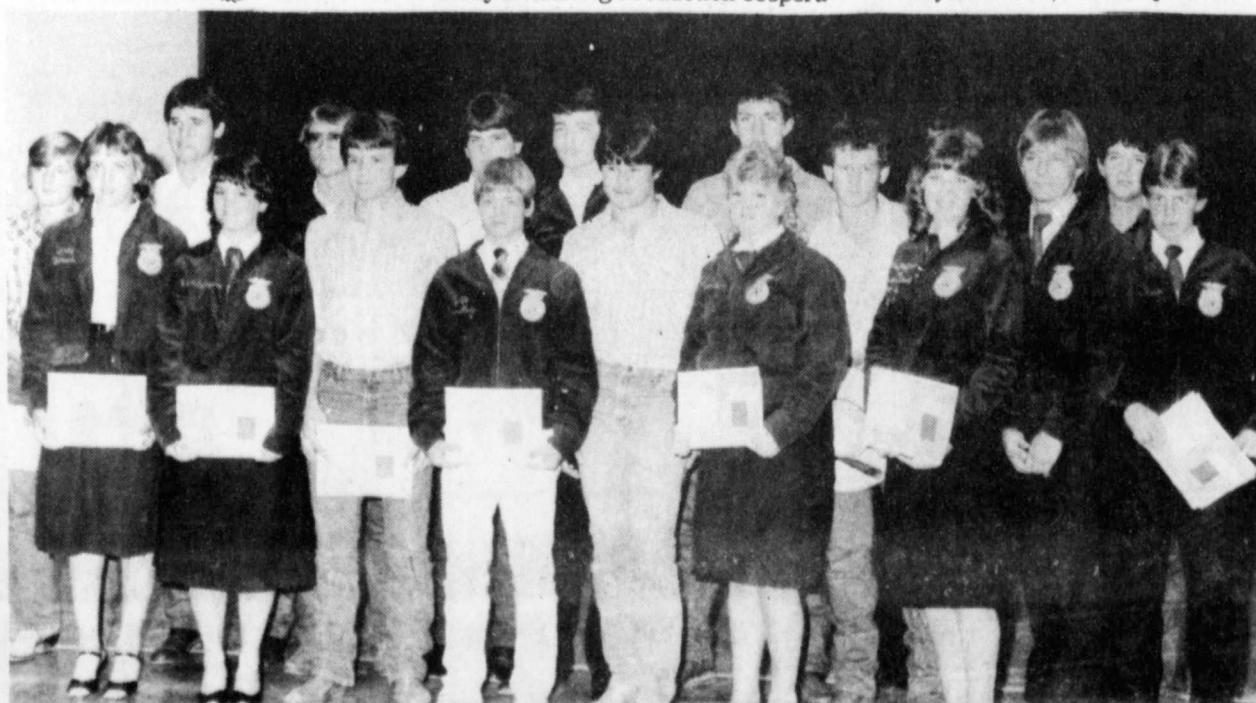
was cheerleader her seventh grade year and alternate this year.

