Malone, Branham Top Prairiland Graduates

Lori Renae Malone of Taylortown and Jimmie Branham of Blossom are the honor graduates of the class of 1991 from Prairiland High School. The two will furnish the valedictory and salutatory addresses at the 1991 graduation ceremonies May 31 at the high school gymnasium at 8 p.m.

Malone earned a 5.6727 average on the six-point system to become the valedictorian, while Branham became salutatorian with a highly-competitive 5.6615.

During her high school career at Prairiland, Malone has been Senior Class reporter, a two year officer of the Student Council, a three year officer of the Spanish Club, and the reporter of the Keywanette organization for two years.

A two year section editor on the Patriot yearbook, Malone has also maintained memberships in FHA, the Computer Science Club, Texas Association of Future Educators, the Beta Club, and a variety of athletic organizations.

Selected as Academic All District in basketball for District 13-3A in 1991, Malone has been named Most Valuable Player for both the track

and cross-country teams while advancing to regional in 1990.

A homecoming queen nominee in 1990, Malone has been selected Student of the Month in 1991, has been chosen to Who's Who Among American High School Students, has been a class favorite for three years--as well as being chosen most studious, most friendly, and most likely to succeed during her four-year career.

She has won awards for excellence in biology, trigonometry, anatomy and physiology, home economics, art and journalism.

Malone plans to attend Paris Junior College for two years before study at the University of North Texas and, hopefully, Southwestern Medical School, pursuing degrees in biology and physical therapy.

Malone is the daughter of Lawrence and Rita Malone of Taylortown.

Active in a wide range of activities, Branham served as editor-in-chief of the Patriot yearbook in 1991.

He maintained memberships in the National Honor Society, the Spanish Club, the Key Club, and the Beta

Club, while serving in the Computer Science Club for all four years of his high school attendance.

Branham placed fourth in District UIL Calculator Applications as a junior, improving to first place as a senior while leading his team to first place honors and to regional team competition.

He has been voted Most Studious twice as well as Most Likely to Succeed by his classmates.

Branham has not committed to post-secondary plans, but tentatively plans to attend Paris Junior College next year.

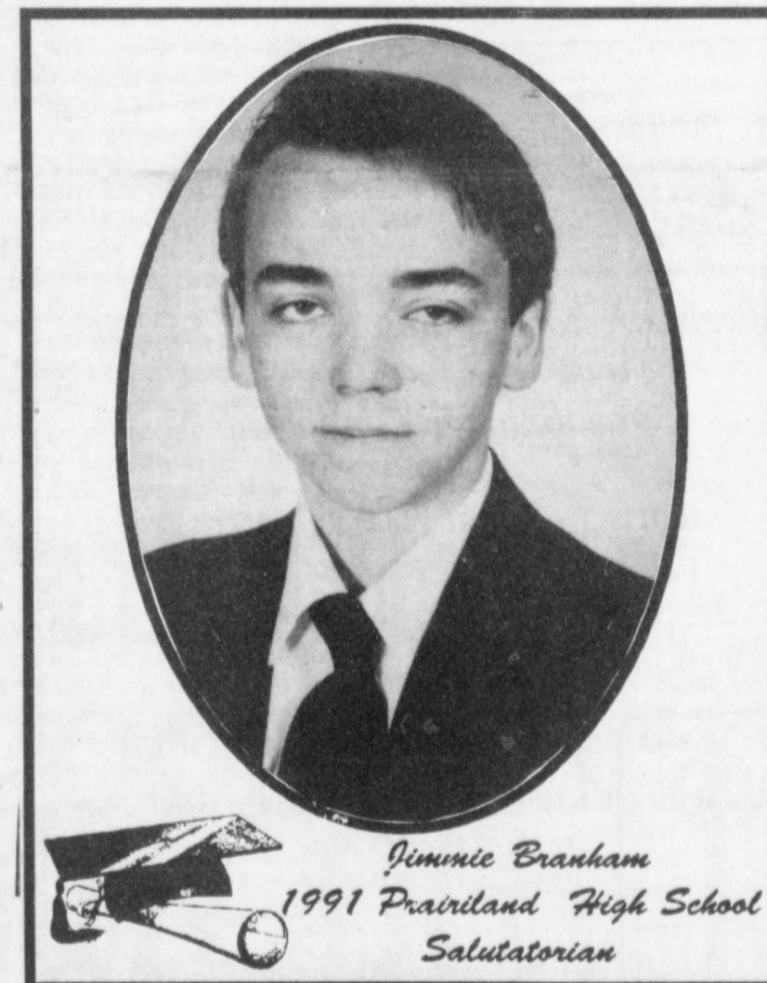
He is the son of Veronica Ballard of Blossom and Jim Branham of Paris.

Vacation Bible School at the church June 24-28 from 6:30 to 9 p.m.



