Photo ID is required for city voters

City of Haskell, Early Voting Clerk, Carolyn Graston reminds voters that photo identification will now be required for voting in person.

In Haskell, we are working to make sure our voters understand the new ID requirements,

- Even if you have your voter registration card, you are required to show one of the following forms of photo ID at the polling location, before the voter will be permitted to cast a vote:

- Texas driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)

- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS

- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS

- Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS

- United States military identification card containing the person's photograph

- United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph

- United States passport

With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than 60 days before

being presented at the polling place.

This photo ID requirement is for voters casting a ballot in person, not by mail. Voters age 65 and older may vote by mail.

Election officials are encouraging voters to update their voter registrations to reflect the names on their IDs. Voters may use IDs that do not exactly match the name on their IDs if the names are substantially similar but will have to sign an affidavit stating they are the same person. Voters may look up their registration at votetexas.gov and if their name is not an exact match they can update their voter registration online at votetexas.gov.

By preparing now, voters can help make sure voting goes smoothly when it comes time for the election.

To check and update their registrations, voters can visit VoteTexas.gov or call Connie Benton at 940-864-2181 for more information.

Field named for Austin Coker

Tuesday, April 8 prior to the Haskell-Anson game, the updated Indian baseball field was renamed the Austin Coker Field. In a very touching ceremony, a large crowd of Indian fans, friends, family and teammates were on hand as Haskell Superintendent Bill Alcorn made the announcement.

Austin Coker or "Little Coke" as he was fondly referred to by his coaches and friends, passed away the summer before his senior year. Haskell Junior High principal Kent Colley, who was Coker's baseball coach

at the time, remembered just how much Coker loved baseball. Coker always said, "I am a God loving baseball player."

Colley went on to say that he knew baseball was a way for Austin to express himself to friends, family and God. He was a team player, which meant he loved to do battle with his friends and teammates beside him, he had their back and they had his.

The renaming of the baseball field coincided with many updates to the field, including new lights. As part of an Eagle Scout project by Zach Tatum, other improvements were made, such as a new net, backstop and painted dugouts. The sign depicting the new name of the field was unveiled, and will be

placed in a frame above the press box.

Taking part in the ceremony were Austin's parents Vickie and Jerry Coker, sister Macey, and brother and sister-in-law Zach and Brittany Coker. Alcorn announced the #1 jersey, Austin's number, has been retired and then presented each of the parents with a jersey. In addition signs on the left and right field walls show a baseball with the #1.

At the conclusion of the ceremony, Colley stated, "Little Coke had a great influence on my life, he made me want to be a better person." How much better this world would be if at the end of our time on earth, it could be said of each of us, "they had a great impact and made me want to be better."

For many years, Hess was a faithful Deacon at the Church of Christ until health forced him to resign. He and Dorothy housed more than 300 kids for the Haskell Singing School over a 40 year period. He also served in the church bus program and picked up many children to bring to church. He was a member of the Lions Club for many years and served as president. Known for his passion for Bridge and dominoes, Hess and Dorothy played dominoes every morning until he no longer could play. Hess retired from Hartsfield Insurance and Real Estate Agency that he owned and operated since 1964.

