The Auction will be held at 6:30 p.m., following the supper. Items included in the sale will include projects made by the Prairiland FFA and 4-H members.

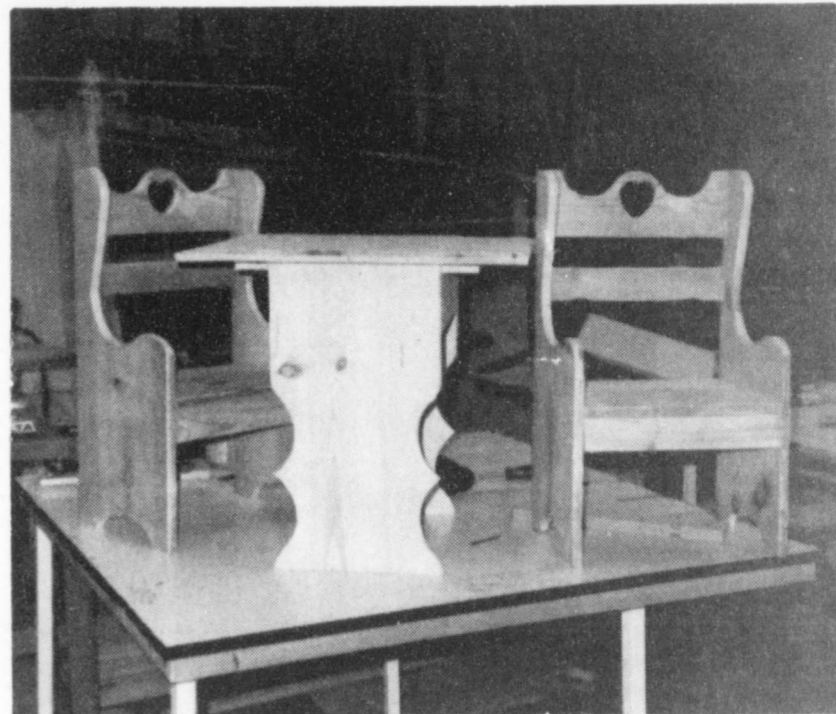
Stew and chili cookers are needed. Anyone interested in participating in the stew/chili cook-off is asked to contact the Prairiland Ag Department

The day-long activities have always been a favorite way for many people to spend a whole day.

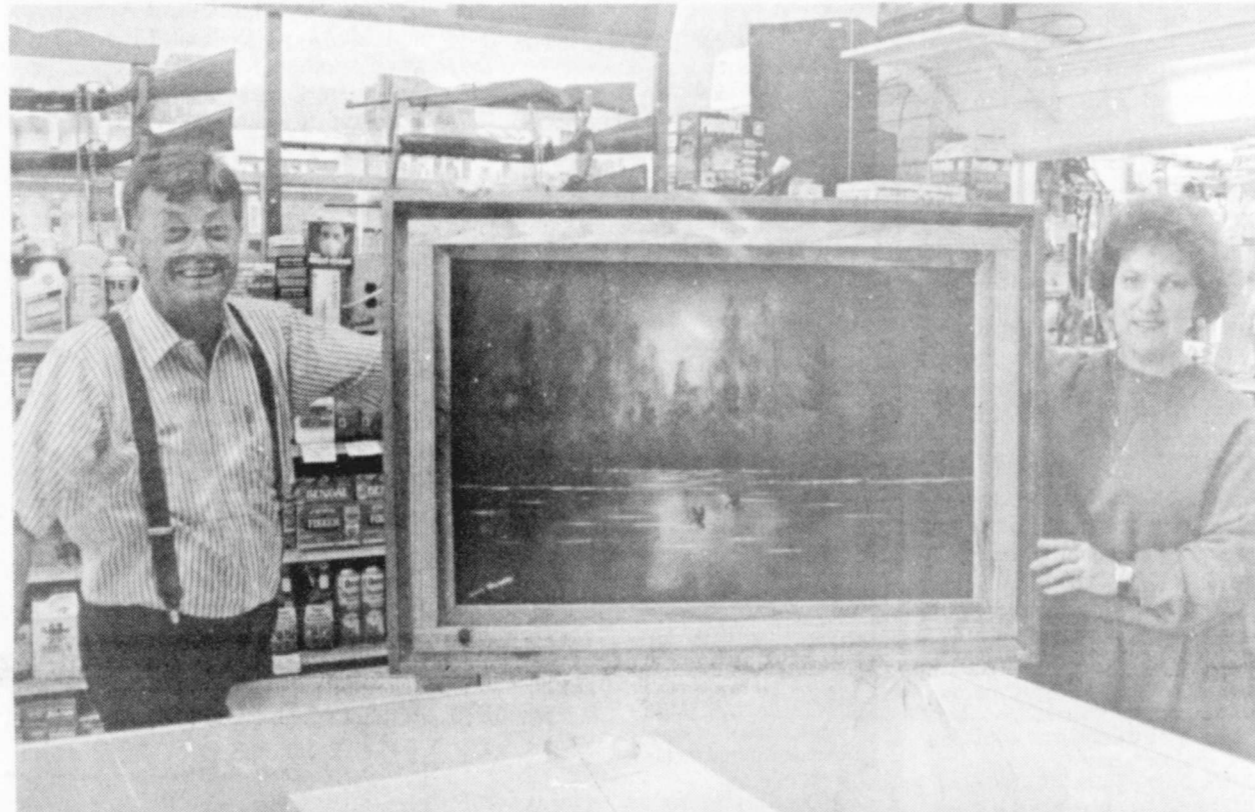
There will be plenty of good food, good livestock judging and lots of fun at the pig wrestling.

