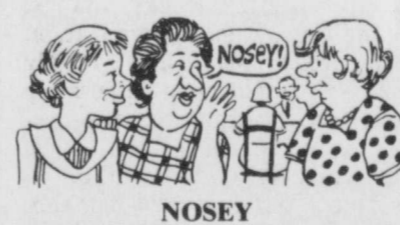
**Letter To The Editor**

**Comments From Your County Attorney**

Jack Harrington

One of the major problems facing Red River County and all of Texas is what to do with the ever increasing backlog of prisoners. Our jail is full. Our prisons are full. No one wants convicted felons to be set free on the street. What is the solution? We must have more jail and prison space. Our legislature is attempting to address this problem. The Senate has passed a criminal justice package which includes:

- creation of regional 'state jails' with 20,000 new beds by September 1, 1995
- place most thieves and drug users that we convicted in "state jails"
- double prison time for violent offenders such as capitol murder, murder, aggravated kidnapping, aggravated sexual assault, aggravated robbery and use of a deadly weapon while committing a felony.
- increase minimum time served for capitol murder to 45 years

The House should be acting on these proposals soon. Hopefully these kinds of measures will help the overcrowding problems. In about a month this session for the legislature will be finished. I will report the final crime package at that time.
