After I told my little story two people pulled out twenty dollar bills and handed them to me to use for the project. One of these people I know quite well, the other I've never seen before!

Several people have gone through their children's clothes to bring good, nearly new clothing to me for a family. Another family has purchased dolls for Santa to bring, while yet another family is providing new

shoes. Gift certificates for food are forthcoming for several families. Each and every person I have spoken with says exactly what I said -"we have so much". And we do. It doesn't mean there aren't bills to pay, and debts to deal with. It doesn't mean there aren't family problems and worries to keep us all awake at night. But it does mean that on Christmas Day we can sit down with family or friends to a hearty meal. We can watch our children, or grandchildren, nieces or nephews tear into their packages and exclaim in delight at what "Santa" brought. And we can give (I hope) several moments to pondering the true meaning of Christmas, the original gift of love that prompts the celebration, and how

Did we do much good? I don't know. Did we solve any big problems? Of course not. All we do know is that we feel better as we enjoy our bountiful holiday. I don't suppose we gave very much to those who received our offerings. But we gave ourselves a priceless gift.... the joy of giving.

you think of smiling children's family of mice having their own adornments and staff. aglow with the wonder of Santa Claus. Visions of the toys and goodies that have been hoped for each year. Each child has his own version of what Santa should look, be and act like. But if you ask David Winkley of Detroit, his version of Santa, it will be a very wide variety of answers. You see David is no child, but he does have a fixation for Santa! Over 2300 of them in fact.

David and Donna Winkley moved to Detroit in August, where Donna took up the post of Elementary Principal in the Detroit ISD school system. They have two children. A son Shel is 11 and in the 5th grade and Samantha is a sophomore and 15 years old. David started his addiction some eight years ago with a Santa he and Donna rather fancied. From there it mushroomed. You see, they not only collect Santa's, they collect eagles, angels, cups, saucers, music boxes, all types of stained glass(complete villages I might add) and a variety of other items. I commented to David that he must be a mover's nightmare and received a hearty laugh.

They purchased the Nelson place in Detroit as much for the workshop out back as anything. It has been renovated with shelves, free standing and along the walls to accomodate this massive collection of Santa's. As you enter the shop, you are greeted by a lifesize replica talking Santa that welcomes all visitors to their home and wishes them a joyous Christmas. He is complete with his wish list for the children. Overhead, lining one wall is Donna's doll collection and across the room is the Family Christmas Tree, accompanied by, none other than another three foot Santa. There are also Santas ridng a reindeer, riding a polar bear and in a sleigh with Rudolph and a small Santa Train Station. Keep in mind that these are not miniatures, they are well over a foot tall and can be set in motion.

Through the door into the workshop, you are greeted to the musical collection of various types of Santas playing a variety of Christmas music. They are all set on timers and play carols at different increments with the music constantly changing.

To the right is a complete farm village along with a Coca-Cola village and the complete scene from Night Before Christmas. David says that this depicts his family on Christmas Eve. Each member is represented, including grandfather, chil-

When you think of Christmas, dren and parents, even the mouse(or a gold-embossed robe with gold Christmas celebration). The North Pole Village is complete down to the smallest detail, with once again many one-of -a-kind and retired pieces. Lining the wall above the villages is a row of Santas from the famous Polish artist Pipka. These a a special numbered series and many are one of a kind. Above this shelf, begins the collection of Santa plates. They go around two walls and add a striking

touch to the villages. Next to the villages are small Santa figurines from Emmitt(the clown, not the football star), to cowboy Santa's, old world Santa's, to many from foreign countrie, and any type you can

On a standing shelve is his collection of (keep in mind that most of these are over 1-1/2 feet tall) animated Santa's doing a little bit of everything. Feeding the reindeer, playing golf, sleeping, reading, eating, playing musical instruments and a variety of many more, all in motion.

In one corner, there is a lifelike

Santa playing the piano, or should I

say the "choir director", S. Claus. As the music begins, you look to your right and there are Santa's after Santa's lined up as if they are ready to sing carols on Christmas Eve. Any type you can imagine. Many of these are over one to two foot tall. It is as if they are on risers in a church choir raising their voices in exhaltation. Another standing shelf displays two foot Santas adorned in wonderful, colorful Christmas attire. Many of these are handmade by renown artists such as Lynn Haney, Stone Soup, Timeless, Sierra Art and Donna, just to name a few. Once again, many of these are numbered and one-of-a-kind.

