## Bogata city council tends to lengthy agenda

The Bogata City Council met Monday, May 10 and attended to a number of items on the agenda.

The oaths of office were administered prior to the meeting to new council members.

Mayor Garretson acknowledged Kelly Boyd and Merle Hughes as outgoing city officers and conveyed the council and the city's appreciation. Jack Crane and Edd Spencer assumed their positions on the council.

"Hear Visitor" request forms were passed out to the public attending the meeting.

Wendell Davis, Wyatt Bush, Charles Clegg and Charles Don Lewis gave departmental reports for each of their departments. Charles Don Lewis requested that the city repair the roof of the fire station so that the fire department will be able to purchase a computer with the \$1,300 remaining from the city's commitment to the Fire Department. Teresa Smith recommended bids be obtained for the roof repair.

Under old business W.T. Harbison has requested about the COPS grant. Charles Clegg reported the progress of the grant funding.

Mayor Pro Tem W.T. Harbison, Mayor Garretson recognized Mr. Harbison. A special meeting was scheduled for Monday, May 17, 1999 with an agenda to include items requested by Mr. Harbison.

Under new business, they discussed the possible action on the repair or replacement of the old 1975 flat bed city street truck and possible action on the selling of the 1988 Ford Dump Truck. Motion was made to table any action until Monday, May 17.

An audit agreement for year-end, Sept. 30, 1999 from Arnold, Walker, Arnold & Co., P.C. was introduced by the mayor. The council voted to accept the agreement.

The council accepted an agreement with Red River county Sheriff's Office for dispatch service and TCIN/TCIC for \$100 per month to be paid the 20th of each month with starting period of April 20, 1999. The council decided to pay one year at a time.

A discussion of Peddler's Permit Ordinance was held. Cost revision was one thing discussed. They amended the ordinance to \$10.

The decision was made to announce the testing of the warning siren at the

noon hour on a daily basis.

A commission, including Teresa Smith as chairperson, W.T. Harbison, Joel Jeans, Wyatt Bush and Cecil Doyle was formed to review and possibly make changes to all ordinances in the City Ordinance Book.

Options on back log in accounting were discussed. Sherry Huddleston's contract to set up the accounting, using Peachtree Software at a cost of \$500 for initial set up and \$250 per each month of business was accepted.

A discussion was held on assistance from GDM Construction on the city's efforts to repair city streets. Gary Messick discussed this with the council and general cost estimates on street repair were heard. Action on the item was tabled.

Announcements were made: New council members training session in Mt. Pleasant; Mission statement, goals and objectives from all council members for the upcoming months to be prepared and ready for discussion at next council meeting, or if requested at special or workshop meeting; part time summer help through the JTPA program.

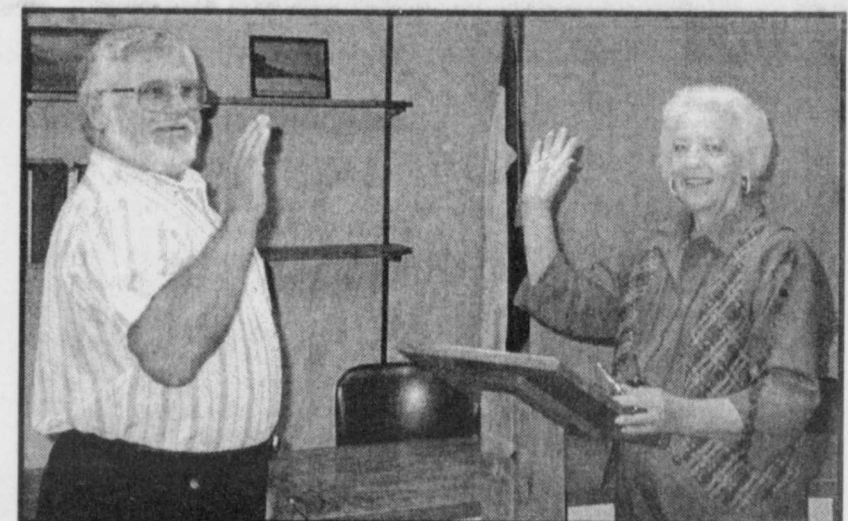

Just Recipes!

**Turtle Cheesecake**  
2 cups chocolate wafer crumbs  
1/4 cup sugar  
1/3 cup butter-melted  
3 (8 ounce) packages of cream cheese-softened  
1-1/4 cups sugar  
4 large eggs  
1 (8 ounce carton) sour cream  
1 tablespoon vanilla extract  
1/4 cup butter  
1 cup (6 ounces) semisweet chocolate morsels  
1 (12 ounce jar) caramel topping  
1 cup chopped pecans

Combine first three ingredients; stir well. Firmly press mixture into bottom and 1 inch up sides of a lightly greased 9-inch springform pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 10 minutes. Cool in pan on wire rack. Beat cream cheese at medium speed until creamy; gradually add 1-1/4 cups sugar, beating well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition and scraping sides and bottom as needed. Stir in sour cream and vanilla. Pour batter into prepared crust. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour and 5 minutes. Center will not completely set. Turn oven off; partially open oven door. Leave cheesecake in oven for 1 hour. Remove to wire rack to cool completely. Cover and chill at least 8 hours. Carefully remove sides of pan; transfer cheesecake to serving plate. Melt 1/4 cup butter in small heavy saucepan; add chocolate morsels. Stir over low heat just to chocolate melts and mixture blends. Spread warm chocolate mixture over cheesecake; chill 15 minutes. Combine caramel topping and pecans in a small saucepan. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Boil 2 minutes. Remove and cool 5 minutes. Spread over chocolate, cool completely. Serve immediately or cover and chill.