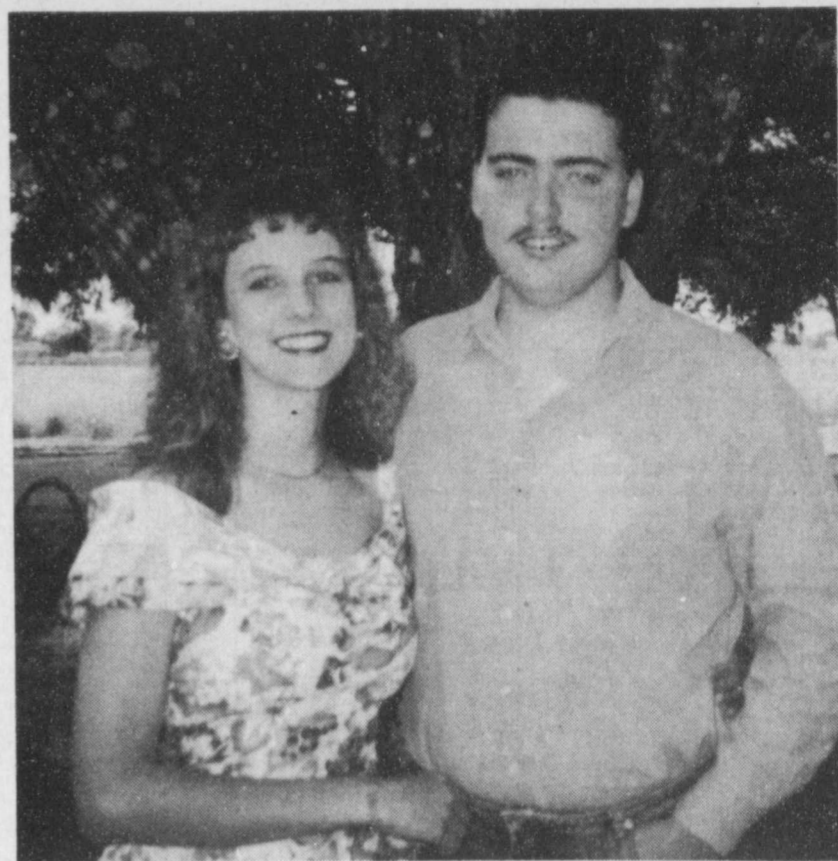

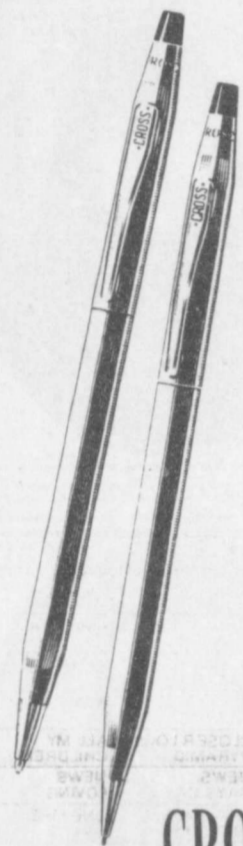

Patriots End Season With Loss To Queen City

The #2 Queen City Bulldogs rained on Prairiland's parade as they defeated the Patriots 7-2 in last Tuesday's bi-district game at George Dobson Field in Texarkana.

The loss put an end to a spectacular turnaround of a season as the young Patriots turned the one-victory season of 1990 into a 17-5 mark this year.

"This has been one of my more rewarding years," said Patriot Coach Bill Scudder. "All these kids can play. They made up their minds that they would win. Last year they were just too young."

It seemed, only momentarily, that some of that winning would carry over against one of the state's most talented teams.

During a steady mist in the top of the fifth inning, the Patriots scored two runs to take a 2-1 lead on the Bulldogs. Three consecutive hits off of the Bulldog starter put the Patriots

off and rolling and sent the Bulldog pitcher from the game.

Dexter Baker singled to right field, Michael Madewell popped a bunt that fell just out of reach of a diving Bulldog for a hit and Greg Vickers delivered a flare into right to score Baker.

Vickers' base hit forced the Bulldogs to move future Texas A&M shortstop Paul Barber to the mound. He got Chad Whitley to fist a lazy liner to the first baseman who turned and tagged Vickers for the double play.

The Patriots worked on a double steal play to perfection as the Bulldog catcher fired to second in an attempt to catch a bluffing Smith and Madewell scored easily from third to give the Patriots the lead.

"That worked just like we drew it up," said Coach Scudder.

The Patriots' laughter was short lived as the rain let up and the Bull-

dog bats heated up.

Queen City collected four runs in the bottom of the fifth to take a commanding 5-2 advantage. The first four batters reached base against Baker and the Patriots.

"In the fifth they didn't really hit Dexter all that hard," said Scudder. "I don't think the hit would have gotten through if we hadn't had our infield drawn in."

