

most of them have survived and I don't see that project as a failure. Another question from a store owner on the square concerned the lighting around the buildings around the square. Perhaps you have been by Haskell Memorial Hospital recently, and have seen all of the remodeling changes that are occurring. This is going to be an amazing project when it is completed. The Hospital Administrator, Fran McCown, and the members of the hospital board are showing amazing insight into how to make positive changes for the healthcare system of the city of Haskell. It is something each of us will be very proud of.

Many changes have already occurred and many more are in progress. One such new change is a complete overhauling of our emergency medical system thanks to the EMS board and personnel. As you know, if you are in an emergency situation, every minute counts. They have hired several new staff members in order to better serve the community. In addition to newer, more modern equipment and additional staff, efforts are being made to get service to those in need even more expeditiously. The only way to do that, however, is to have people stay on the premises, rather than have to leave their homes and go to the ambulance facility before they can take off. The hospital and ambulance boards have gone to a great expense to obtain housing for the ambulance personnel, which will cut down service time tremendously. There will be somebody staying there 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They may be there for several days at a time. The new facility, which is being made ready at this moment, still lacks many things that would be very helpful for the emergency personnel. They are working on furniture a little at a time, but one of the things they could really use would be a washing machine and dryer. If you would be willing to contribute to this effort, it would be greatly appreciated.
