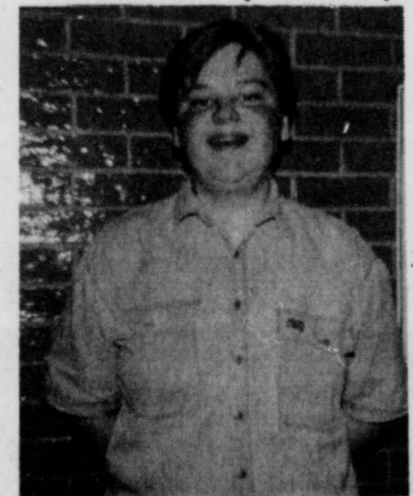

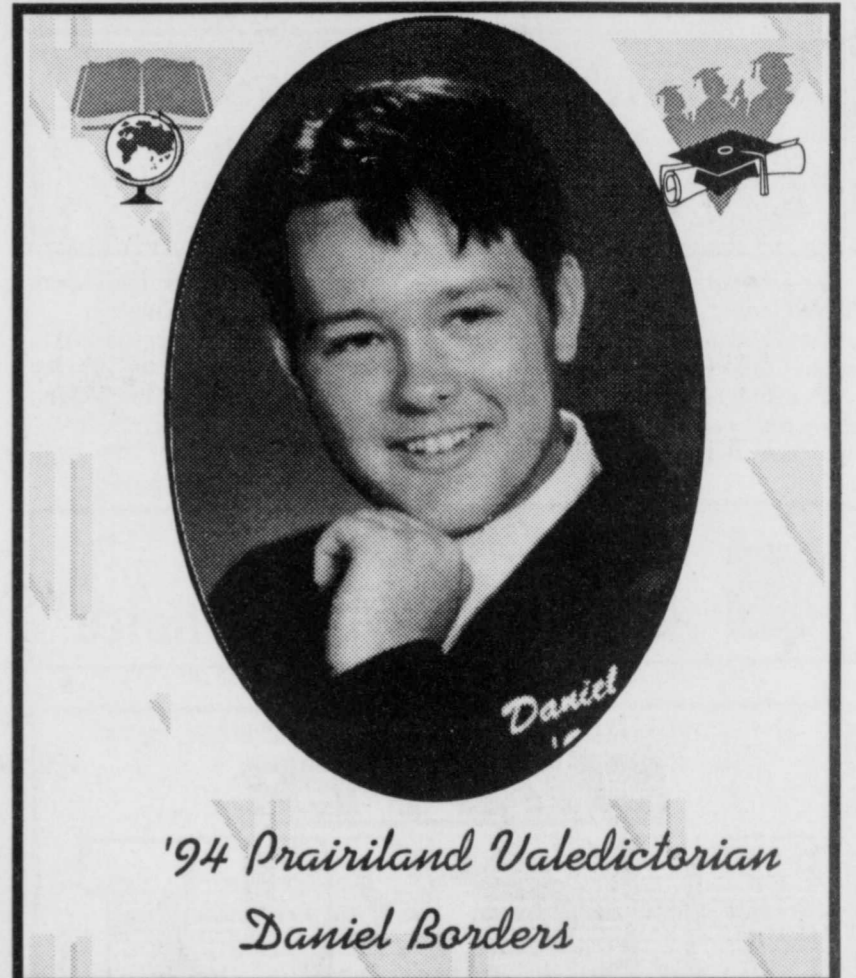
Milton Homecoming Set

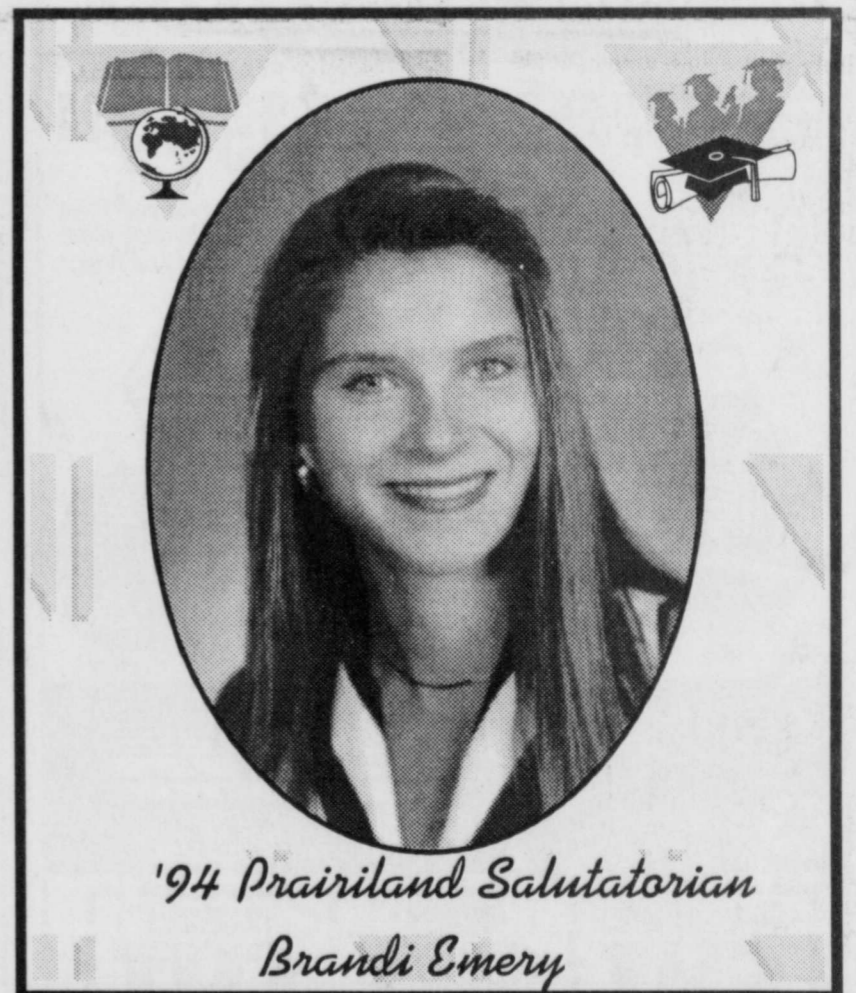
There will be a business meeting of the Cemetery Association after

