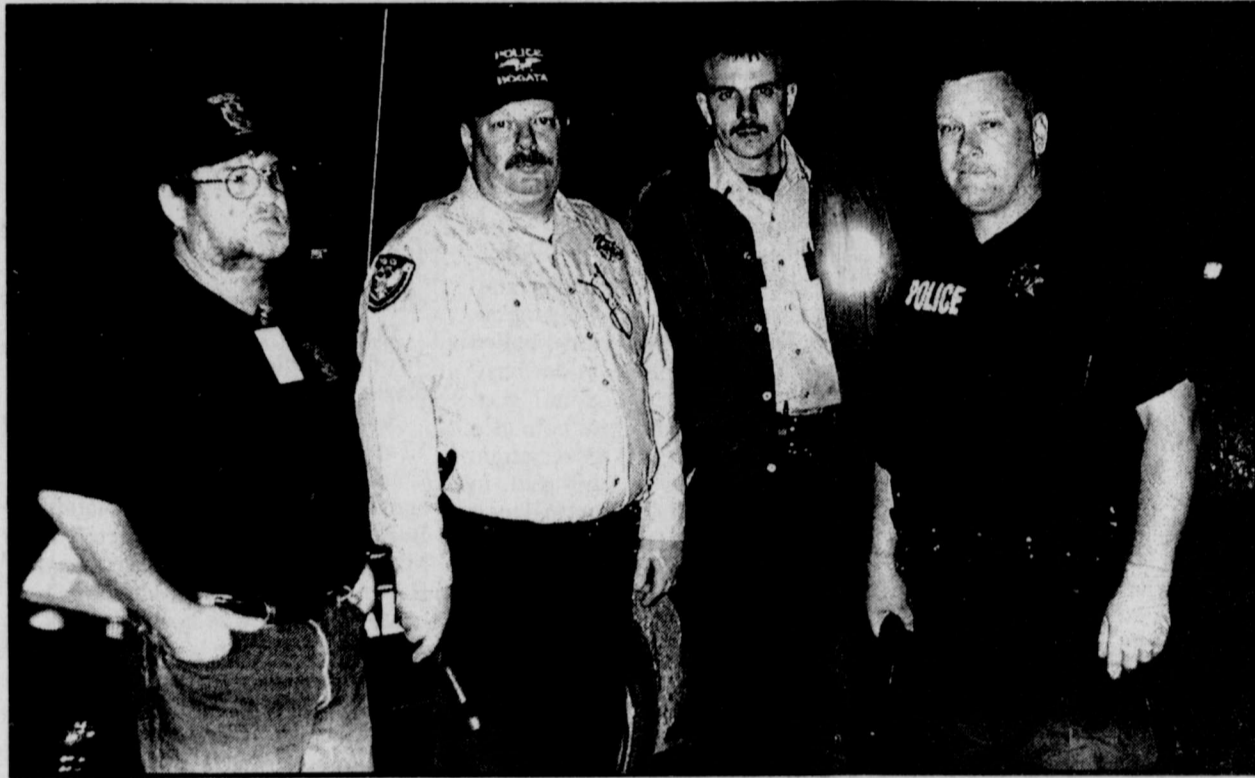

160 search for elderly man in Bogata

One hundred and sixty people and nine volunteer fire departments took part in a massive search for a missing elderly man Tuesday afternoon. The man, a resident at Red River Healthcare in Bogata, apparently managed to wander away from the facility. The search began at about 5:00 p.m. and Bogata Volunteer Fire Department set up a command center and began a systematic, ever-widening sweep of the area. As more and more people began to pour in to assist with the search the scope was

increased and the depth of the search intensified until volunteers were going door to door asking if anyone had seen an elderly man in green jogging pants and a red cap, walking with a cane. Soon private citizens and young people on bicycles were looking too.

The man was located on Roachtown Road and South Main at about 7:30 p.m., cold and wet but apparently not seriously hurt. He was transported to a hospital to be checked over carefully.