David related the stories about the many time at the "negotiating table", bargaining for these prized possessions. Many of these were in local restaurants, small shops and places that only buyers would know of. He would not even begin to account for the number of gallons of iced tea and cokes that he has consumed while bargaining for an item and said that four hours was a short time for him to negotiate a sale, if it was a certain piece that he wanted. He stated that the bargaining was the best part of the purchase. I believe, just from talking to him, that he was a "horse-trader" in a former life!

Adorning the side wall across the room is another assortment of animated Santa's, including a Santa bust with a wreath of mistletoe, a Santa in

Below on the floor and surrounding shelf is another group of animated Santas bathing, soaking his tired feet and much more. Lining the walls as you go out is his collection of numbered and limited editions of Santa's. He also has Santas lined up by country and dated, a collection of gold and white Santas, mercury Santa's, and Santas depicting any activity related to the holiday season.

David plans to leave these on permanent display in his "workshop" for others to enjoy. Before moving to Detroit, they were packed and repacked each year for the holiday season only. They would begin around 7:00 a.m. after Thanksgiving and begin the unpacking and by Tuesday of the following week, the kids were thinking that they really were not sure about this Santa thing. Putting them away was another matter entirely. David says that he would start on or about the 10th of January and the last one would be packed by the end of March!

Their vacations consist of checking out Christmas shops wherever they go and they travel extensively. The kids know if they want to take an extra break, just find mom and dad a Christmas shop! Some of their favorite's are Christmas Cottage in Melbourne, Florida, Rudolph's in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and of course, the North Pole in Oklahoma, City. He has pieces from all over the United States and as far away as Russia, Norway, Poland and many other foreign countries.

Along with the Family tree, they have the Formal Tree in the Formal Living Room inside the house and a small Christmas Tree is on a table and is used on Christmas Eve to add the ornaments that are bought and placed each year and never used again until the children are out on their own. Then they are given the ornaments and can be used in their homes for their families.

Several of the classes from Detroit and Blossom have visited Mr. Winkley and his Santas. David extends a hearty welcome to anyone who wishes to view his collection and we thank him very much for his hospi-

He is constantly adding pieces and just last week added eight new ones. Several times as I was there the phone would ring and David's eyes would light up, knowing that the call might be from a prospective "seller" with another one for him to "haggle"

The Prairiland board met Thursday, December 12. One of the first items of business was to approve Title 1 school wide plan for the Deport


They also agreed to renew the legal services contract with Walsh, Anderson, Underwood, Schulze & Aldridge, P.C.

Here are their Cooky Recipes, tried and tested and delicious. More recipes and a story will follow in the new year.

CHOCOLATE MALTED COOKIES Patsy Norrell

1 Cup butter flavored shortening

1 1/4 cup packed brown sugar 1/2 cup malted milk powder

2 Tbl. chocolate syrup

1 Tbl. vanilla

1 Egg

2 cups all purpose flour 1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. salt

1 1/2 cups semisweet chocolate chunks

cup (6 oz.) milk chocolate chips

In mixing bowl combine first five ingredients, beat 1 minutes, add egg. Combine flour, soda, salt. Gradually add to creamed mixture, mixing well after each addition.

Stir in chocolate chunks and chips. Shape into balls, place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 375 degrees for 12-14 minutes or until golden brown, yields 2 1/2 dozen.

CHEWY PECAN COOKIES

1 cup butter or margarine, softened

1 cup sugar

3/4 cup packed brown sugar 3 eggs

1/4 cup milk

1 tsp. vanilla extract 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1 Tbl. ground cinnamon

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. pumpkin pie or apple pie spice

2 cups quick-cooking oats

2 cups raisins 1 1/2 cups chopped pecans

In a large mixing bowl, beat butter, sugars, eggs, milk & vanilla. Combine dry ingredients; add to creamed mixture & mix well. Stir in oats, raisins and nuts; mis well. Drop by Tablespoonsfuls onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until light golden brown. Remove from baking sheets to cool on wire racks. Yiels 5-6 dozen

ALMOND BARK COOKIES Juanita Taylor

2 pounds almond bark

2 cups dry roasted peanuts 3 cups Rice Krispies

I cup chunky peanut butter

2 cups mini-marshmallows

Melt almond bark in 200 degree oven. Stir in peanut butter until smooth. Add the rest of the ingredients and mix well.

Drop by spoonsful on waxed paper.

