A presentation was heard by citizen John Havnes for permission to install a sewer to a new house. This will be checked by the City Council and Haynes will be informed at the next meeting.


In old business a hearing was held on the Horton property at 333 Third S.W. Billy Wayne and Joyce Horton will work every Sunday on the property until it is cleaned up.

The Talco-Board CISD Board of Aspermont, Texas. Trustees held a special called meeting Wednesday, July 6.


At this meeting the trustees adopted a resolution agreeing to the selling of a Talco property that had been acquired due to back taxes and held by the City of Talco.



It seems that most of the news today about young adults is bad. I would like to commend a young man in our area for a good deed.



# Immunization Clinic Scheduled

The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 4 & 5 North office, announced plans today for the continuation of the on-going immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations.


The next clinic will be held July

The clinic will be conducted from 9:00-11:30 and 1:00 to 2:30 p.m. at 1300 Highway 37 North, Clarksville,

Future clinic dates will be held on the first, second and third Thursday of each month. Parents may call the clinic for an appointment for their child, (903)572-9877, or arrive on a walk-in basis.

The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children beginning at two months of age. Im-

munizations offered include Measles/ Mumps/Rubella, Oral Polio, Diptheria/Tetanus/Pertussis and Tetanus/diptheria. The Haemophilus Influenzae type b vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 2 months and 60 months. The pneumonia vaccine is available to all high risk patients meeting income guidelines. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/ diptheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should the parent or legal guardian have questions, please contact the above noted field office staff.


Many people blame law enforceproblem long ago. Law enforcement else's feelings either.