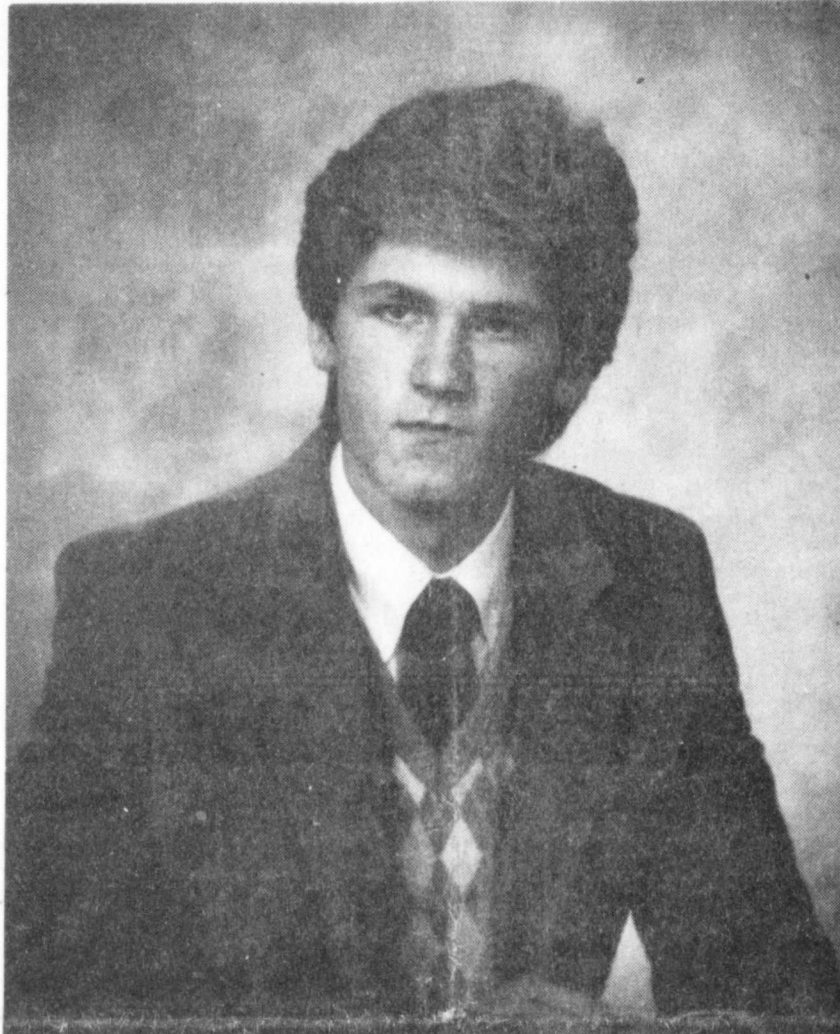

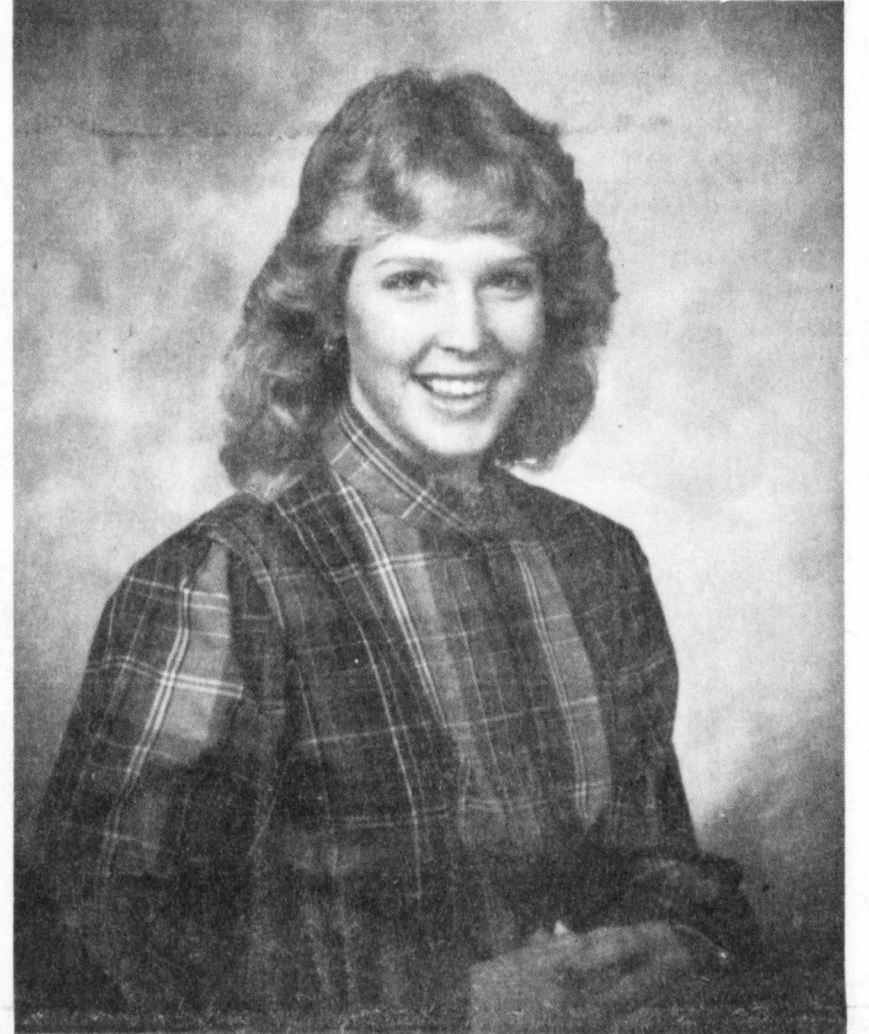

## Patriots Lose Bi-District Bid, 4-3

The Prairiland Patriots highly successful baseball season came to a close Monday night in Mineola when they lost to the second ranked Hook Hornets 4-3 in a bi-district game.

In the top of the first inning, the first batter of the game ripped a home run to put the Hornets out in front 1-0 in a lead which was never squandered. Pitcher Scott Scudder then retired the Hornets in order getting two strike outs in the process. After a half of an inning, Hooks led 1-0.

After Prairiland failed to score in the bottom of the first inning, Hooks again managed to score runs. With

one out, Scudder issued two walks and a run scoring single which made the score 2-0 in favor of Hooks. The next batter flew out to shortstop Heath Kennedy before Hooks got another run scoring single to put the Hornets out in front 2-0. Hooks did not score again in the inning as a result of a great tag by catcher John Dusenberry for the final out of the inning.

Scott Scudder led off the bottom of the third inning with a walk and advanced to second base when Heath Kennedy singled. Scudder was then tagged out in a rundown with Kennedy moving over to second. Kennedy then stole third base and home on wild pitches. Prairiland was unable to score again in the inning and trailed 3-1 after three innings.