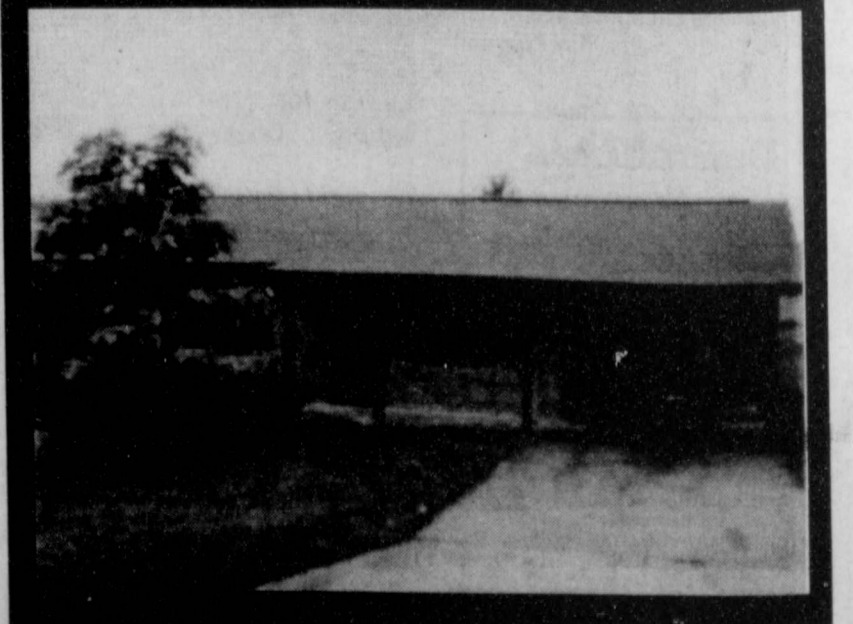

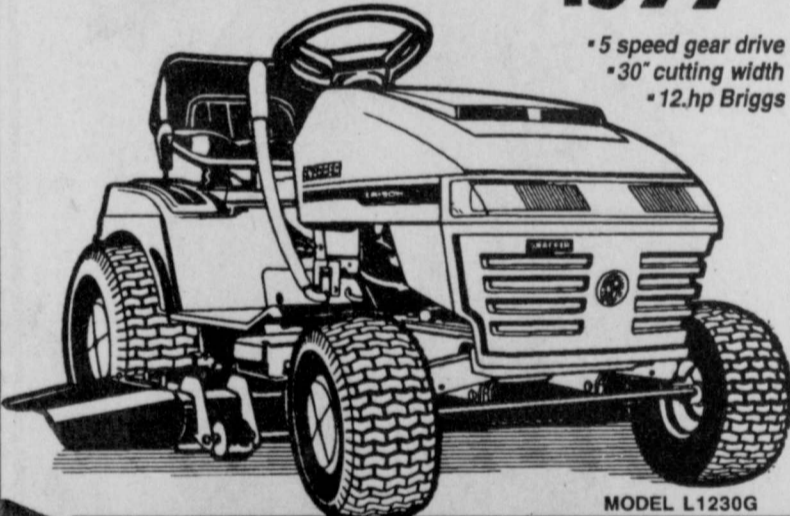

Yorkshire pudding batter
To make Yorkshire Pudding batter, use 1 cup flour, 1 egg, a pinch of salt, and enough milk to make a smooth batter. Beat all together to make a batter which will just cling to spoon.

1 cup flour
1 oz. butter
1 oz sugar
Simmer apples until tender. Combine with uncooked blackberries and sugar (as required to your taste). Place in oven proof dish.
Combine flour, butter and sugar and mix with hands until a crumble consistency is achieved. Sprinkle over fruit and bake in oven 400 degrees until top is crisp and golden. Serve with hot custard or vanilla ice cream.

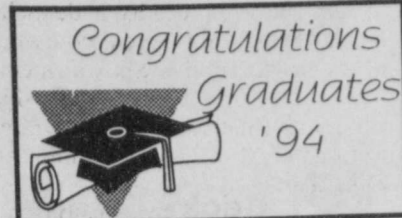

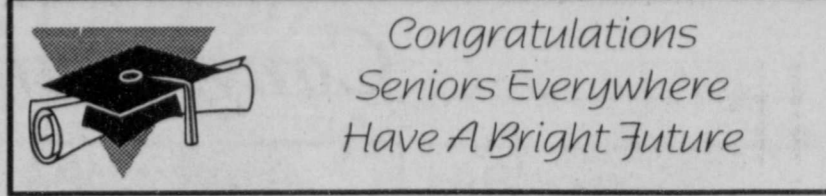

Prairiland returns seven starters next year and will once again look forward to the playoffs under new head coach Murray Riddles.



















