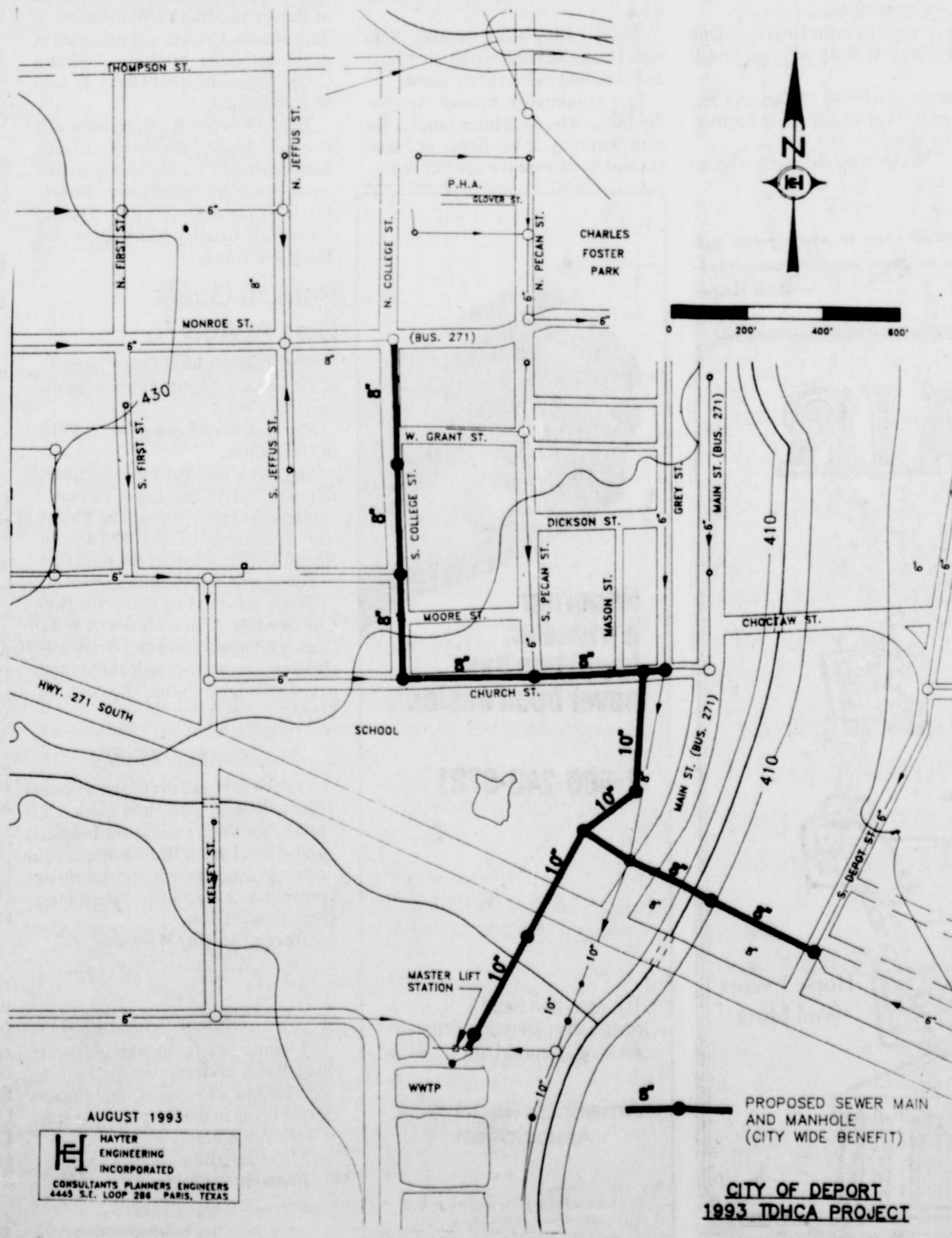

## Hearing Will Deal With Deport's Trash Pickup

New rules from the Texas Water Commission and the EPA affecting landfills, and a Senate Bill aiming at a higher recycling rate will bring about higher trash pickup rates for Deport residents. Trash pickup rates have been costing the city of Deport \$175 per week, and due to the increase in landfill expenses the city will have to pay approximately \$285 per week starting October 1.

