The Auction will be held at 6:30 p.m., following the supper. Items included in the sale will include projects made by the Prairiland FFA and 4-H members.



## County-Wide Pre-Kindergarten Enrollment Begins

During the week of April 5-9, 1993, Lamar County students may register for pre-kindergarten classes for 4year-olds. To be eligible for enrollment during the 1993-94 school year, a child must be at least 4 years of age on or before September 1, 1993, and must be unable to speak and comprehend the English language or from a family whose annual income is at or below subsistence level and qualified to receive free or reduced-price unches under the national school lunch program. Parents must bring their child's birth certificate and verification of income.

Paris and North Lamar ISDs currently provide pre-kindergarten. In the fall of 1992, Lamar County received a 13-month CECCEP (Collaborative Early Childhood Care and Education Planning) grant to encour-

age school districts, child care centers and Head Start to work together to enable eligible 4-year-olds to be served by a full-day, full-year care and education pilot program beginning in August 1993. So in addition to Paris and North Lamar's pre-kindergarten programs, a total of 40 4year-olds living in the Paris, Chisum, North Lamar, Roxton and Prairiland school districts may register to be considered for the pilot classes to be and Kiddie Korner Preschool and Day Care Center.

Parents may enroll their children