Prairiland board approves a number of items

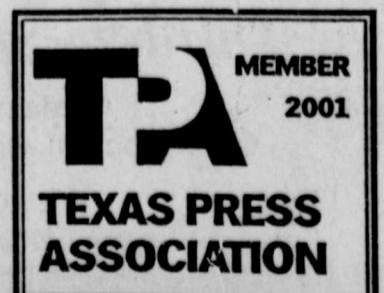

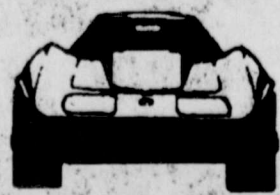
Velma Hill honored on birthday

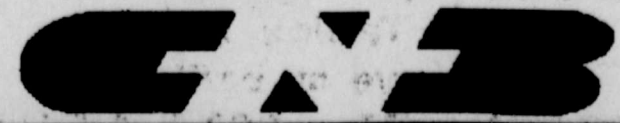

Mandarin Orange Chicken Salad

2-10 ounce cans chicken
1 apple
1/4 cup sweet relish or pickles
1 small cna mandarin oranges
1/4 cup onion
1/4 cup mayonnaise
1/4 cup nuts-optional
Drain oranges and reserve juice. Combine all ingredients, except mayonnaise. Mix juice with mayonnaise and gradually pour over other ingredients and toss lightly.

Apple Sauce Cake

1 box plain yellow cake mix
1 box instant vanilla pudding
1/3 cup oil
1/3 cup sour cream
4 eggs
1 cup apple sauce
1 cup pecans-optional
Mix oil, sour cream and beat well. Add eggs one at a time. Gradually add cake mix and pudding mix. Stir well. Bake one hour at 350 degrees.

Ham Casserole

2 cups cooked ham
8 ounces medium noodles
1 can celery soup
1/2 cup chopped green peppers
1/2 cup chopped onion
1 cup sour cream
2 cups cheese

Cook noodles according to directions; drain. Add all other ingredients. Place in casserole dish and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Chicken-Egg Noodle Casserole

2 cups cut-up chicken
6 ounces egg noodles
can chicken broth
can chicken soup
1 onion
2 tablespoons butter
salt and pepper to taste
1 cup cheese

Cook noodles according to directions; drain. Add broth, soup, onion and cheese. Place in casserole dish and bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.

Macaroni and Cheese Casserole

12 ounces macaroni
2 pounds Velveeta cheese
1/2 cup milk

Cook macaroni as directed; drain. In casserole dish, put a layer of macaroni and slices of velveeta cheese and sprinkle with sugar. Continue layering until all ingredients are used. Then pour on milk. Bake at 350 degrees until cheese melts.

Mexican Casserole

2 pounds ground beef
1 onion
1 can green chilis
1 can chicken soup
1 can mushroom soup
1 large can tomato
1 can Ro-Tel tomatoes
1 can enchilada sauce
1 pound Velveeta cheese
corn tortillas

Brown together onion and meat; strain and set aside. Heat in large pan until hot, remaining ingredients except cheese and tortillas. Line casserole dish with tortillas or corn chips of your choice. Pour meat and sauce mixture and spread evenly. Cut up chunks of Velveeta and push down into mixture so cheese melts into mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Pineapple-Apricot Salad

12 ounces crushed pineapple-not drained
2-3 ounce packages orange jello
3/4 cups sugar
2 jars apricot baby food
8 ounces cream cheese
9 ounces Cool Whip
pecans-optional

Combine pineapple and jello in sauce pan. Heat until jello melts. Remove from heat and add sugar, cream cheese and baby food. Chill. Fold in Cool Whip and chill before serving.