1 cup shortening 4 cups flour


1 tsp. slat 1/2 tsp soda

This Christmas will be very different for our family. Mamaw and Papaw died just nine weeks apart this past summer, and they were a very big part of our Christmas. Mamaw and I were the only ones in the family who would start Christmas shopping on Labor Day, finding just the "perfect" gift for everyone. I am going to miss Mamaw calling me repeatedly to verify sizes and to confer about what we have purchased.

I remember the Christmas parade downtown each year. They used to have it on a weekday afternoon. It seems like the weather was colder than, or maybe they just had the parade later in December. Mamaw and Papaw would park downtown early in the afternoon to be sure we had a good spot from which to watch the parade. Some years my brother and I would march in the parade as a Girl Scout or Boy Scout. I remember one year I had the mumps on both sides of my neck and had to miss school a whole week. I was so upset about missing the parade, that my mother bundled me up so tightly that I could hardly move and made me sit in the car, but at least I

One of my oldest and fondest Christmas memories is all of the family piling into the car to drive around town and look at Christmas lights. We had certain streets and houses that we had to drive by each year. I remember one year, Papaw couldn't go with us because of the shift he was working (so they said). I recall my brother and I being so excited because we actually saw Rudolph's red nose blinking as he led Santa's sleigh through the sky. While we were gone, Santa came and left our presents. I got the "Baby Peaches" doll I had picked out of the worn out Christmas catalog and my brother got the varoom motor he had asked for.

Mother and Daddy would go to their office Christmas parties and my brother and I would stay with Mamaw and Papaw. Mamaw was personal friends with Santa and Mrs. Claus, and she would call them on the telephone and let us talk to them. That was just amazing to us that Mamaw knew Santa's phone number and she could just call him up. While we were staying with them, Mamaw would always guess what we had bought her for Christmas. And she was usually right. Boy, was she good! Papaw would play "Rudolph, the Red Nosed Reindeer" and the Chipmunk Christmas album for us as loud as we wanted, and he would dance around and say, "Ho,ho,ho!" Mamaw always had divinity and fudge for us to eat, and as many cokes as we wanted.

Church was always important to our family, especially at Christmas. Mamaw would help direct and make costumes for the children's Christmas program. We were usually a shepherd, or angel or an animal. Although our family enjoyed exchanging gifts and always went all out, we didn't lose sight of the true meaning of Christmas.

On Christmas Eve, we would gather at Mamaw's house. When we would get out of the car, it would be so cold, and it "smelled" like Christmas in the air. When we got all of the presents under the tree, you could hardly see the living room floor. The grown ups would make us eat first before we could open gifts. Papaw would get in the middle of the floor and let the grandkids help him pass out the presents, while he Ho-ho-ho'd.

I can only remember one or two Christmases when we had snow, so we had to build d snowman and make snow ice cream. Christmas Day we would travel to my Granny Pat's who lived in the country. To me the trip was truly like the song "Over the River and Through the Woods to Grandmother's House we go." All of our cousins and aunts and uncles would be there. There sure was a bunch of us.

I remember one Christmas I heard "Santa" bringing our new bicycles from the storage room into the house. I think my brother and I got our parents out of bed at 3:30 A.M. that Christmas. They had just barely laid

No, Christmas won't ever be the same. But, I'm so glad I have these wonderful memories on which to reflect and tell my grandchildren. Christmas is still my favorite time of the year. I try to make it as special for my children as it was for me growing up. I catch myself this year picking up the phone to call Mamaw and confer with her about what to purchase for someone. I see something in the store and think," That would be perfect to get for Mamaw," And then reality sets in.

This Christmas will be different -- it won't be easy, but it will still be Christmas, and it will always be Jesus' birthday no matter what happens.



Alta Leigh featured in Garland Article

Jo Ann Simmons submitted this article which was published in the Garland News November 21, 1996 about a long-time subscriber, Alta

The article is by Sue Watkins and is part of a regular column called 'Our Town"

It begins: bringing with her nine years of experience in special educaiton, Alta had taught those classes in Ennis and Marshall after graduating from East Texas State College. She later received her master's degree from the same school.

In 1954 the Garland City Council of Parent-Teacher Associations presented Alta with a life membership in the State Association. She was the second person to receive the honor, following Ressie Isett, head nurse of the nursing and health program in Garland schools.

after two years of teaching in the small room at Freeman Elementary School, Alta moved to a room four times as spacious at Williams El-

ementary. Facilities includeed two restrooms, a water fountain adn much more storage space.

