good living, and live a good life. Every person has them-those older people who are so filled with wisdom and spirit that they are a beacon in the lives of

others, a true friend. Every town has them-those special people who are always there, working tirelessly for the betterment of their community. y are at every worthwhile and raiser, working, boosting spirits, sharing their joy in their

But it is seldom that all of these exemplary qualities are combined within one person. It is even rarer for that one person to mean all of the above things to three generations. It is perhaps rarest of all for an individual to be this special in spite of being severely handicapped by polio.

Deport lost one of it's finest citizens Sunday, when Miss Ina Sparks died. Her twin sister, Nina was by her side, as were others of her family.

The gap she leaves in the lives of those she taught, worked with, or knew will be great. However, she leaves a lasting legacy much larger than the gap.

"Miss Ina" was crippled as a child with the dread disease of polio. It never stopped her from getting her teaching degree, although the halls were long for a girl in braces who had to walk slowly with canes.

For forty-six years she taught English and Literature and Spanish. It is inconceivable that any student ever felt her unfair.

If she disciplined a student it was a matter of "I've been caught". She was respected. More than that, however, was the love of words and the English language that shone through and inspired so many of her students. She guided her students onto paths that suited their abilities, challenging those she knew could do more, steering those with limitations in directions that enabled them to be productive citizens. The number of students she led onto successful paths cannot be counted. The love she inspired cannot be counted.

After retiring she still devoted hours to volunteer work. She had thousands of hours of volunteer work at McCuistion Hospital. Taking money at fund-raisers for the fire department she turned her blazing smile on one and all from her "scooter" that took the place of canes as age further weakened her legs. Her handicap was not pain-free, yet she never complained.

A joke made her silvery laugh peal out. Sports fasciher, even though her show and twisted body never was able to play . She had more friends than she could begin to count. She touched more lives than she ever knew.

Miss Ina cannot be replaced. Short in body, she was, truly, a towering figure in the lives of many.

Every town has these special people. It hurts so bad to lose them. What hurts worse is when we don't make it clear to them how special they are until it's too late.

So I must say it now, and hope she hears me anyway. 'Miss Ina, we love you".






# Animal pickups to begin in Deport next week

According to Herman LaRue, Animal Control Officer, pick ups of animals running loose in Deport will begin starting Monday, May 29 within the city limits of Deport.

He says all animals will be treated humanely and will be taken to the veterinarian who will be keeping them on the same day they are caught.

Pet owners need to make sure their animals have a current rabies vaccination tag and are not running loose before pickups begin.

Animals that are on their owner's property will not be touched although they should not be loose so that they can leave their owner's property.

Animals that are impounded will be taken to Hardy Stewardson, Veterinarian, on Hwy. 82 west of Clarksville. Pet owners will have at least 72 hours before the animals will be subject to being destroyed. The number to call first if seeking a missing animal will be Deport City Hall, which is 652-3875. The number for Hardy Stewardson, DVM is 903-427-3294. Animals that have been impounded will be subject to a per day fee plus the cost of vaccination before they can be released. Animals that have been determined to be abandoned can be adopted by paying these

Texas-New Mexico Power Company (TNMP) hereby publishes notice that on or about March 31, 2000, it filed an application for approval of proposed tariffs that are to be effective on January 1, 2002, for its proposed transmission and distribution utility pursuant to Chapter 39, Subchapter E of the Texas Utilities Code with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (P.U.C.).

The primary purpose of this proceeding is to establish tariffs that will set the nonbypassable rates retail electric providers will be charged for delivery of electricity from the retail electric provider to the customer. The rates currently paid by the majority of customers will not change as a result of this proceeding prior to January 1, 2002. This proceeding may also establish other nonbypassable fees.