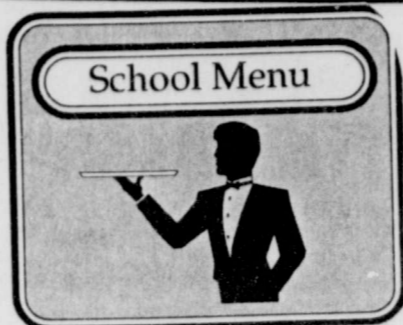

FOOT NOTES



Heel Spur Surgery
Advances in heel spur surgery have led to fewer complications, less scarring, and quicker recovery times for patients. Heel spurs, bony growths that develop on the heel bone near the foot's arch, are a common cause of heel pain. They can occur due to high-impact exercises like running, excess weight, arthritis and poorly fitting shoes. One new surgery involves removing the spur via a tiny transverse incision on the bottom of the heel just before the arch. The podiatrist then closes the wound and places a dry, sterile dressing on the foot. No stitches, casts, splints or post operative shoes are required. Patients may choose to insert an orthotic device in their shoe to support the foot after surgery.
Don't despair if surgery is recommended for your heel pain or other podiatric problem. Although the problems haven't changed all that much, podiatric procedures have greatly improved over the past few years. If your feet hurt, there's no advantage to putting it off, see your podiatrist. If you don't have one at this time, we are accepting new patients. 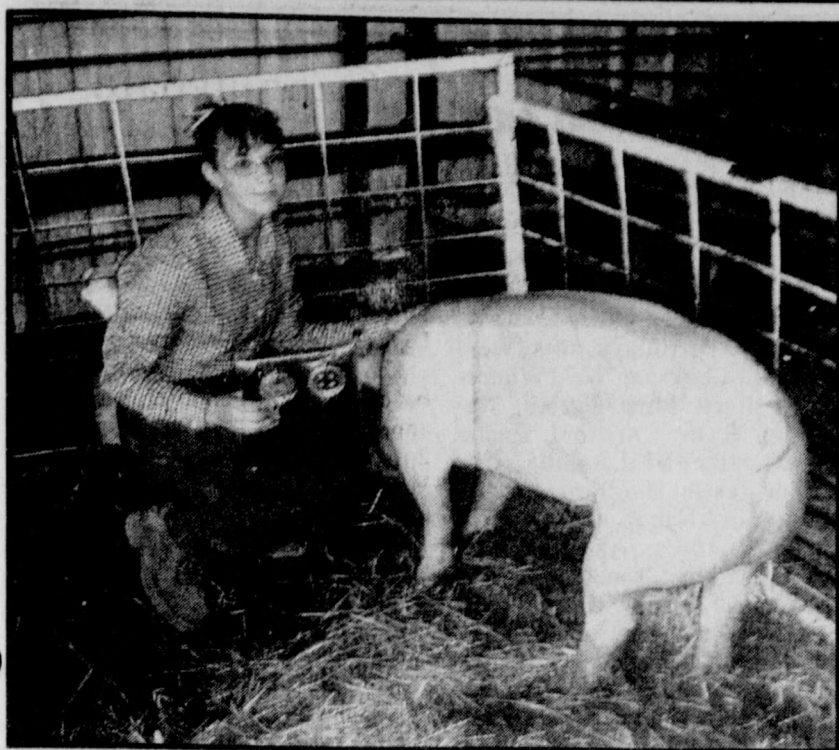

