Of course, it became more and more difficult as the jar became fuller. Each time the jar lid was raised several bees or bugs would escape unless the catcher moved swiftly and accurately to capture the next victim!

Whether it was bees or lightning bugs, chasing around the yard in erratic patterns in pursuit of the elusive little fellows was a whole world of entertainment.

Being a soft hearted youngster I always turned my "prey" loose at the end of the day.

I know from talking with other people that not all kids were so considerate...many left their bug collection until the poor things died.

All in all, of course, the insects uncaught outnumbered the insects caught by enormous amounts, and no serious population decline ever occurred.

It was nice to see the youngster in his yard with his little jar, though.

In today's Nintendo and TV oriented world- in a time when organized sports take on awesome proportions, it was nice to see evidence that the fine childhood art of bug catching hasn't suffered a serious setback!

Talco-Bogata Board Decides On Construction At Bogata Campus

Talco Bogata CISD met in special called meeting Monday, June 7th. The Bogata Elementary, Junior high Cafeteria.

The board heard from Freddy Wade, Superintendent where he reviewed the summer work schedule for the business office, tax office, and all school offices including maintenance personnel.

All employees will work 10 hour days Monday through Thursday from June 14th to August 6th.

Superintendent Wade also presented a letter of appeal that he had written to the Commissioner of Education asking for adjustment in the 1992 Tax Values due to a 24% loss of mineral values within the district.

The board accepted the resignation of Roy Tom Stone, girl's basketball coach.

They accepted the recommendation of Bogata Principal Jimmy Lee to hire Wendi Hall as Math Teacher at Bogata Junior High.

They reviewed building needs at Bogata. They decided that they would add a porch awning on the front of Bogata gymnasium, modernize the back of the gym and the stage area and make two public restrooms and dressing rooms.

They propose to build two classrooms on to Bogata Elementary and renovate the restrooms in the Bogata Elementary School.

In this construction the school would act as contractor.

The board adjourned at 9:30. The next regularly scheduled Board Meeting is June 14 at 7:30 at Rivercrest High School.

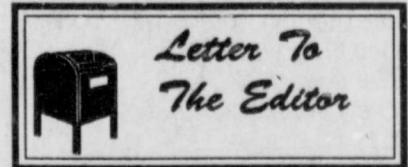
Playday and Trail Ride Planned