**Peanut Butter Apple Dip**  
1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese-softened  
1 cup peanut butter  
1 cup packed brown sugar  
1/4 cup milk  
3-4 apples cut into wedges

In a mixing bowl, combine first four ingredients; mix well. Serve with apples. Store in refrigerator.

**Creamy Fruit Dip**  
1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese-softened  
3 tablespoons orange juice concentrate  
1 jar marshmallow creme

In mixing bowl, beat cream cheese and concentrate until smooth. Fold in marshmallow creme. Serve with fruit.

**Double Chocolate Bars**  
1 package (16 ounce) cream filled chocolate sandwich cookies crushed  
3/4 cup melted butter or margarine  
1 can sweetened condensed milk  
2 cups miniature semisweet chocolate chips

Combine cookie crumbs and butter pat onto bottom of ungreased baking pan. Combine milk and 1 cup of chips in microwave-safe bowl. Cover and allow chips to melt; stir until smooth. Pour over crust. Sprinkle with remaining chips. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until chips are melted.

**Homemade Chocolate Pudding**  
1 cup sugar  
1/2 cup baking cocoa  
1/4 cup cornstarch  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
4 cups milk  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
2 teaspoons vanilla  
M & M's-optional

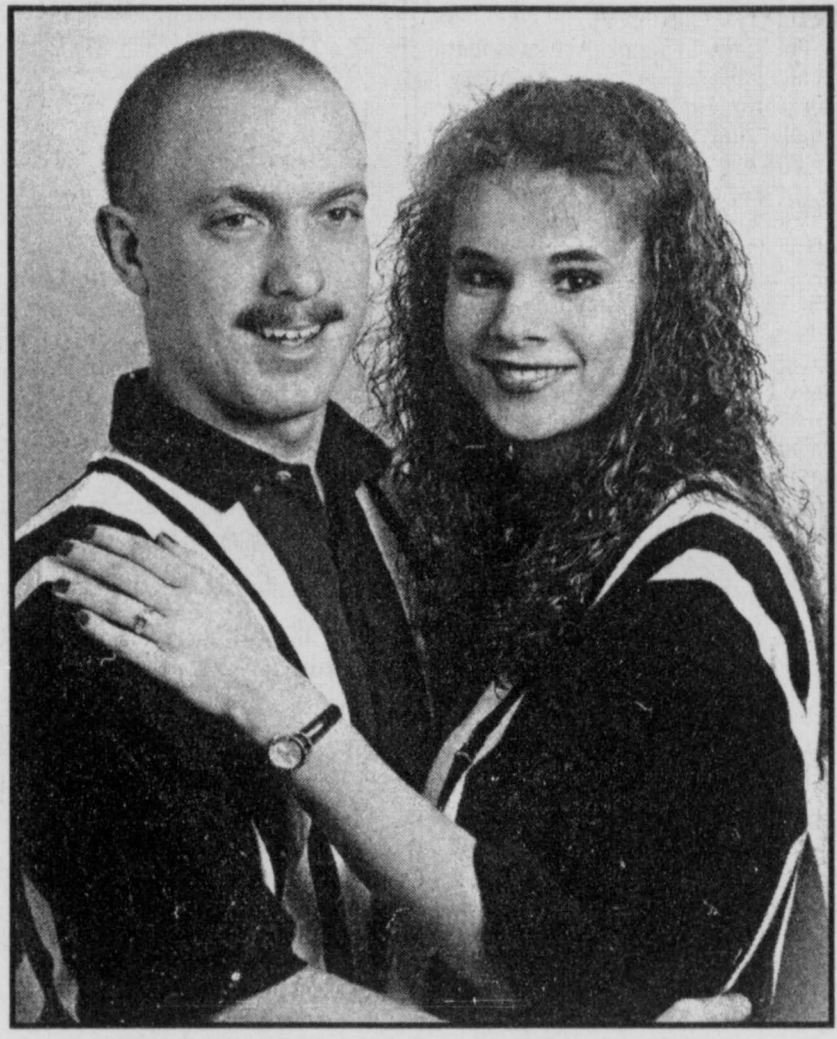
In a heavy saucepan, combine sugar, cocoa, cornstarch and salt. Gradually add milk. Bring to a boil over medium heat; boil and stir for 2 minutes. Remove from the heat and stir in butter and vanilla. Spoon into individual cups. Chill and sprinkle with M & M's or your favorite candy treats or toppings.

**Peach Cake**  
3/4 cup cold butter or margarine  
1 package yellow cake mix  
2 egg yolks  
2 cups sour cream  
1 can sliced peaches-drained  
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
1 carton Cool Whip

In a bowl, cut butter into dry cake mix until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Pat into greased baking pan. In another bowl, beat egg yolks and add sour cream and mix well. Set aside 6-8 slices to garnish. Cut remaining peaches into 1 inch pieces. Stir in sour cream mixture. Spread over crust; sprinkle with cinnamon. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until edges begin to brown. Cool of rack and spread with topping garnish.

**Fruit Medley**  
1 can peach or apricot pie filling  
2 cans fruit cocktail-drained  
1 can pineapple chunks-drained  
1 can mandarin oranges-drained  
2 medium firm bananas-sliced

In large bowl, combine pie filling and canned fruits. Cover and refrigerate. Stir in bananas just before serving.

**KOHLER'S DISEASE**

The tarsal navicular is a bone located in the foot's midarch. Kohler's disease, which mainly afflicts children between the ages of three and eight, is a degeneration of this bone caused by diminished blood supply that is the result of rapid bone growth. This disease is seldom seen in children ten years of age or older. The main symptom of Kohler's disease is pain above and slightly to the rear of the midarch, though there may also be some redness and swelling in the painful area.