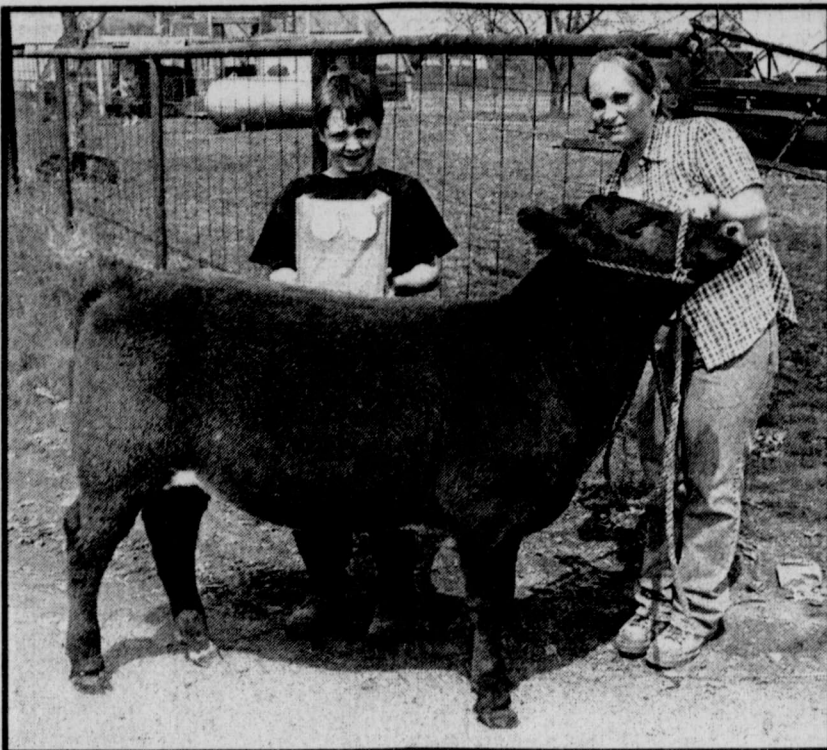

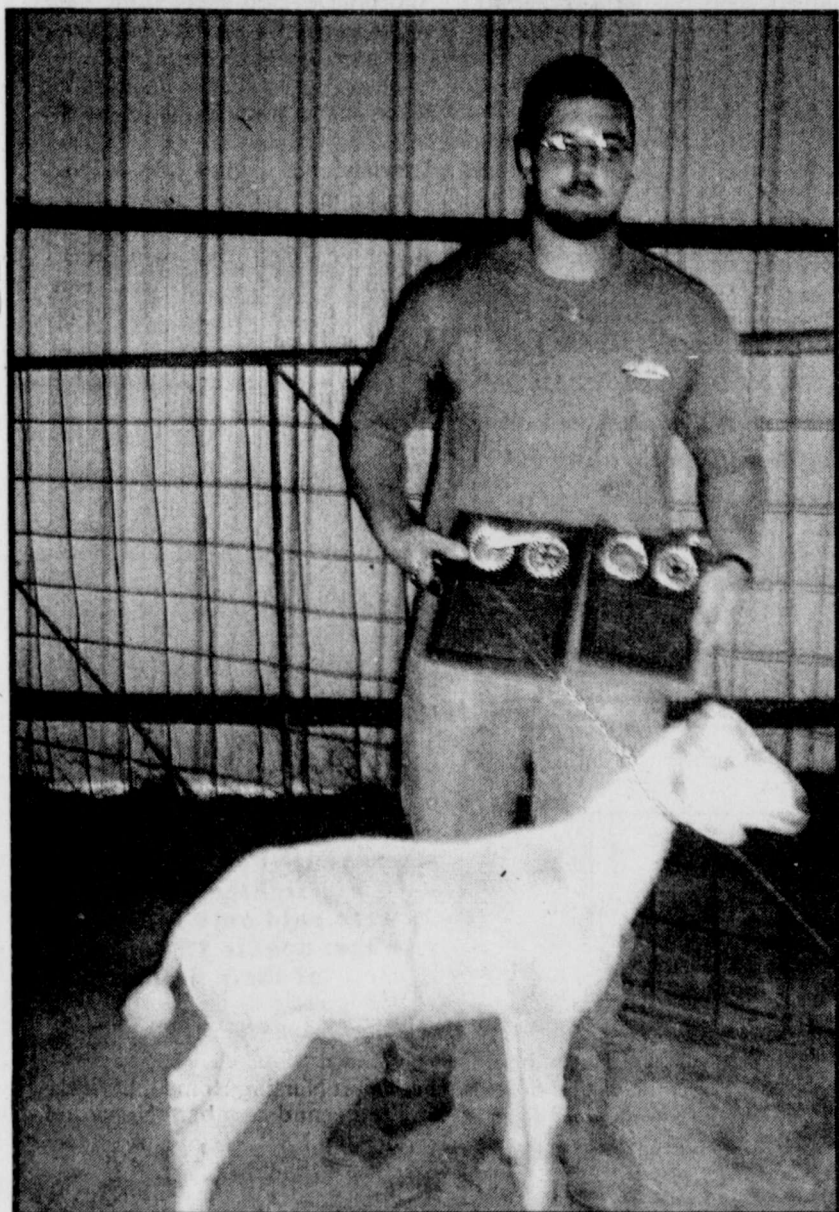