A public hearing set for Monday, September 27 at 6:30 p.m. will also give residents a chance to hear about possible new trash collection methods. Stoney Armsby of Waste Management will explain the new laws

passed that are the reason for the pickup increases.

Waste Management, which currently has the large dumpsters in Deport, will have one of the wheeled individual dumpsters on hand to be looked over by citizens.

The household-size dumpsters would cost slightly more, but would eliminate the problem of animals tearing into garbage sacks. They would also be available to people living outside of the city limits for a fee.

City Secretary Sharon Francis says she would like to urge everyone to come to this hearing and voice their opinions and hear what is being said.

## Prairiland Board Set Tax Rate, Takes Bids

The Prairiland Board of Trustees met in a called meeting Monday night, September 20 to set the tax rate.

Superintendent of Prairiland CISD, Dr. L.C. Stout, said that "the rate is the same as last year, the school has just assumed the County Education taxes".

Stout continued, "our school board is to be commended for their dedication and support of the taxpayers. We have a great school system, and the board works hard to make it efficient. They are accountable and responsible with revenues, they make sure they are used to produce a good school

and yet not burden the taxpayer any more than possible. Our tax rate is still the lowest in the county and we're proud of that".

Stout also said that he wanted to commend the taxpayers in the Prairiland School District for their understanding and efforts towards a good school.

The board also considered bids on a science building at Deport campus. Bids were accepted but no action taken until the architect can research each bidder.

The next meeting will be October 11th.

Mrs. Wright had found an old cookbook that she hadn't used in a long time. It was titled "Recipes From The Blanton Reunion". From this book, she had recipes for Zesty Biscuit Bean Bake, Melt In Mouth Cookies, Cherry Salad, Just Like Wyatt's Egg Plant Casserole, Cabbage Rolls (the cabbage roll recipe

was given to her several years ago by a Pentecostal Preacher Lady in Mesquite. Mrs. Wright uses it often. Sandwich Spread, and Prune Cake. Mrs. Wright created the Surprise Cornbread Casserole for herself. I'm guessing that in the eggplant casserole, the Wyatt's is Wyatt's Cafeteria. I really enjoyed meeting Mrs. Wright, and I encourage everyone to send in recipes, even if you don't want to be interviewed and have your picture in the paper. **Surprise Cornbread Casserole**  
By Mrs. Leonna Wright  
6 slices crisp bacon crumbled  
1 cup hamburger or sausage chopped, or ham, or 6 weiners (choose two meats, fry and drain)  
1 Bell Pepper or Jalapena chopped with 1 medium onion in large skillet, salt and cook until tender  
1 small can whole kernel corn (drained)  
1 cup cheese added last  
2 eggs  
corn kit  
Sweet milk to make corn kit thin  
Mix corn kit, eggs, and milk. Pour half in greased baking pan or iron skillet. Add all of meat mixture and cheese. Pour rest of cornbread mixture on top. Bake at 400 degrees for 45 minutes.

**Just Like Wyatt's Eggplant Casserole**  
1 Eggplant  
1 cup celery chopped  
1/2 cup onion chopped  
2 Tbsp. oleo and 1/2 cup cheese in mixture  
1/2 cup bread crumbs  
1/4 Tbsp. pepper 1/4 tsp. salt  
1/2 Tsp sage - 1 egg - 1/2 cup milk  
1 Tbsp. pimento - 1/2 cup cheese on top  
Peel eggplant, cut in chunks. Boil until tender. Drain. Saute' celery and onion in oleo. Add other ingredients.

