## CYCLONE DAVIS SPEAKS HERE

Quite a large crowd gathered at the Court House Tuesday afternoon to hear Hon. J. H. Davis, better known as Cyclone Davis, present his claims as a candidate for Congressman-at-Large. Hon. Oscar Martin, the Senior editor of the Haskell Free Press in a few well chosen words introduced him as a man who has done more than any other man in Texas toward driving out saloons and worthy of any trust the people might call him to fill.

Mr. Davis recounted his long services in fighting the liquor traffic in Texas, and entered into an exhaustive discussion of trusts and corporations and their control, showing by vivid comparisons how a few corporations own and control the destiny and happiness of the great masses composed of all the farmers, all the preachers, all the teachers, all the doctors, all the skilled and unskilled labor that run the trains, boats and other carriers of commerce and that dig and delve in the mines, and four-fifths of all the lawyers. In this connection he called attention to the fact that the other one fifth of the lawyers were in the employment of the big trusts and corporations advising them how to rob and steal.

His speech abounded in his usual ready wit and biting sarcasm with much therein to appeal to the civic consciousness

## Community Co-Operation

COPYRIGHTED FARM AND RANCH-HOLLAND'S MAGAZINE

While in a large hosiery mill in the East last fall I asked the sales manager at what retail price a certain lot number of woman's hose were sold. He replied: "Different prices. Anywhere from fifty to seventy-five cent a pair, sometimes a dollar."

I didn't have to ask the reason for this deplorable feature of merchandising.

The products of this mill have not been standardized, as to either price or quality, as they are marketed under unfamiliar or private brands. Consequently the buying public has no way of arriving at an equitable retail price. Nor does the ordinary retailer know whether or not he is paying his jobber more for them than or some of his competitors.

The hose, put up in an attractive package, and "talked-up" by a smooth salesman, would doubtless bring a higher price than when sold under different conditions. Nevertheless, their quality is identically the same under

all conditions, and the ultimate consumer is paying for the existence and maintenance of an inexcusable evil.

In direct contrast to the above mill and its methods are those hose manufacturing concerns place their names and trademarks on their products, advertise their merits and advantages to the public, even going so far as to state in their advertising that the articles in question can be bought for certain prices from retail stores. Their advertising informs prospective buyers what they should pay, thus protecting them against unscrupulous, exorbitant prices. You can buy standard or trademarked-advertised products from your local merchants to as good advantage as elsewhere and you are obligated to your community to trade at home, all things being equal.

**Good Crops in Haskell County.**  
Austin, Texas, June 12.—O. E. Patterson, president of the Farm-

ers' State Bank of Haskell, was here to-day on business with the Commissionary of Insurance and Banking. According to Mr. Patterson, wheat is breast high in Haskell County, and the prospects are for the largest wheat crop in many years.

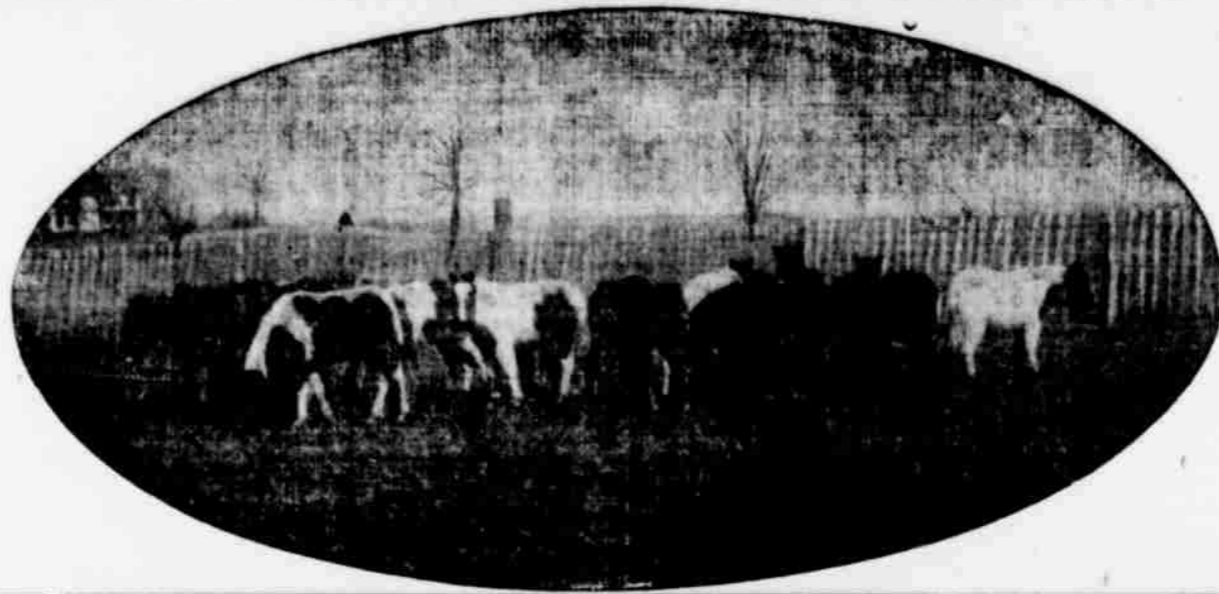
Pronouncing this the most pleasant evening of the season, the guests reluctantly bade their hostess good night.

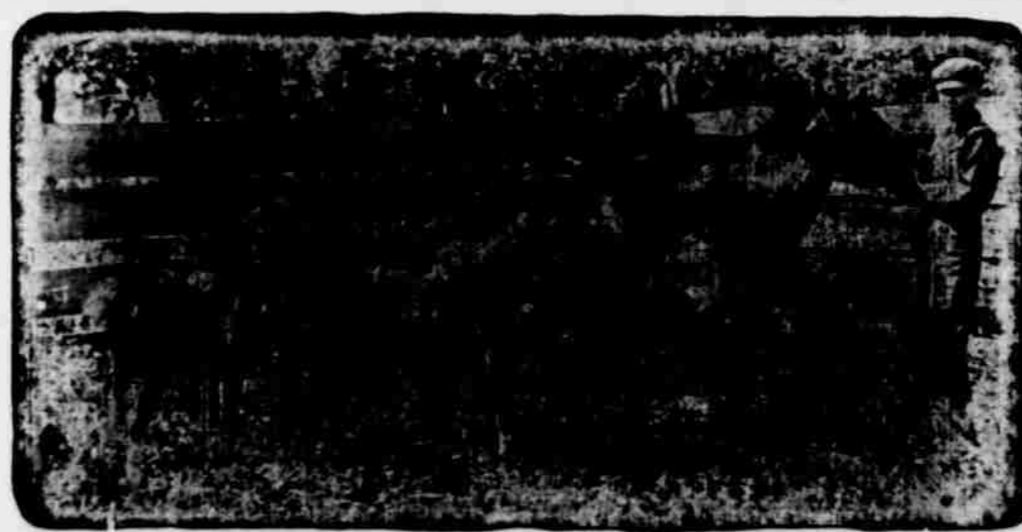