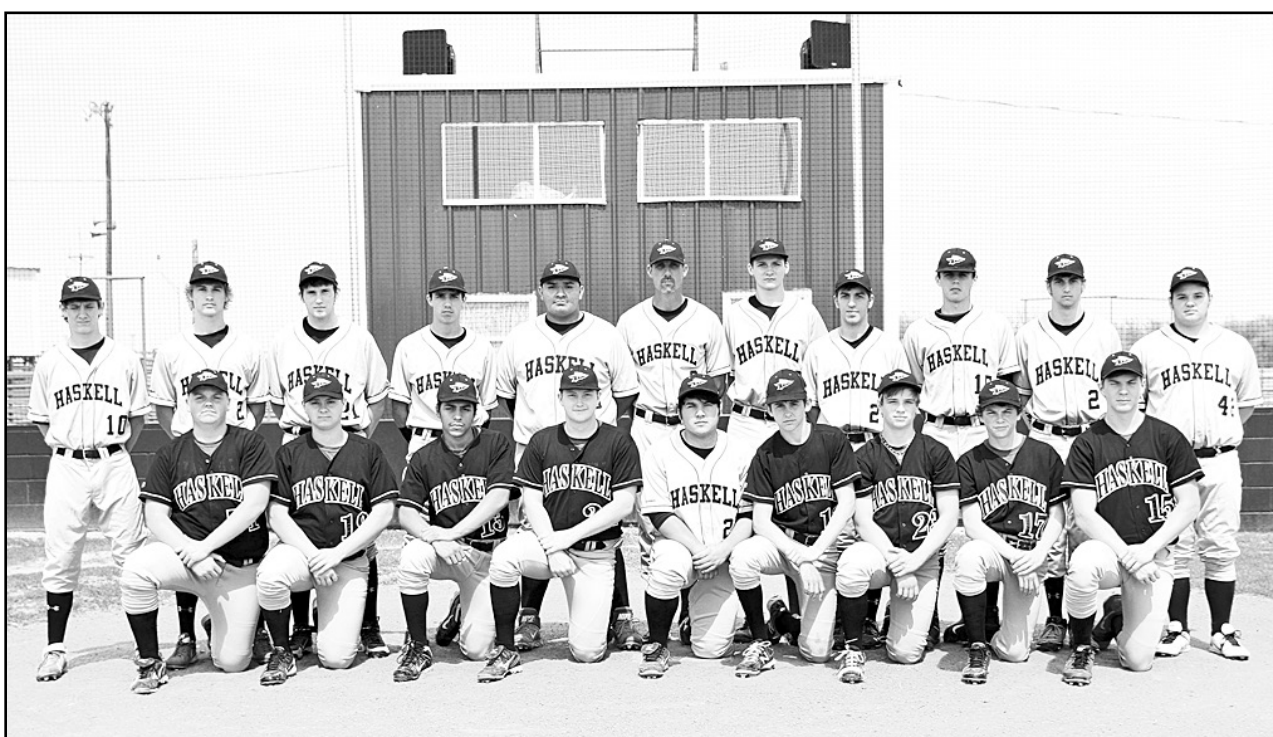

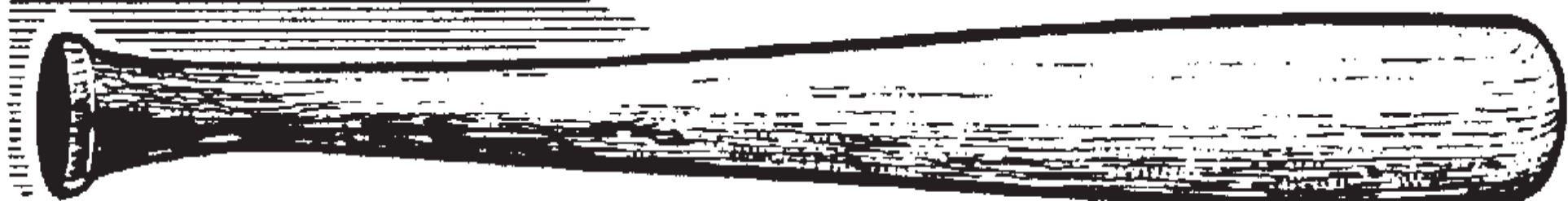

Richardson's holds 50th anniversary celebration

 It was a celebration befitting fifty years in business. Richardson's True Value held its Customer Appreciation Days this

past weekend with special attractions, giveaways and special deals. It was on February 29, 1964 that the official grand opening for Richardson

Truck and Tractor Company was held. A.C. Richardson began his career working for International Harvester Company in Hillsboro in 1959. Promotions with the company moved him to Dallas and Olney. Then in 1963, Richardson and E.L. Horton, who was the IHC dealer in Munday, entered into a gentlemen's agreement, which led to the start up of a dealership in Haskell, making the twenty-seven year old Richardson the youngest independent IHC dealer at the time.