Blend and add eggplant. Pour into large baking dish. Sprinkle cheese on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

**Cherry Salad**  
1 large cool whip 9-12 oz.  
1 can Eagle Brand milk  
1 13 oz. can pineapple drained  
1 can cherry pie filling  
1/2 cup chopped pecans  
1/2 cup angel flake coconut  
2 cups small marshmallows  
Mix well, refrigerate overnight  
Serves 15.

**Apple Raisin Coconut Pie**  
1 1/2 cup sugar -- 4 eggs  
1 stick oleo -- 1 chopped apple  
1 cup raisins -- 1 cup coconut  
Beat oleo and sugar, add eggs. Beat until light and foamy. Add other ingredients. Mix well. Pour into a deep 10 inch or 2 8 inch pie shells. Bake in slow oven for 45 minutes. Pecans may be substituted for coconut.

**Melt In Your Mouth Cookies**  
1/2 cup oleo softened  
1 egg  
1 tsp. salt  
1 cup light brown sugar  
1 cup flour  
1 cup chopped nuts  
1 tsp. vanilla  
1 tsp baking powder  
Mix well. Bake on oiled cookie sheet. Drop by spoon. Bake about 5 minutes. Cool 2 minutes. Remove with spatula to waxed paper.

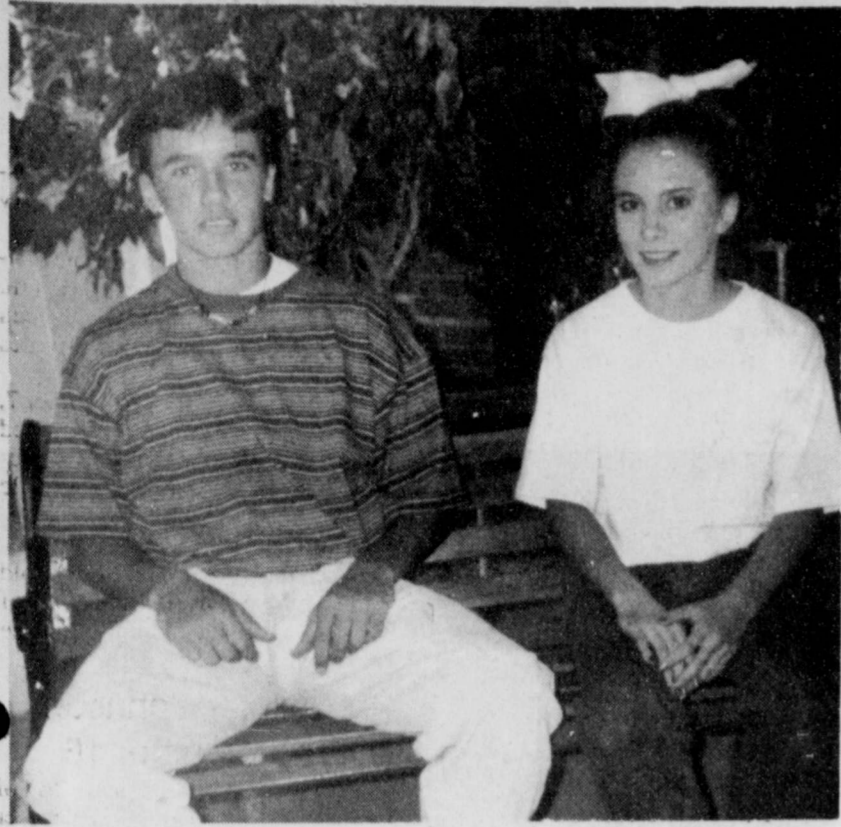

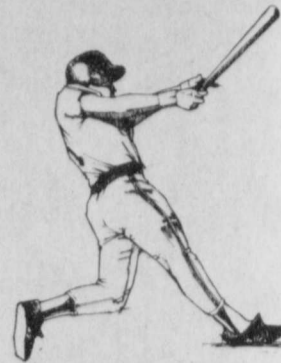
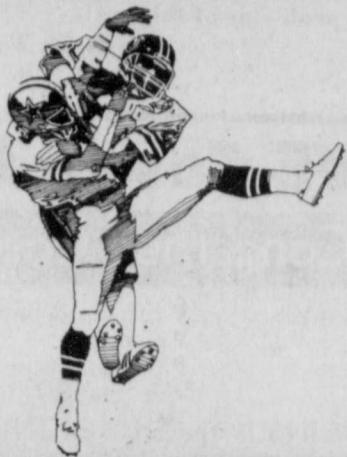

The Prairie Patriot Junior Varsity team traveled to Big Sandy last Thursday night and lost a heartbreaker by the score of 24-20.

