

## Break In And Arson Hits Jiffy Mart In Blossom



The history of similar consolidation in other states shows that the consumer and small business owner

will be left without addquate credit." Patterson was referring to the hisotrical trend in other states of large banking organizations taking deposit sout of outlying areas and using them for needs at their center of operations or for international lending.

Patterson also referred to recent Wall Street Journal articles and complaints to his own office of major banks leaving only a small fraction of available deposit sin certain areas for those areas' needs. "How int he world can we expec the state to have an economic rebound if the major banks won't fund consumers and small businesses?" Patterson asked.

As to whether or not major banks will support HB 131, Patterson said, 'We expect the support of many independent banks. I don't know why the mega-banks wouldn't support it, we're just codifying what they promised to do when they came here."
