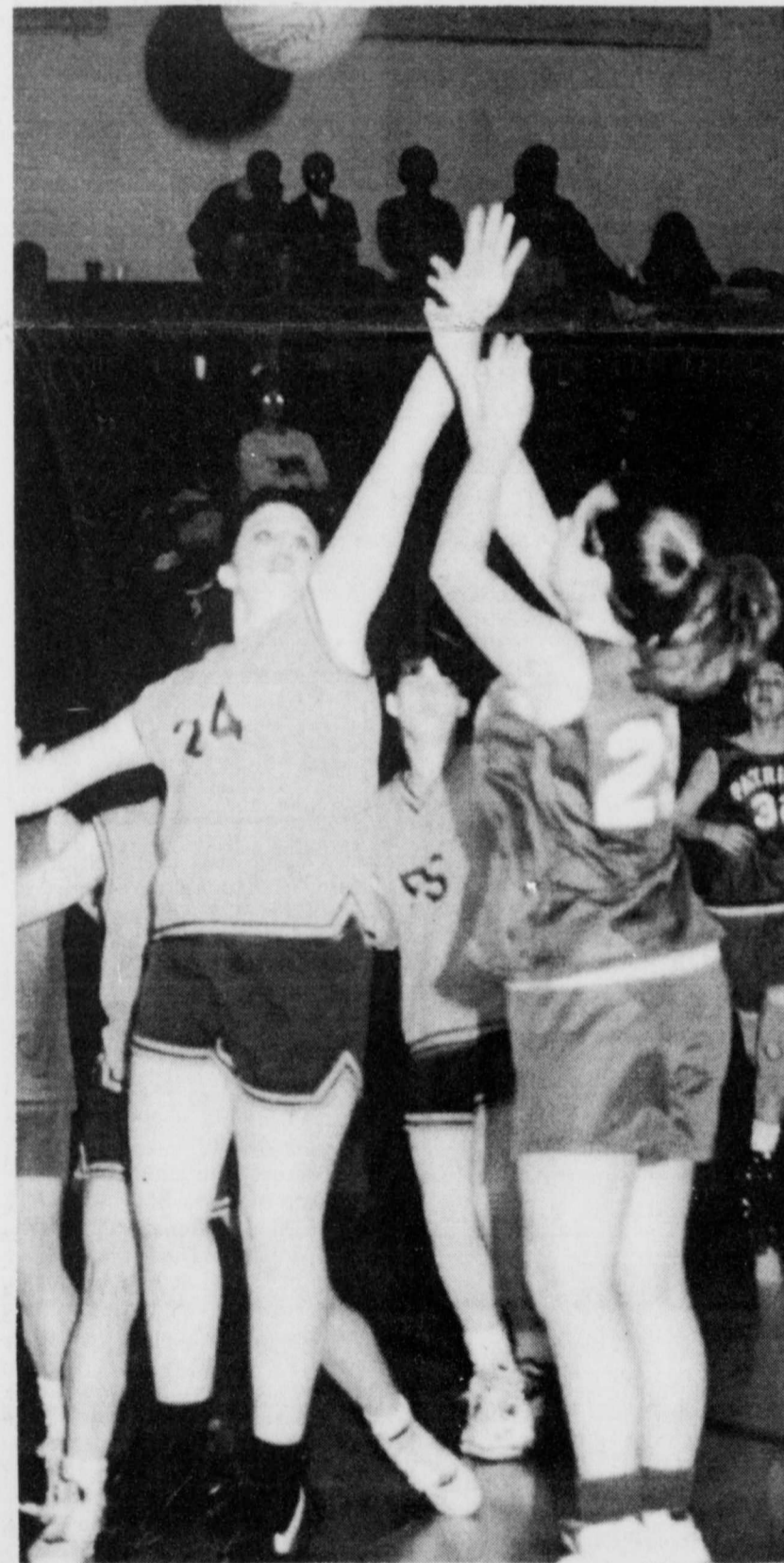
## Civil War Will be Subject of Next Genealogical Society Meeting

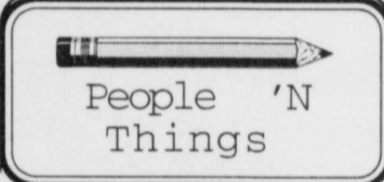
## Shower To Honor Klarissa Perry & Baby

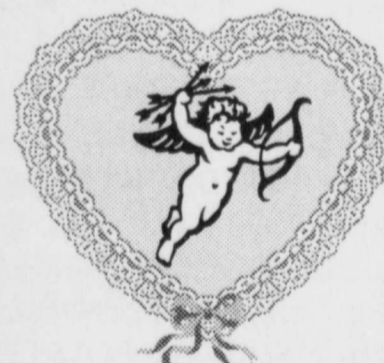

Murl wishes that whoever took them would bring them back, no questions asked, or at least let them know where they could find them.

