However, this goal cannot be

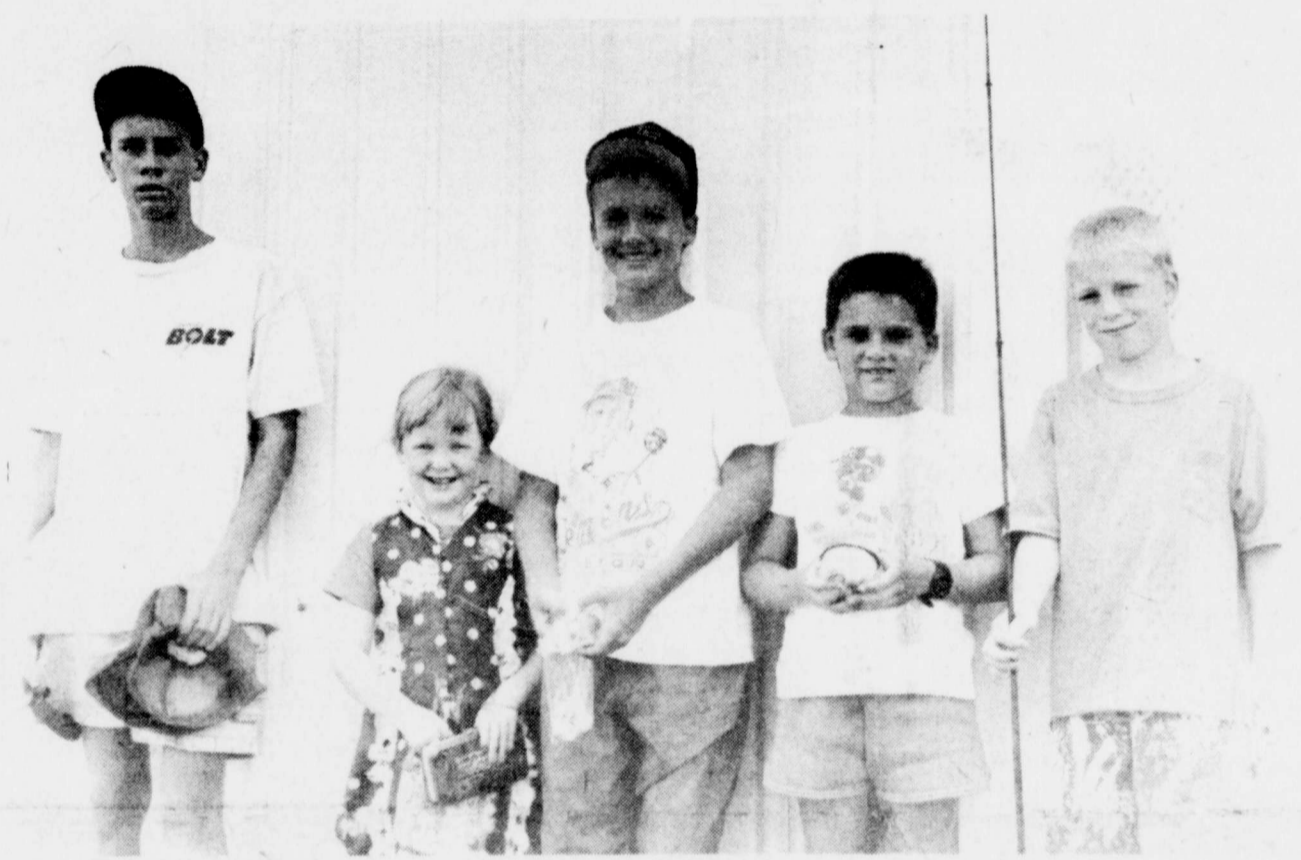
achieved without the support from parents. The Blossom and Deport Times will be giving notification of meeting dates and times.

## Relatives Of Local People Stranded in Kuwait

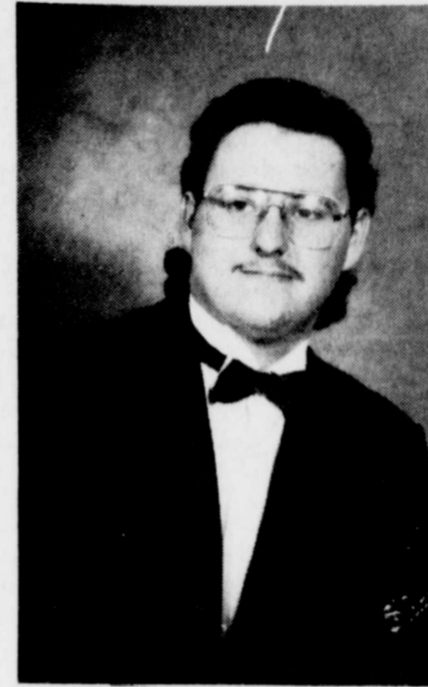

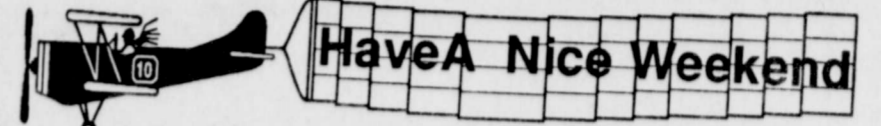