In addition to its application for approval of the above-referenced tariffs, TNMP has requested recovery of estimated stranded costs (\$194.4 million), recovery of expenses incurred in implementing energy efficiency programs in 2000 and 2001, and recovery of expenses incurred in connection with regulatory proceedings involving business separation and transmission and distribution utility tariffs. TNMP has also requested consolidation of the remaining portions of its proposed business separation plan (Docket No. 21955) and such other recovery and approvals as TNMP may show itself to be entitled during the course of this proceeding. As indicated in TNMP's Application, TNMP's requests are subject to possible modification to reflect impacts of various other ongoing regulatory proceedings and supplementation for corrections and to include specific details on performance-based rates.

Affected persons potentially include all customers and classes of customers of TNMP.

On September 1, 1999, amendments to the Texas Utilities Code went into effect which are designed to open the electric industry to competition. To facilitate this transition to competition, the Texas Utilities Code requires that traditional integrated electric utility companies separate their business activities into various component parts. After January 1, 2002, TNMP'scurrent customers will generally receive electricity and bills for electricity from a retail electric provider instead of TNMP.

### Bodacious"

Bodacious, known throughout the world and the sport of rodeo as "the world's most dangerous bull" died May 16 at his retirement home at the Andrews Rodeo Company ranch headquarters in Addielou.

According to owners Sammy and Carolyn Andrews, "Bo" died at age 12 as the result of kidney failure and was buried on the ranch.

Bodacioius began his trajectory into the spotlight as just another "yellow calf' on the Merrick Ranch in Oklahoma, owned by Bill McCann. Actually, he was a cull of McCann's, who was purchased in a group of calves from McCann by Jess Kephart of Okeene, OK at a nearby sale barn.

At the Kephart ranch, the unknowing future superstar of the rodeo world got his brand, "J31". The "J" stood for Jess; the "3" for March; and the "1" for 1991. The J31 brand remained prominently on Bo's right side from that time on, and became a revered "firebrand" number in the world of bull riding experts.

At age two, and a slight 1,200 lbs., Bo didn't fit in anywhere in the Kephart outfit, and was sold again, this time for \$.50 a pound to Phil Sumner of Goultry, OK, who began grooming the still nameless yellow bull for the bull riding event. They claim he never did buck that good starting out, but "he first time a cowboy got hung up to him, he went сгаху.

After working with the bull, Sumner saw the potential that Bo had for a rodeo bull, and he called his friend Sammy Andrews. They made a deal over the phone, and the yellow bull was trucked to Texas permanently to begin his pro-rodeo career. Sumner, however, didn't realize the effect Bo would have on the rodeo world. How could anyone have

After arriving at the Andrews Ranch, the bull was almost immedi-

ately loaded on the truck with the rest of the Andrews Rodeo stock, and wason his way to the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. He got his name "Bodacious" on the trip to Houston, and as they say, the rest is

Champion bull rider Cody Lambert was the first cowboy to draw him that year in professional competition, and he came to no good end after the whistle blew. Lambert said of Bo "He's psychotic, he doesn't like people.

Bo was notorious for a career of injuries to cowboys and later as the only superstar to have his own line of merchandise and an agent.

Maturing to 1800 lbs., the crossbred Charbray bull was known for his distinctive coloring as the "Yellow Whale", and other monikers. He made unique moves that rodeo athletes had never before seen and were defenseless to protect themselves against. Only six cowboys were able to complete their rides in 135 attempts at "fortune and glory" on Bo's

1994 he gained national attention at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, using his signature headsnapping move that resulted in life threatening injuries to bull riding star Terry Don West of Tulsa, OK.

Tuff Hedeman, often called the best bull rider ever, was one of the few to stay on Bodacious for a full eight seconds. But in 1995, Hedeman saw the terrifying side of Bo when he suffered a major face smashing and required emergency reconstructive surgery after a brutal encounter at the PBR Finals.

Hedeman drew the bull again at the National Finals Rodeo that year and chose to "gate him", rather than get on him again. Hedeman said of Bodacious, "He's the baddest bull there has ever been.

