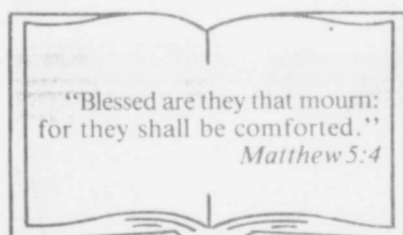
Big night at Rivercrest Friday, Feb. 7

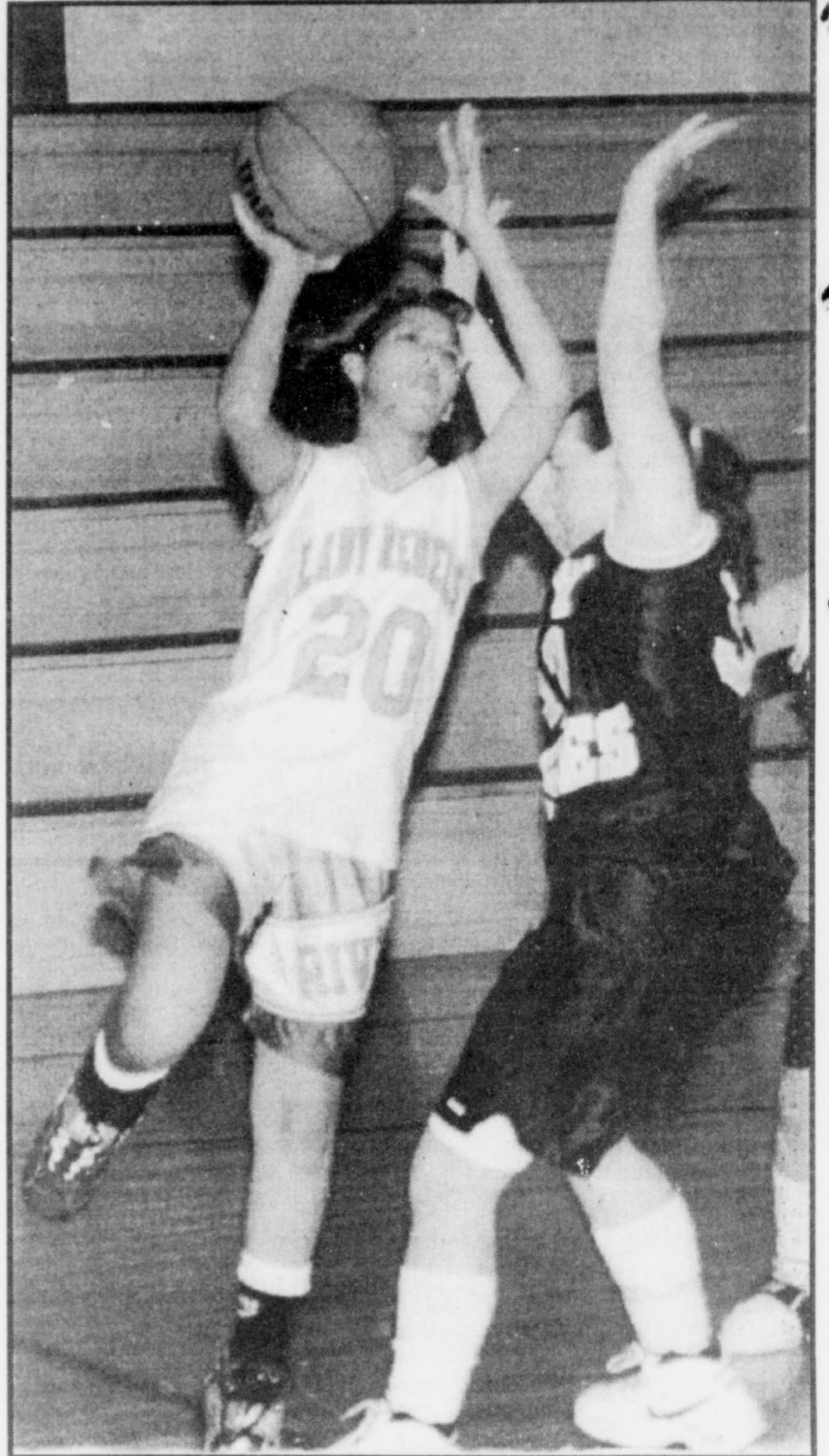

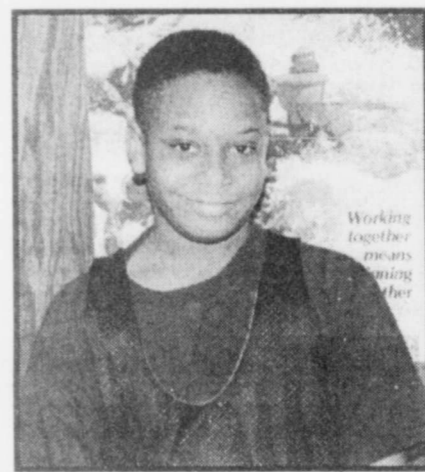

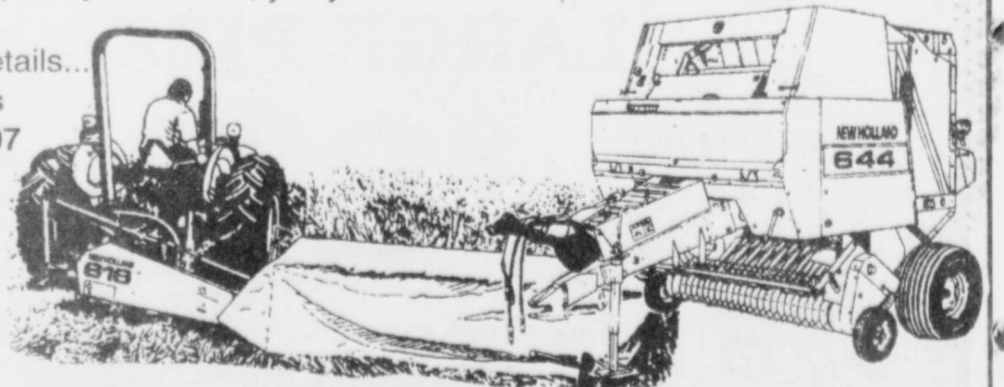

Young Rebels clobber Mustangs

The Mustangs soon tied the game by connecting on one of their free throws. Then added two more at the penalty stripe. Clinton Cheatwood soon sank a jumper to tie the game at 21. Michael Ray Galloway sank both his foul shots and Kyle Stansell netted two off a Michael Craig Smith rebound off the Mustang goal. This sent the teams to the locker room with the score a close Rebels 25 Mustangs 23. The Third quarter always seems to be where the Rebels get their teamwork to come together. Monday night was no exception. The Rebel press seems to improve each game. During third quarter action passes from Rebel to

Chisum came out fighting in the fourth quarter, sinking two quick baskets. Keith Hines soon took a rebound the length of the court for two, Kyle Stansell soon added two more after a great defensive steal. A picture perfect Hines to Cheatwood pass added two more for the Rebs, Keith Hines turned around and stole the ball back to add two more Rebel points. Coach Schultz soon sent in four fresh Rebs from the bench and they in turn continued the Rebel defensive press which wore on the frazzled Mustangs. Continued foul trouble on the Chisum team found them with two more players fouled out for the night and no more subs to put in. Chris Tidwell and Michael Craig Smith pulled down rebounds and Myron Ellis and Chris Hall kept up an outstanding defensive effort that played havoc on the four remaining Mustang players. Final score sent the Mustangs home with a loss of 46-69.

Chase Collins lead the way in the Rebel scoring with 17, Keith Hines had 16, Kyle Stansell 14, Clinton Cheatwood, 10, Michael Ray Galloway 8 and Chris Hall rounded out the Rebel score with 4.