Students prinicipally did handwork in those early years. They made bookends, jewelry cases and place mats. They modeled with clay and listened to records.

In the new classroom a rhythm

band was added. Academic instruction was tailored of the needs of some of the students.

MIn a newspaper story in 1954 Alta said the thing that impressed her most in Garland was the interest of the residents. "I've never seen so much assistance, or seen so much interest as I have here in Galrand" she said.

Every student in the early class had a different problem which Alta considered before planning work for them. "When it is possible, we prepare children for regular classroom participation" the teacher said then.

Parents were allowed to put into the child's program from the very first years, a prelude to following years when parents were always encouraged to participate in a child's school experiences.







A few months ago we spent a lovely afternoon with two precious ladies our mothers, Mrs. Lola Beatrice Fry Poindexter (age 94) and Mrs. Mary Magdalene Furgerson Scoggins (age 85). They came for lunch and after enjoying a nice meal together, Harley set up the video camera and we spent a very memorable time with them sharing life experiences with us.

The memories they shared were both exciting and frightening. We heard stories of a winter spent in a tent while a home was being built by the father, of times when food was scarce, illnesses and accidents that took family members, but their most memorable moments were of Christmases

Both women agreed that the gifts and treats they received were very similar. Usually they received a doll that had a cloth saw dust filled body with a porcelain head and hands. Sometimes it even had porcelain feet. Each received a stocking containing one orange, one apple, a few nuts, few pieces of hard candy and sometimes a banana. This was the only time during the year that they had fruit that was not home grown.

Mother Poindexter shared special memories of Christmas Eve when all the families gathered at the grandparents' home. The most exciting time was when her grandfather would pop a very large dishpan full of popcorn as all the grandchildren watched. He would fill a wire basket with the corn and pop it over the fireplace coals. One basket at a time was dumped into the dishpan as wide-eyed children watched. Grandfather would not let anyone have a bite until the pan was running over. During this time her grandmother would be parching peanuts. The delicious aromas filled the house and eager hungry children could hardly wait! When permission was finally given to eat, they devoured the treats with joy!

Mom Scoggins described a typical Christmas dinner- A turkey with all the trimmings was the centerpiece. Sometimes a baked ham would also grace the table. The vegetables would all be home grown and home canned. Homemade delicacies such as pies and cakes were also on the menu, this special menu was a far cry from their everyday meals consisting primarily of beans and potatoes.

The childhood of these ladies was spent during a time when there were virtually no cars. There also was no radio, no TV, no telephone, no electricity. Can you imagine!

How many of us would be happy and content with a Christmas such as these? How blessed we are.

When I was a boy of fourteen, my father was so ignorant I could hardly stand to have the old man around. But when I got to be twenty. one, I was astonished at how much he had learned in seven years. MARK TWAIN







The next day, which was Decembr 18, I was sent to my Granny Fowler's to spend the night. Grandma's condition had worsened. I never worried, because I would see her Christmas Eve. I'm my Granny Fowler knew Grandma's fate, but like my mother, she couldn't tell me.

On Sunday, December 20, 1981, Zetta Marie Salter, my Grandma, passed away. When Daddy came to pick me up at Granny Fowler's he didn't have to tell me... I read his fce and burst into tears. Grandma was gone. I'll never forget her funeral and all of her family and friends who came to honor her. I'll never forget unwrapping the bottle of Aviance lotion for her two days before Christmas (I kept the bottle for three years). I'll never forget

seeing my Grandaddy cry for the first time in my eleven years of life. Howeve,r on Christmas Eve, something strange happened. As a tradition, my cousins Kent and Susan and myself passed out all the Christmas presents. When I sat down to open my presents I noticed the name tag: To Melanie From Grandma. The writing was written in her beautiful handwriting with no signs of illness, just like the previous Christmas.

To this day, I don't remember the material inside the rectangular box. All I remember is her prescence with me that Christmas. Later I asked Mother about the name tag. Mother smiled with tears in her eyes and replied "I think Grandma wanted to spend one more Christmas with you."

Through the holidays, especially around Christmas, my mind travels back to that moment. Now, as an adult, I realize the pain Grandma went through just to write a simple name tag. The memory she implanted in my heart is one which will live forevr. Grandma's determination allowed me one more Christmas with her, and I hope she knows that I will love her forever.


