## Bogata City Council hears ideas on animal control

Council approved a Fair Housing Proclamation naming April as Fair Housing month.

a street light at the entrance to the Senior Apartments on Highway 271 South was approved.

Joncie Young of KSA Engineers, Inc., advised the Council to award the contract for paving Circle Drive, Third Northeast and Patterson Streets to the low bidder, Buster Paving Co. of Sulphur Springs. The bid was in the amount of 4172,898. Council voted to pass a resolution to award the contract to Buster Paving Co. contingent upon contractor approval by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. Construction should begin May 1 and be finished in August.


Mayor Eudy reported the Senior Citizens Center is doing well, with approximately 35-50 people being fed each Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at noon.

**Egg Salad Dressing**  
 5 hard cooked eggs  
 1/2 cup salad oil  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1/2 teaspoon pepper  
 1/4 cup lemon juice  
 Mash egg yolks in bowl. Add oil and mix well. Add lemon juice, salt and pepper and chopped egg whites. Stir well; serve on lettuce leaves.

**Shrimp Salad**  
 1 cup large shrimp-cooked and chopped  
 1 cup chopped celery  
 3 hard boiled eggs-chopped  
 1/2 cup mayonnaise  
 salt and pepper to taste  
 Combine all ingredients. Serve on lettuce leaves or stuff large tomato. For variation add 2 tablespoons of chopped pickles or 2 large avocados, diced and sprinkled with the juice of 1/2 lemon.

**Hot Baked Chicken Salad**  
 2 cups chicken-cooked and chopped  
 2 cups celery-chopped  
 1/2 cup pecans or almonds  
 1 can water chestnuts  
 1 cup salad dressing  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 2 teaspoons minced onion  
 2 tablespoon lemon juice  
 1/2 cup grated cheese  
 1 cup potato chips-crushed  
 2 hard boiled eggs  
 Combine all ingredients, except cheese and chips. Pour into greased casserole dish. Sprinkle cheese and chips over top. Bake at 375 degrees for 25 minutes. Can substitute 3/4 cup cream of chicken soup for 3/4 cup cream of chicken soup for 3/4 cup mayonnaise.

**Baked Deviled Egg Casserole**  
 6 hard boiled eggs  
 2 teaspoons prepared mustard  
 1/4 cup mayonnaise  
 3 tablespoons plus 3/4 cup sour cream  
 2 tablespoons butter  
 1/2 cup chopped green pepper  
 1/3 cup chopped onion  
 1/4 cup chopped pimiento  
 1 can cream of mushroom soup  
 1/2 cup grated cheese  
 Halve eggs lengthwise; remove yolks. Mash yolks, mustard and salt together with 3 tablespoons sour cream. Fill egg whites with yolk mixture. Melt butter in large skillet. Sauté pepper and onion until tender. Remove from heat; stir in pimiento, soup and remaining 3/4 cup sour cream. Place 1/2 of soup mixture in 1-1/2 quart shallow baking dish. Arrange eggs, cut side up, in single layer on top. Pour on remaining soup mixture. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until heated through. This may be made in advance and refrigerated until ready to bake. Just bake a few minutes longer. Serves 12.