I borrowed a camera from them to take the picture and borrowed a pad to write the interview on. The home of the Roaches is not unfamiliar to me, because Evelyn happens to be married to my daddy.

Evelyn works in Lingerie Sales at Beall's Department Store in Paris. She has been employed there for nearly nine years. Before working at Beall's, she had worked at the old Woolworth's Store and at Gibson's, which were also in Paris.

Thelma Johnson's Corn Pudding

- 2 eggs beaten
- 1 tbs. sugar
- 1 tbs. cornstarch
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 stick butter, melted
- 1-1/2 oz. can cream style corn
- salt and pepper

Mix all ingredients and pour into baking dish. Cook at 325 until firm, 30-45 minutes. Serves 4.

Mrs. Edna Johnson's Jeff Davis Pie

- 1 9" pastry
- 2 cups sugar
- 1/2 cup margarine
- 1 T. flour
- 1/4 t. salt
- 1 t. vanilla
- 1 cup milk
- 4 eggs

Cream together until light and fluffy margarine and sugar. Add flour and salt and vanilla. Heat well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir milk in slowly. Pour into well chilled uncooked crust and bake in hot oven, 450 for 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 350 and continue baking for 30 minutes or until firm. Serve slightly warm.

Eddie Stephenson's Cornbread

- 1 lb. ground beef, browned
- Mix with:
- 1 pkg. Jiffy Cornbread mix

- 1 can cream of chicken or cream of mushroom soup
- 1/4 lb. grated velveeta cheese
- 1 bell pepper, chopped fine
- 1 can corn with juice
- 2 eggs
- can add milk if desired
- onion flakes or onions as desired

Combine all ingredients and cook until done at 350.

Lemon Pie

- 2-8" graham cracker crusts
- 1 small can crushed pineapple, drained
- 1 small 6 oz. frozen lemonade, thawed
- 8 oz. Eagle Brand milk

Stir all together. Put in pie crusts. May crumble graham cracker crumbs on top as garnish.

Chess Cake

- 1 stick margarine
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 cup oil
- 1 box butter recipe cak mix
- Mix all together and spread in greased 9x13 pan. Will be stiff.

Layer:

- 1 stick margarine, melted
- 1-8 oz. cream cheese at room temperature
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 box powdered sugar
- 1 t. vanilla

Mix all together and spread over first mixture. Bake at 325 for 45 minutes. Can sprinkle with pecans if you like.

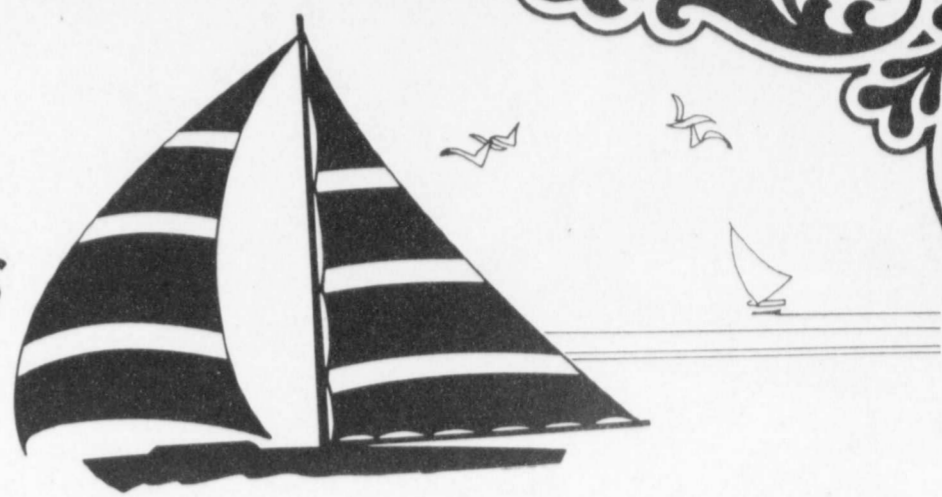

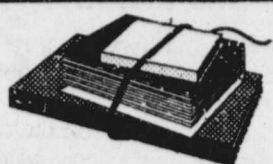

To be eligible for enrollment during the 1993-94 school year, a child must be at least 4 years of age on or before September 1, 1993, and must be unable to speak and comprehend the English language or from a family whose annual income is at or below subsistence level and qualified to receive free or reduced-price lunches under the national school lunch program. Parents must bring their child's birth certificate and verification of income.

