## Emergency Medical Services

For thoseof you that don't know I am a member of the Deport VFD and a First Responder. Ivve also been covering wrecks, accidents,
fires and other terrible events fo 25 years now as a journalist. May 19th through the 25th National Emergency Services Week Just one more in a long line of "Weeks"?. Yes and No. Because emergency medical services both
professional and volunteer are more important than the average
citizen realizes. I will use the citizen realizes. I will use the word
professional to designate a paid professional to designate a paic
EMS worker, and volunteer to designate a non-paid EMS worker. But make no mistake....they both
know what they are doing and know what they are doing, and often volunteers are professionals
who serve as volunteers in their who serv
time off.
I have shared a few of my sen-
timents about EMS timents aboutEMS personnel with readers in the past, and I want to
share a few of them once more shath ald and new memories and opinions. Ihave seen volunteers and pro-
fessionals alike with ice fessionals alike with ice coating
their bunker gear, exhausted and falling for the tenth time on glaze
auto accident of the day.
I have seen professionals and
volunteers alike weep over the volunteers alike weep over the
body of a beautiful child who is past all help, or work frantically to
save the life of a child who is save the life
almost dead.
Ihe AED, used and seen people use the AED, giving a heart attack
victim the only hope of survival victim the only hope of surviva work! Even when it doesn't', have seen the comfort and care that EMS personnel extend to the
families undergoing the terible families undergoing the terrible
loss of a loved one. I have watched as volunteers break out body bags and I have searched for sheets to help cover corpse.
corpse.
I watched an elderly patient who was so scared her vitals were "off the charts" relax and settle down because of a kind hand staving off the blacknes
company. lances watched EMS on ambulances practically stumbling in weariness during a flu epidemic,
but still managing to give excel-
lent but still managing to give ex
lent care to their patients. The jolt of a beeper going off
becomes so ingrained that the becons so ingrained that the
deepest sleep is instantly shattered deepests sleep is instantly shattered
by it's shrill. Clothing is donned by it's shrinter Clothing is donned within only a minute a truck will be rolling to offer comfort and aid.
Only a few minutes after that, an ambulance will be on hand also. I know from personal experience that EMS personnel in the
areasournewspapers serve is fast areas our newspapers
efficient and caring.
Volunteers struggle to obtain
as much training as por as much training as possible, and they struggle to raise money for
both training and equipment. both training and equipment.
EMS faces challenges with contracts and pay, but it never stops them from doing their very best
for their patients for their patients.
EMS weeks do EMS weeks doesn't get a lot of