It was that same year, 1995, that

A day after the Breding accident, and during the final go-round of the 1995 NFR, owners Sammy and Carolyn Andrews decided to retire Bo "in the interest of cowboy safety."

In 1999 Bodacious was inducted into the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame in Colorado Springs, CO where he was praised as "the bull the cowboys didn't want to draw, and the bull the fans loved."

In retirement, Bodacious continued to increase his celebrity status, being featured in GQ (Gentleman's Quarterly) and Penthouse magazines. National television discovered Bodacious and he was profiled on the Fox TV Network program "Guinness World Records Prime Time.'

A breeding consortium, Buckers, Inc. took on marketing responsibilities for Bo and he toured state fairs, rodeos and even appeared as a celebrity guest at Harrah's Hotel and Casino and at the Silverton Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada.

A feature videotape on Bo became a best seller and opened a new era in rodeo merchandising. Montana Silversmith released a best selling line of belt buckles and other jewelry, and a limited edition commemorative Winchester Rifle was released by A&A, along with a complete clothing line and Bud Light advertisements featuring Bo with World Champion Bull Rider Tuff Hedeman.

Buckers, Inc. is keeping the legacy of Bodacious alive through distribution of semen as part of a move to breed better bucking stock

# May Their Sacrifices Never Be In Vain

More than one million men and women have lost their lives fighting for freedom in the U.S. armed forces. We can never reimburse the price they paid. We can summon no words to allay the pain of their loved ones. We can, and we should honor America's war dead on Memorial

We, as beneficiaries of America's departed heroes, should make three pledges on Memorial Day to ensure that the Supreme Sacrifice of our nation's war dead never will be in vain

The first pledge we should make is to fly the U.S. Flag and to participate in our community's's commemorative events America's patriots shed their blood in defense of our nation's core values of freedom, justice and equality as well a the U.S. Flag that symbolizes our values. Memorial Day should unify all Americans in solemn tribute to those who did not come marching home and to consecrate the principles for which they fought.

The second pledge we should make is to teach our children and grandchildren that the freedoms they may take for granted were purchased by incredible sacrifice. When we lead by example, by bringing our children and grandchildren with us to Memorial Day public observations, we teach the leaders of tomorrow that freedom is not free.

The third pledge is to participate in our democracy in order to give patriots present the best opportunity to triumph against evil. Today's troops form the light of hope that pierces the darkness of tyranny, but that light is growing dim due to inadequate military spending and foolhardy defense policy. Safeguarding the bounty of 1 million war dead is a military that is smarting from a 300% increase in deployments and a onethird decrease in active duty strength since 1987. This is a military receiving fewer tax dollars, as a percentage of gross domestic product, than the military that suffered the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7,

We must act as if Memorial Day 2000 is December 6, 1941, as if "We the People" have an opportunity to deter aggression, save lives, and give our men and women in uniform a fighting chance. We must demand that our congressional representatives and our president reverse the declining readiness of the armed forces. Our telephone calls, e-mails, faxes and letters to Congress and to the White House can reverse the neglect that erodes our military, threatens national security and endangers the values for which Americans gave their lives.

These contemporary pledges flow from the earliest traditions of Memorial Day. Southern women in the spring of 1865 planted flowers on the graves of Confederate war dead. Gen. John Logan, commander in chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans, ordered his group to decorate the graves of Union troops on a uniform date in 1868. These and other commer\_ tions would give rise to the first mational Memorial Day observance on May 30, 1868, at Arlington National Cemetery. Gen. James Garfield, keynote speaker for the observance, said those who lost their lives fighting for freedom engaged in the ultimate expression of humanity's highest virtues. The general was right!

More than 1 million men and women, preponderantly of modest means an infinite courage sacrificed all of their tomorrows while fighting for America's unifying virtues. Surely we can honor their sacrifice, transmit the values for which they fense that is liberty's backbone By fought and preserve the common deour vigilance, the sacrific America's departed heroes shall never be in vain.