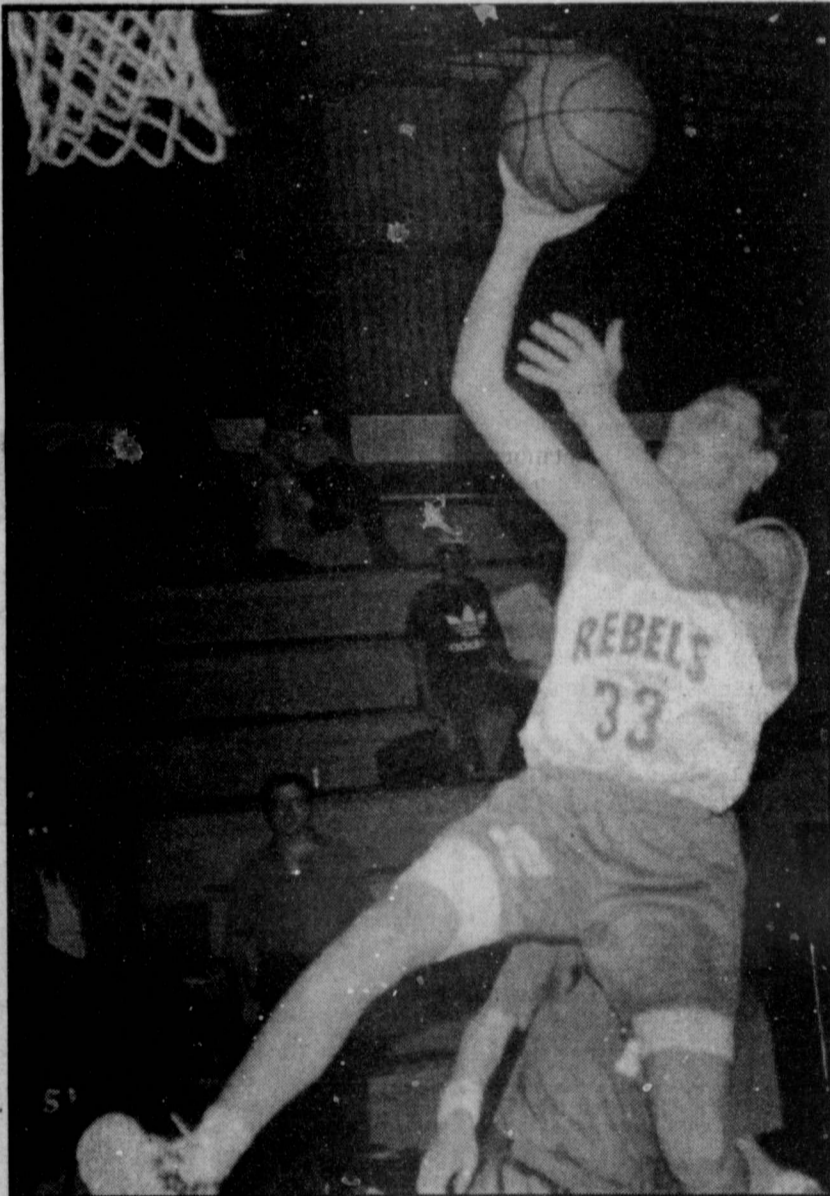

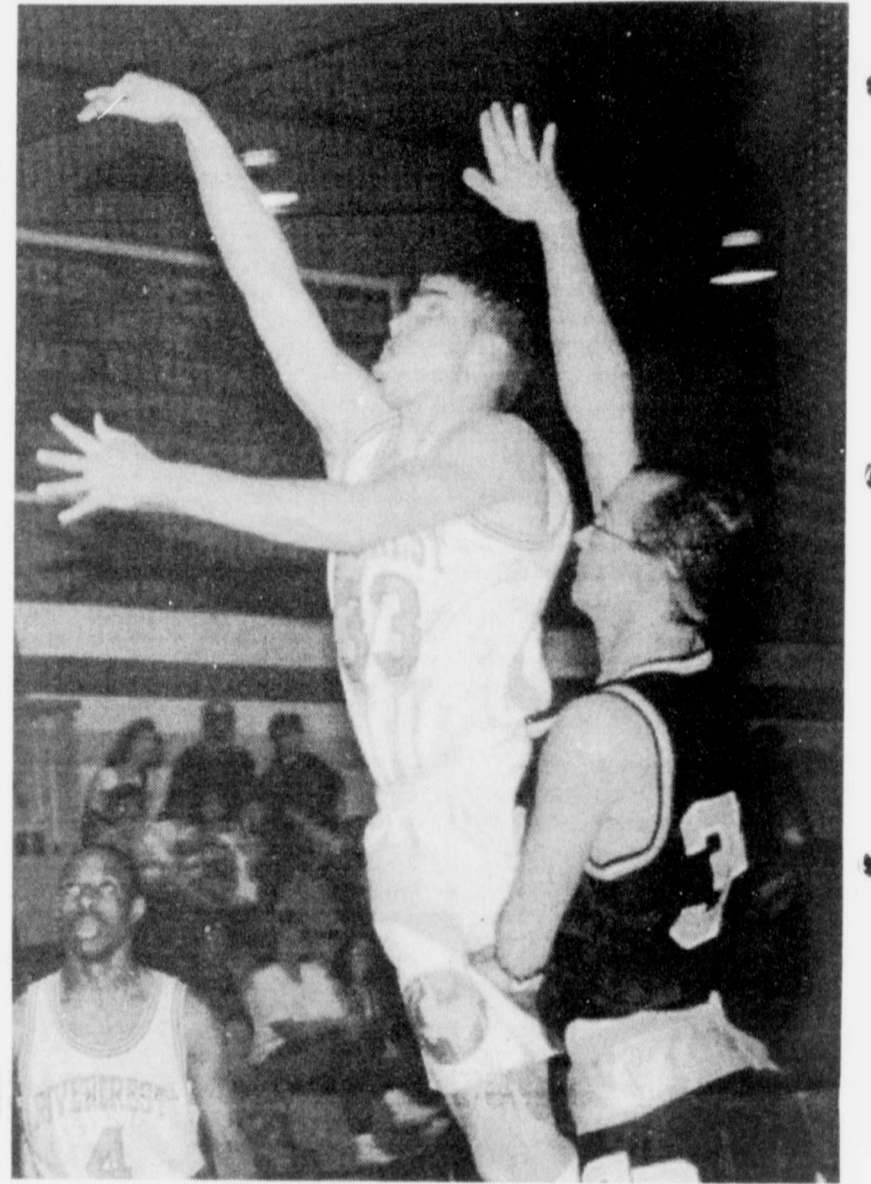

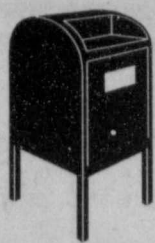
Reed is one of nearly 3,000 Marines and Sailors who departed Camp Pendleton, CA in October as part of