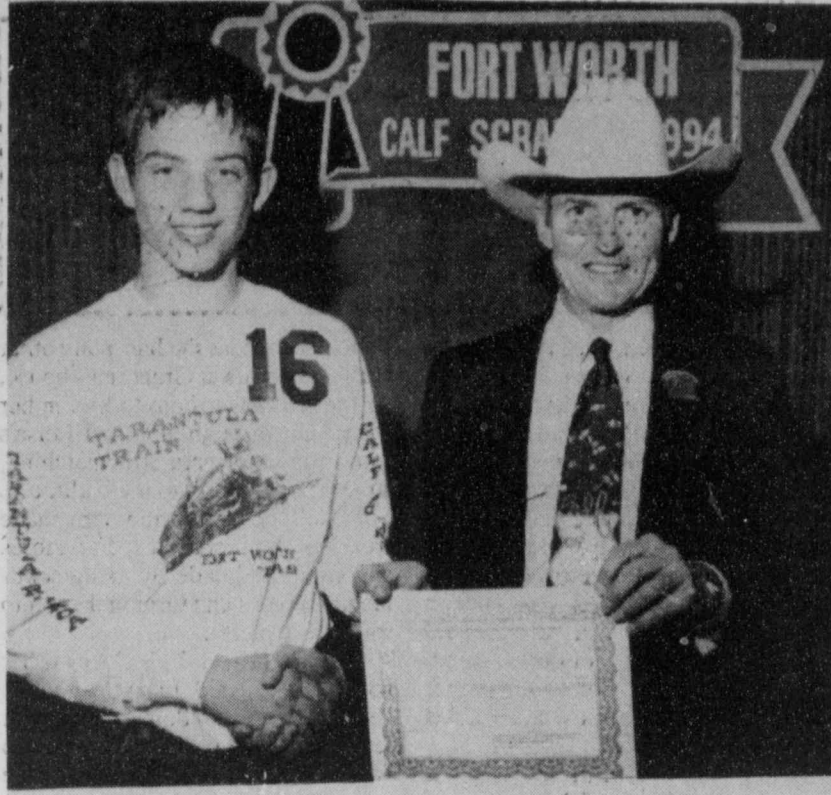
They were special and had a sentimental value in excess of their monetary value.

Jesse Neisler, Shane Michael and James Duncan Gordon, all Lamar County 4-H members, were among eight winners at the Fort Worth Calf Scramble during the 2:00 p.m. performance of the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show Rodeo, Sunday, January 30 in the Will Rogers Coliseum. Featured during each of the 28 performances of the Stock Show Rodeo, the Calf Scramble included participants from 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters from across the state.

Neisler is the son of Auddie and Vicki Neisler of Brookston. Michael's parents are Danny and Patti Michael of Paris, and Gordon is the son of Mike and Audrey Gordon of Pattonville. Each winner was presented with a certificate valued at \$500 for successfully catching, haltering and leading a calf to the scramble judges. The sponsor for Neisler's effort was Circle H Stock Farm of Dallas. Michael was sponsored by Cockrell Printing, Fort Worth, and Gordon was sponsored by Duer Wagner of Fort Worth.

After purchasing heifers of their

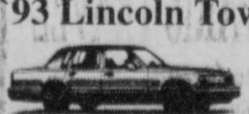

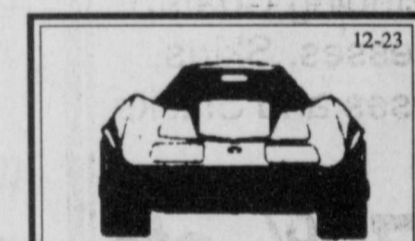

### Keeping Healthy

#### Age-Related Macular Degeneration

If you're over 50 and the telephone pole or door frame seem a little bent or crooked, you may have the earliest stage of macular degeneration.

The condition, a gradual destruction of a portion of the retina, affects about two percent of those 50 to 65 years old and about 11 percent of those 65 to 75.

People who have the problem do not become blind, but they may lose the ability to see fine details.

Because early diagnosis is the key to successful treatment, everyone over 50 should have regular eye examinations.

The use of vitamins or zinc to prevent progression of the disease is the subject of many investigations, but at present there is no scientific evidence to support their efficacy. There is also no conclusive evidence about whether blocking sunlight with tinted glasses can help prevent progression of the disease.

