

Lady Pats Win North Lamar Tournament

The Prairiland Patriot fems got back on the winning track over the weekend as they won the North Lamar Tournament.

Prairiland's first game in the tourney was Thursday night against West Lamar. The first quarter was no indication of the outcome of the game, as West Lamar got on top for a quick 13-9 lead.

Prairiland recovered from their shaky start in the second quarter as Donna Vaughn scored 7 points in the quarter to help the Patriot cause. Tanya Burdine hit a jumper with six seconds remaining to give Prairiland a 24-20 lead.

Prairiland continued their success in the third quarter as Anita Jaynes got hot. Jaynes scored eight points in the third stanza and Prairiland got a basket at the buzzer from Vaughn to increase their lead to 39-30.

The fourth quarter was a sweet one for the Patriots, as they saw a chance to get some revenge for their loss in the Rivercrest tournament against West Lamar. Two free shots

from Kristi Bankhead with 1:53 remaining and two from Jaynes with :17 left nailed in West Lamar's coffin. Final score of the game was Prairiland 50 and West Lamar 38.

Prairiland continued their winning ways Friday night as they defeated Rivercrest in the tournament semi-finals.

The first quarter was one in which turnovers were a frequent occurrence. Prairiland stole the ball four times in the first quarter as they took an early 7-6 lead.

Prairiland's good fortune continued in the second quarter as did Rivercrest turnovers. Tanya Burdine stole the ball three times in the quarter and capitalized on two of them for baskets. Prairiland led after the first half, 21-14.

Prairiland continued their tenacious defense and their good fundamental rebounding in the third quarter. Prairiland grabbed five rebounds and made five steals as they led after three quarters, 34-24.

The Patriots, behind Anita Jaynes' six points and Kristi Bankhead's strong board play, kept up their lead

in the fourth quarter. A three point play by Donna Vaughn with :41 left in the game made the final score Prairiland 44, Rivercrest 33.

Prairiland met their fiercest rivals, the North Lamar Panthers in the finals of the tournament Saturday night.

The game started out as if both teams had forgotten that the game was supposed to be close.

Tanya Burdine started the Patriot scoring with one of her patented top of the key jumpshots with 7:05 left in the first quarter. After a jumpshot made by Deana Watson, Anita Jaynes grabbed a rebound and was fouled on her follow-up shot. Jaynes sank both free shots as Prairiland led 6 to nothing. With 4:34 left in the quarter, Donna Vaughn stole the ball and capitalized on the turnover as she made her lay-up to put Prairiland out in front 10 to 0.

Burdine found her second bomb just as easily as her first, as Prairiland led by a somewhat miraculous 12-0 lead. North Lamar finally was able to get on the scoreboard with 3:31 left to cut the Patriot lead to 12-2.

Both teams made two more points as Prairiland led after the first quarter 14-4.

Prairiland found scoring more difficult in the second half as their shooting began to turn cold. Strong rebounding by the shorter Patriots and a brief scoring spurt from Deana Watson kept Prairiland on top. Watson stole the ball and made a lay-up and followed that on the next Patriot possession, with a jumpshot to make the score Prairiland 22, North Lamar 11. At the end of the first half, Prairiland led 23-14.

The third quarter was not a good one for Prairiland as North Lamar crept within striking distance. A clutch shot by Klarissa Keys with 3:27 left in the quarter seemed to slow North Lamar's momentum as Prairiland led 27-21. Deana Watson made sure that Prairiland's nine point lead would not fall from the second quarter margin of lead as she made six quick points in the last minute. Prairiland led after three quarters, 33-24.

Prairiland again flirted with disaster in the fourth quarter, as the

game's momentum was forever changing. An in the point jumper by Klarissa Keys gave Prairiland a for-the-moment safe 35-26 lead. After seven consecutive North Lamar points, Prairiland held a 35-33 lead with 2:11 left in the game.

Tanya Burdine tipped in two points with 58 seconds left to give Prairiland a 37-33 lead. Deana Watson was intentionally fouled with 37 seconds left and she sank one of two free throws to put the game on ice for Prairiland at 38-33 which was the final score.

The Patriot fems played superbly throughout the tournament, as their cat-like quickness was evidenced by all who had the pleasure of seeing the girls in action. Coach Ronnie Baker was pleased with his team's first place trophy and said, "It takes good kids and we have got some super kids," Deana Watson was the Patriot representative on the All-Tournament Team.

The Prairiland Patriot fems evened up their district record at a win and a loss with a victory over the

Clarksville Tigers Tuesday night at Prairiland.

The first half of the game was all Prairiland as they led at the half 33-19. Donna Vaughn scored six points in the second quarter to pace the Patriots. Clarksville was limited to one shot in most cases, as Anita Jaynes, Klarissa Keys and Kristi Bankhead controlled the boards. Tanya Burdine hit a jumper at the buzzer to give Prairiland a 33-19 lead.

The second half of the game was also dominated by the Patriots. Prairiland got balanced scoring in the third quarter as five Patriots made baskets to give Prairiland a 50-29 lead. Anita Jaynes was the only Patriot to make a shot from the field in the fourth quarter. The other eight Patriot points scored in the quarter were from free throws.

Prairiland won the game 60-45. The next game for the fems will be Friday night at Prairiland against Paris High.

Patriots Third In N.L. Tournament

The Prairiland Patriots played good basketball over the weekend, as they took third place in the North Lamar Tournament.

Prairiland continued to play good basketball in the second quarter as Calvin Williams and Scott Scudder scored eight points in the quarter. Prairiland did not score after the three minute mark, and West Lamar scored the last four points to cut the lead to 24-20.