Queen City added two more in the sixth as Barber roped a two-run single to center.

Prairiland scratched out five hits, while the Bulldogs had 10 off Baker, who walked two and struck out three. Mark Farris relieved Baker for the final out.

"The kids feel disappointed," said Scudder. "They don't feel good about losing to the #2 team in the state."

"I'm proud of them," he added.

"They've done all I've asked them to do all year."

A Veteran Is Remembered

Almost 50 years ago, 13-year old Jayne Anderson experienced an unofficial memorial day on the 27th day since her brother, Vernon Wayne Guest, had been declared missing in action after going down on the ship USS Atik somewhere in the North Atlantic during World War II.

Today, Mrs. Anderson and her sister, 81-year old Nannie Lou McAlister, sit with an oil portrait of Guest between them in Mrs. Anderson's home in Paris. As she shuffles through a basket filled with yellowed, dog-eared newspaper clippings, Mrs. Anderson's hand rests on another small black and white photograph of the 24-year old serviceman before she carefully pulls out something wrapped in quickly-fading purple velvet.

But the medal tucked inside is just as brilliant gold as it was on the day the Guest family of Deport received Vernon's Purple Heart, nearly two years after he was declared missing in action. Guest, navy electrician's mate third class, was officially de-

clared dead on April 5, 1944, making him the first WWII casualty from Lamar County.

"My brother was my hero all my life-even before he joined the service," Mrs. Anderson said. "I remember the last time I saw him, he was walking across my schoolyard. He waved at me and threw me a kiss."

"That's the day he went to enlist in the United States Navy."

Guest was the fifth of six children born to the sharecropping family. Actually, Mrs. Anderson said, Guest was born just over the line in Red River County, but moved with the family to Deport when he was about 12 years old. His name is also listed as the first WWII casualty in Red River County, she said.

Entering training in July 1940 at Great Lakes, Illinois, Guest was then stationed at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii. Mrs. Anderson said he had just transferred to the USS Pruitt when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor. Guest also worked on the USS Hornet, which was later sank by German warcraft. But he escaped death once again, Mrs. Anderson said, by his transfer to the Atik.

Guest was listed as missing in action on May 8, 1942 and two years later the family was informed that he was listed as officially dead since April 5, 1942. The family wasn't told what the fate of his ship was, Mrs. Anderson said, until 20 years later, when she wrote to U.S. Rep. Wright Patman while in her thirties. It was then she learned that Guest's boat had been sunk March 27, 1942 by the German submarine U-123. There were no survivors, she added.

Shuffling through the basket once again, Mrs. Anderson reveals a newspaper clipping that said the Guest family received its last letter from the serviceman on March 21, 1942. She said that the family never saw Guest in his uniform.

However, she noted, "some triumph did rise from tragedy;" she was listed as the second beneficiary from her brother's insurance, on the stipulation that she get her college degree. She did, and taught school for 32 years before retiring.

Though many years have passed since her brother gave his life for his

country, Mrs. Anderson said she can still recall his memorial service in Deport like it was yesterday. And today, Memorial Day is a time of sadness and remembrance for her, she said.

"I can still vividly remember the memorial service, and my front row folding chair, and them playing taps-especially taps," Mrs. Anderson said. "Memorial Day leaves me with mixed feelings emotionally adn stirs up some innermost feelings, especially when taps is blown."

"We're just one of many who gave a sacrifice for our American freedom, and we know how to appreciate it."

The American Legion Post #30, Paris, carries the name Brown-Guest American Legion Post #30, in honor of Guest and Winfred Brown, a casualty of World War I.

Like Vernon Wayne Guest's name on the grave marker in Bethel Cemetery, the memory of Jayne Anderson's brother is forever.

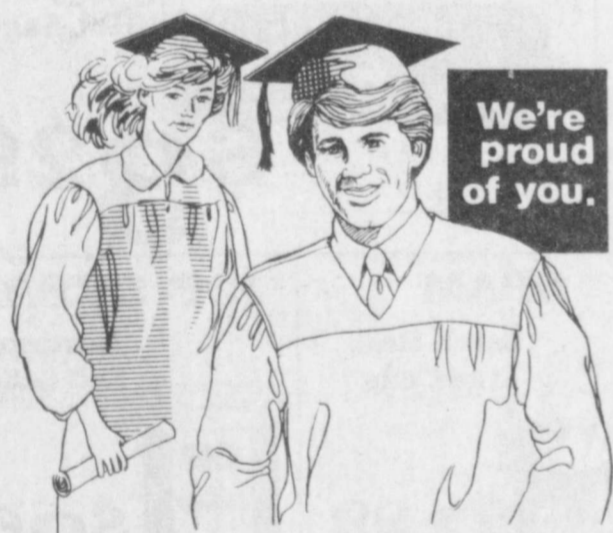
