City Council Considers Property Acquisition

The Bogata City Council met Monday, July 11. The meeting was called to order with these members attending: Eudy, Harbison, Puckett, Ramsey, O'Donnell, Couch and Bush.

Jeff Puckett gave the invocation. Minutes were read and approved. Bills and final accounts were read and approved.

A presentation was heard by citizen John Haynes for permission to install a sewer for a new house. This will be checked by the City Council and Haynes will be informed at the next meeting.

In old business a hearing was held on the Horton property at 333 Third S.W. Billy Wayne and Joyce Horton will work every Sunday on the property until it is cleaned up.

Under new business, the Council considered a resolution establishing the necessity for acquisition for property in connection with TCDP. A unanimous vote of approval was received.

The Council also considered a contract with the appraiser to approve appraisal services for the city's 1992 Texas Community Development Program. Lewis Columbo of Henderson, TX was hired.

The Council clarified emergency leave in employee's handbook. Deleted the last sentence on page 9, section 4, "unusual circumstances will be brought before the council."

Jeff Puckett commended the work done on the City Park before the meeting adjourned.

Talco-Bogata CISD Holds Special Meeting

The Talco-Board CISD Board of Trustees held a special called meeting Wednesday, July 6.

At this meeting the trustees adopted a resolution agreeing to the selling of a Talco property that had been acquired due to back taxes and held by the City of Talco.

The resignation of the High School Principal, Ray Miller, was accepted by the board. He has accepted the Superintendent's position at

Aspermont, Texas.

The Board also accepted the recommendation of the Superintendent to hire Pasty Moles as a teacher on the Talco campus.

The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to the procedure for filling the vacant high school principal position.

The next meeting of the Board will be on July 14, 1994 at 7:30 p.m.

It seems that most of the news today about young adults is bad. I would like to commend a young man in our area for a good deed.

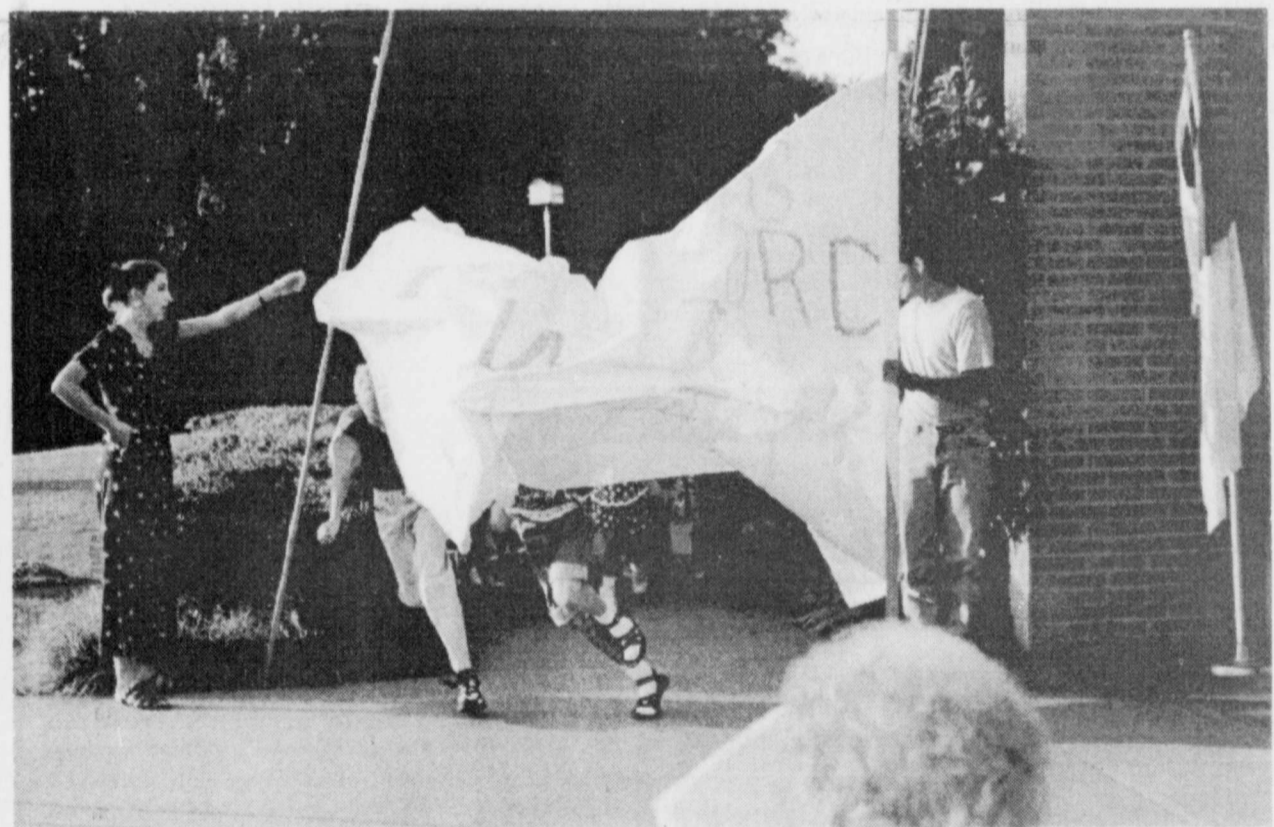

Monday was a special day for her. She celebrated her 85th birthday and says that her birthday is very special to her. Her mother always told her that was her day and no one could take it away from her.

She has been married to Mr. Bonner for 65 years and they have three children. I tell everyone that my baby is starting high school this fall, well Mrs. Bonner says her babies will all be in their 60's in August and is so proud of every one of them.

Her oldest, Larry, lives in Sylvan and is married to Melonese. She has another son, M.H. and he is married to Martha. They live in Arlington. Her daughter Rita and her husband, Jack, live in Bedford.

She loves to have visitors and relatives come to see her because she loves to cook and this is her way of sharing with everyone.