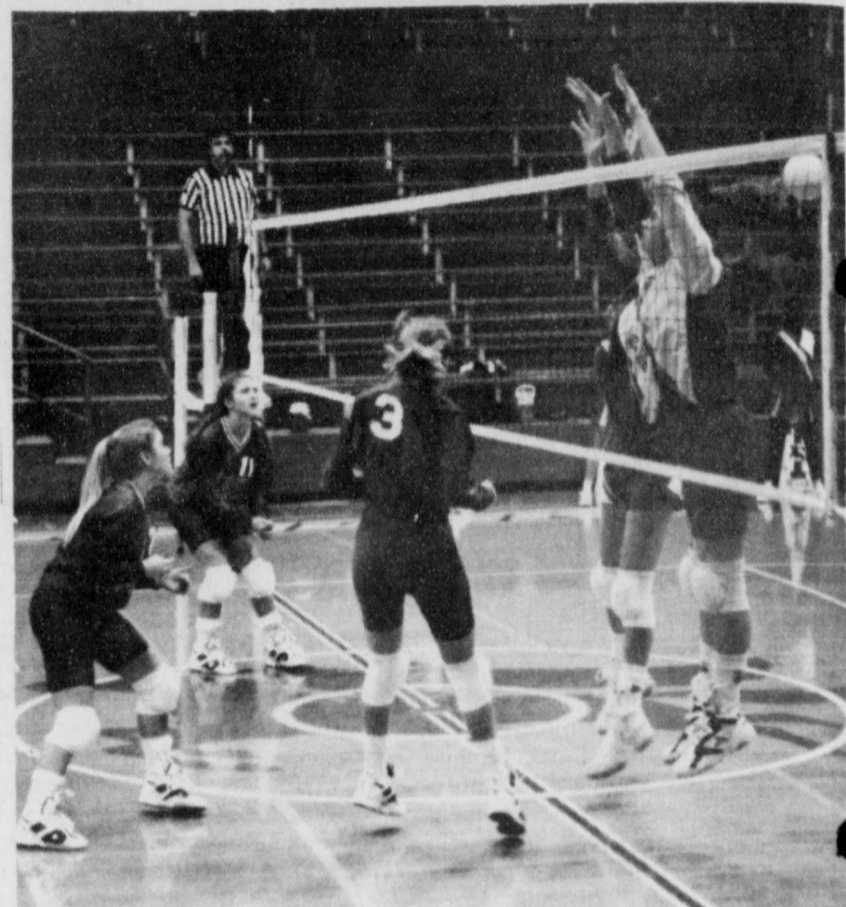
The game winning touchdown was scored with only :15 seconds on the clock.

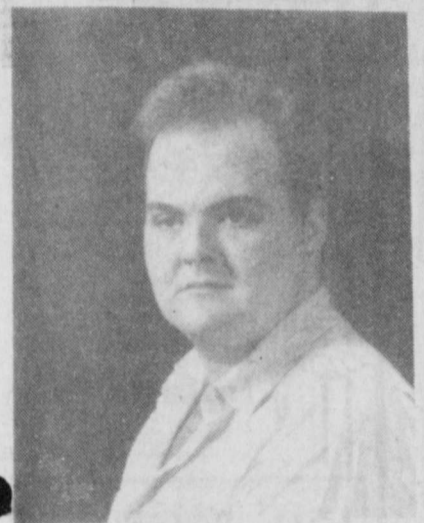
Tim was granted his licenses.