After the leadoff man for Hooks flew out to Jay Ingram in left field, Scudder issued another walk to put a runner on first. Scudder then recorded a strike out before giving up a single to shallow centerfield which scored the fourth Hornet run of the game. Scudder then struck out a batter for the final out of the inning with Hooks leading 4-1.

In the bottom of the fifth inning, Mike Connot led off with a walk. Joel Ballard then got the best Patriot hit of the game driving a ball in the air to the base of the centerfield fence for a triple which scored Mike Connot to make the game 4-2 in favor of Hooks. Ballard then came in to score when the pitcher made a wild pitch. Prairiland was unable to get anymore runs in the inning and trailed 4-3 after five innings of play.

Neither team was able to come up with runs in the final two innings as Hooks went on to defeat the Patriots for the second consecutive year in bi-district competition.

The game, like the year before, was pitched by the two fine pitchers. Scudder moved down the Hornets with fastballs for the second consecutive year while the Hooks lefthander got by on craftiness and great pitch selection from the Hooks coach standing by the dugout. The lefty for Hooks struck out eight in the game and used a deceptive pickoff move to pick off three Patriot base runners. The Hooks centerfielder was also a big role player for Hooks by catching everything hit in sight, including robbing pinch-hitter Tony Duncanson of a sure double with a spectacular diving grab.

Starting seniors Robbie Connot, Jon David Loyd and Jay Ingram will all be missed in the 1986 baseball season.

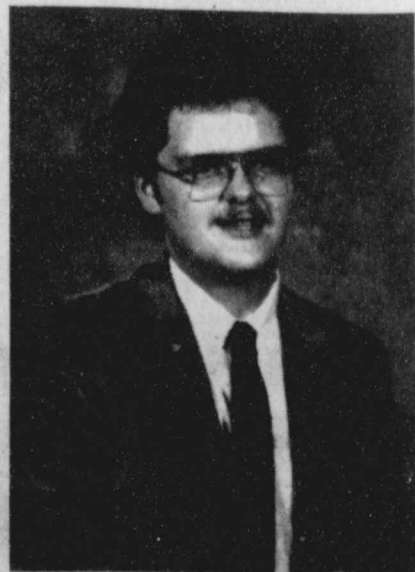
## Wayne Huffman To Go To Africa