The best prevention is a regular eye examination, coupled with awareness of the condition. If you

The second half saw Prairiland completely dominate as they scored 33 points to Cooper's 9 for the 55-24 victory.

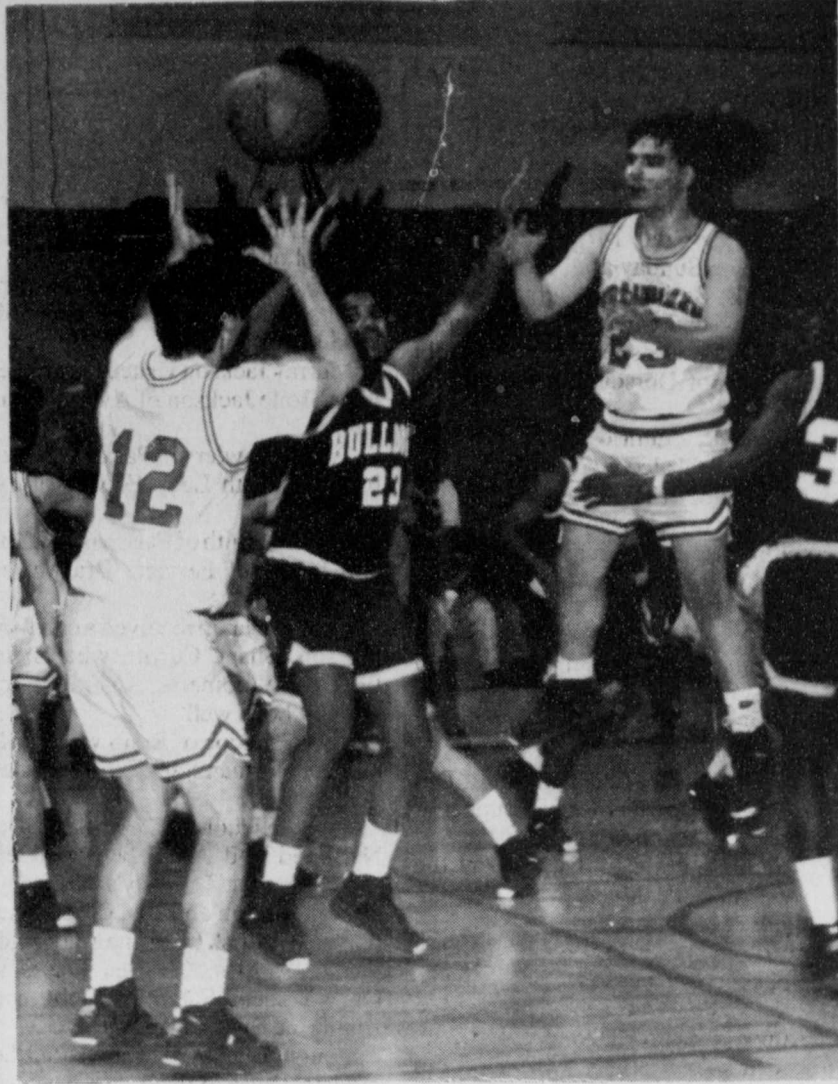
Todd James led Prairiland in scoring with 15 points while pulling in 7

PRAIRILAND Patriot Jon Pasquill takes a Brock Blasingame pass in their game against Cooper. The Patriots

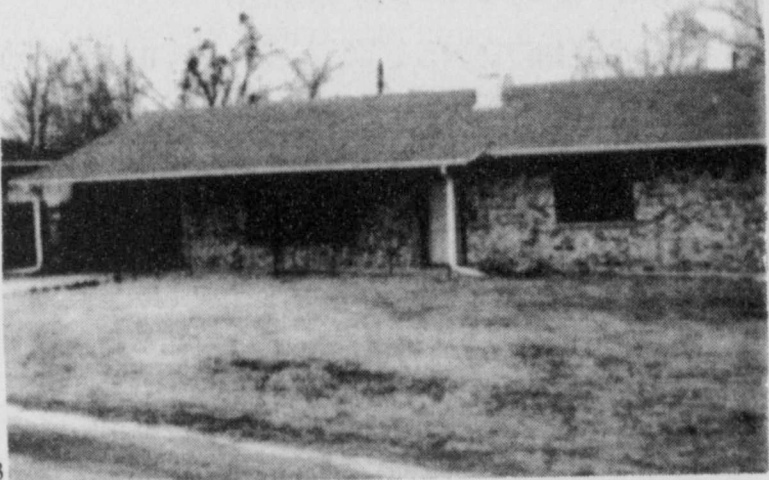