Paris and North Lamar ISDs currently provide pre-kindergarten. In the fall of 1992, Lamar County received a 13-month CECCEP (Collaborative Early Childhood Care and Education Planning) grant to encour-

age school districts, child care centers and Head Start to work together to enable eligible 4-year-olds to be served by a full-day, full-year care and education pilot program beginning in August 1993. So in addition to Paris and North Lamar's pre-kindergarten programs, a total of 40 4-year-olds living in the Paris, Chisum, North Lamar, Roxton and Prairiland school districts may register to be considered for the pilot classes to be

housed at Lollypop Learning Center and Kiddie Korner Preschool and Day Care Center.

Parents may enroll their children at the CECCEP Office, located in the

Girl Scout Office at 2025 N.W. Loop 286, or at the kindergarten campus in their school district. For further information, contact Pam Christian, CECCEP Director, at 737-7515.

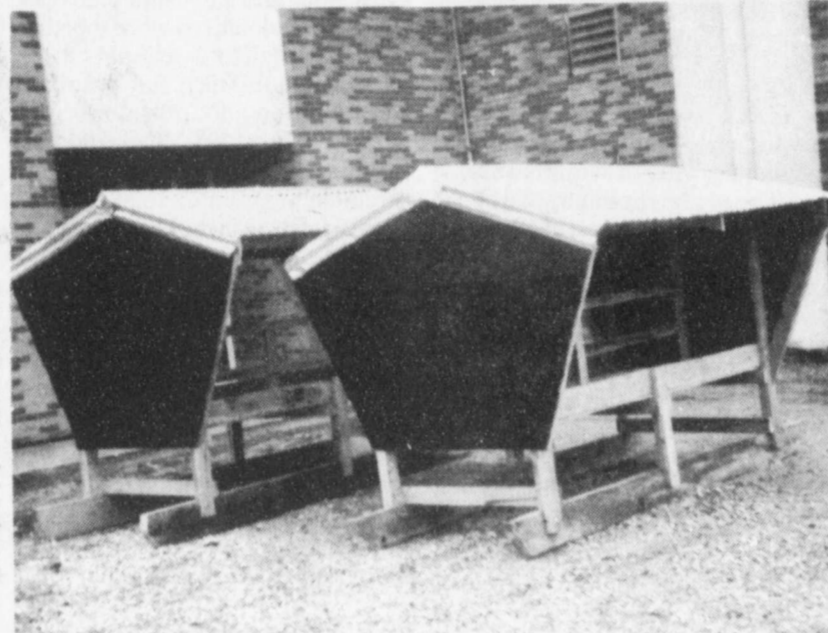

CLEAN-UP ORDINANCE #92-05 THE STATE OF TEXAS

City of Bogata
County of Red River
An ordinance establishing regulations covering the cleaning up of all property, declaring certain building conditions a health hazard and unightly, declaring same to be unlawful, providing for notice and abatement and the fixing of penalties; making it unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to permit weeds, brush or any objectionable or unsightly matter to grow on their property; prohibiting the growth of cultivated crops within the right-of-way of any public street or easement; making it the duty of any person, firm or corporation to cut and remove all such weeds, et cetera; providing that the cutting and removing of the weeds, et cetera, every thirty (30) days constitutes compliance with this ordinance; providing for notices to owners or other persons violating the terms of this ordinance; authorizing the city to cut such weeds, et

cetera, and charge the owners of the property for the cost of cutting such weeds, et cetera, and if charges are not paid the city may file a lien against the property by filing a statement with the County Clerk; providing a savings clause, making and providing for a penalty not to exceed two hundred (\$200.00) dollars for each offense, repealing all conflicting ordinances and containing a severability clause.
WHEREAS, the City Council and the Mayor of the City of Bogata, Texas, have the responsibility to the health, safety and well being of the citizens of the City of Bogata, Texas; and
WHEREAS, the fact that there are both business and residential properties within the city limits of the City of Bogata, Texas, that pose safety, fire and health hazards because the properties are never cleaned;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOGATA, TEXAS:
This ordinance requires that any person who owns property within the city limits of Bogata, Texas, will be responsible for seeing that the property owned by them is kept cleaned and mowed; also, that any "substandard buildings" shall be kept in repair.
"APPROVED AUTHORITY" means a duly authorized representative or a member of the City Council or the whole City Council of the City of Bogata, Texas.

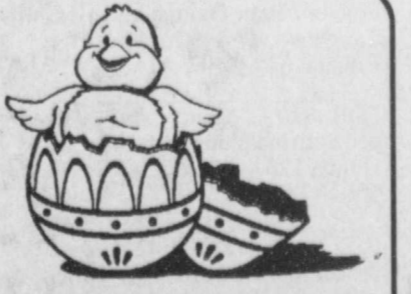
