stretching exercises for at least one week before hitting the lawn: -Side-to-Side Rotations: Standing with your hands on your hips, turn as far as possible to the left, holding the position five seconds, then turn

to the right and hold that position

five seconds. Repeat 10 times. -Overhead Stretches: Standing with your feet slightly apart, stretch both arms over your head. Hold five

seconds. Repeat 10 times. -Front-and-Back Arm Stretches: Standing, with a straight back and arms at shoulder height, stretch arms straight out in front of your body and hold five seconds. Repeat 10 times. Holding arms at a comfortable height, swing straight arms behind body until shoulder blades touch, holding five seconds. Repeat 10 times.


Mrs. Martha Wood gave the Least Coin devotional entitled "Faith and Action are Partners" using the scripture John 14:12-17. The offering was