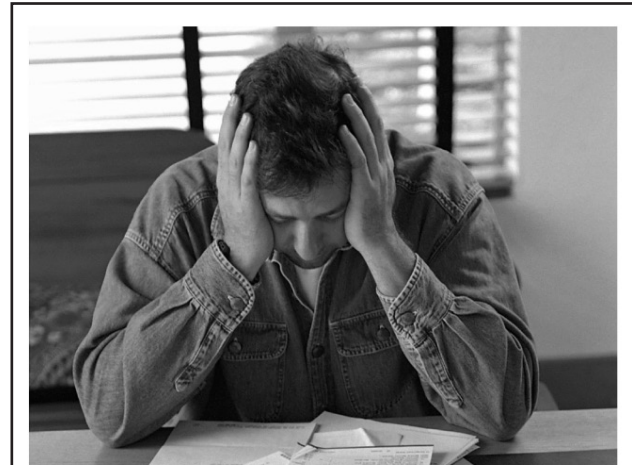

NOTICE OF ELECTION

In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 74, Subchapter D, and 4 Tex. Admin. Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter A, the Texas Department of Agriculture (the Department) will conduct a board election in the Rolling Plains Central Boll Weevil Eradication Zone, in order to select a representative of the above-referenced zone to serve on the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board of Directors. The board is charged with administering the boll weevil eradication program in Texas.

The Rolling Plains Central Boll Weevil Eradication Zone includes all of Knox, Baylor, Stone-wall, Haskell, Throckmorton, Young, Scurry, Fisher, Jones, Shackelford, Stephens, Palo Pinto, Mitchell, Nolan, Callahan, Eastland, Brown, Comanche, and Erath counties and portions of Taylor, Borden, and Archer counties.

The board election will be held by mail balloting. Ballots will be mailed to cotton growers by May 13, 2014. All ballots cast by mail must be postmarked no later than May 28, 2014, in order to be valid. Any cotton grower having planted cotton in the year 2013 within the zone defined above is eligible to vote, and, if he or she resides in the Rolling Plains Central Zone and has at least seven years experience as a cotton grower, can have his or her name placed on the ballot as a candidate in the board member election. A cotton grower is defined as a person who grows cotton intended to be commercial cotton. The term includes an individual who, as owner, landlord, tenant or sharecropper, is entitled to share in the cotton grown and available for marketing from the farm, or share in the proceeds from the sale of the cotton from the farm or from an indemnity or other payment received from or related to the planting, growing, or failure of the cotton.

Any person eligible to vote in the board member election that resides in the Rolling Plains Central Zone and meets the seven-year experience requirement may place their name in nomination for election to the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board by written application to the Department at the address provided below. Nomination forms are provided by the Department and must be signed by the nominee and at least ten other eligible voters. The nomination form must be received by the Department at its office located in Austin by April 28, 2014, and must provide the legal residence of the applicant. A nomination form may be obtained by contacting the Department office or any county agent located in the voting area.

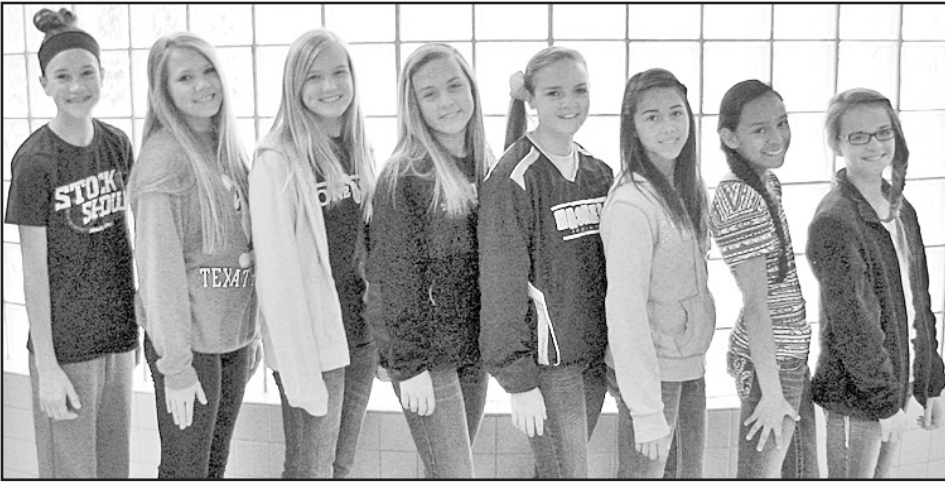

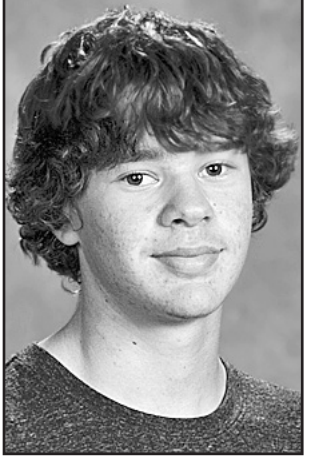

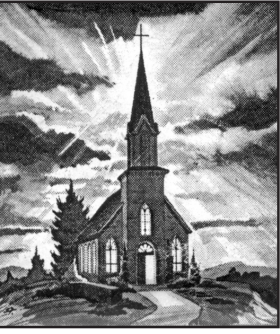

 The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the City of Rochester Water Department that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for Nitrate. The U.S. Environmental protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for Nitrate at 10 milligrams per liter (mg/L) based on a single sample, and has determined that it is a health concern at

levels above MCL. Analysis of drinking water in our community for Nitrate indicates a compliance value in first quarter 2014 of 12 mg/L for EP001.

Infants below the age of six months old who drink water containing Nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not an effective treatment for Nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women are unclear. If you are pregnant, you may also choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes.

We are taking the following action to address this issue:

Testing for Nitrate twice a week and blending more surface water with well water when needed to control Nitrate levels.

The City of Rochester has applied for and received a grant, from the Texas Department of Agriculture, for a Reverse Osmosis System to be installed. Reverse osmosis is most commonly known for its use in drinking water purification. This system should be up and running by summer of 2015.

Haskell Elementary School will have registration for Prekindergarten and Kindergarten for the 2014-2015 school year on the following dates:

Fri., April 18: 3 and 4 year old prekindergarten registration from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the elementary library.

Fri., May 9: Kindergarten registration and screening from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. or 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. in the elementary office.

To be eligible for enrollment in Prekindergarten, a child must be 3 or 4 years old on Sept. 1, 2014 and must be unable to speak and comprehend the English language; or qualify for free or reduced lunches; or be

homeless; or be the child of an active duty member of the United States; or be the child of a member of the armed forces of the United States who was injured or killed while serving on active duty; or has ever been in foster care. However, we are hoping to offer Prekindergarten for all 4 year olds. If you are interested in this program for your child, be sure to register Fri., April 18.

To attend Kindergarten, a child must be 5 years old on Sept. 1, 2014. Only students registering for Kindergarten who are not currently enrolled at Haskell Elementary need to attend registration with their parents.

PPCD (Preschool

Program for Children with Disabilities) is for children ages 3-5 that may be developmentally delayed in areas such as learning, speech and/or emotional skills. If your child turns 3 during the 2014-2015 school year, you may call the elementary office at 864-2654 at that time to schedule an appointment to have your child screened.

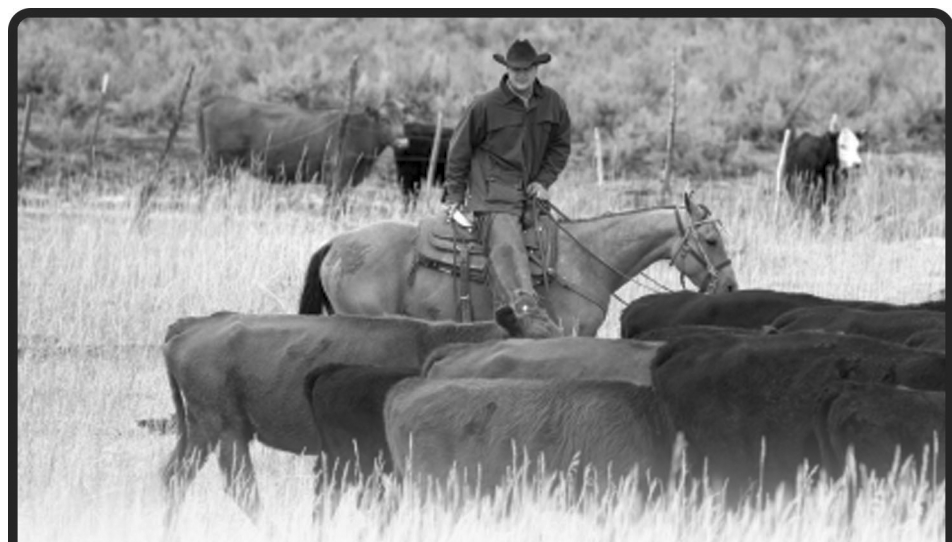
