**Legacies Left to Cats.**

About a century ago a Frenchman, Pierre Grosley, left £24 a year to his two cats, to be paid as long as either lived; but he was a lawyer, and his will proved valid. Ten or 12 years ago a poor woman in Paris left her property for charity after her cat Bis, a beautiful young Maltese, had been maintained till the end of his natural life. The amount was small that principal as well as interest would have to be used, and there was some close calculation, based on the average length of feline life, before the legacy was accepted. Had Bis possessed the traditional nine lives, it would assuredly have been declined, as the city would have incurred an obligation, without receiving any benefit. He died advanced in years, but there was still something left.

**"Mousepower."**

"We have horsepower, water power, candlepower; so why not mousepower?" reasoned a thrifty Scot, and straightway put his mice to work. He selected two promising young mice and set them up in business in a miniature tread mill, where they were to earn their board and keep by the manufacture of sewing silk. For more than a year the mice kept their little factory going on a day and night shift. The ingenious thread mill was so constructed that each mouse was enabled to twist, twine and reel on an average of from 100 to 200 threads a day. Women doing the same work were paid a penny a hank, consequently each mouse netted a saving of six shillings per annum for the owner of the tiny threadmill.

**Regrow Lost Parts.**

Newts and salamanders and the tadpoles of frogs and toads have great powers of regrowing parts that have been bitten off, but, so far as known, lizards are the only backboneed animals that show surrender of parts. Among backboneless animals it often occurs. This peculiarity is found among sea slugs and other molluscs and in many kinds of worms. In the Palolo worm, which burrows in the coral reefs, nearly the whole of the body is broken off at the breeding season, and it bursts in the water, liberating tens of thousands of germ cells, while the head remains in the rock and makes a new body.

**Stoves Once Unpopular.**

A hundred years ago stoves and fireplaces generally seemed to be the thing that gave decorators of houses the greatest concern.

"The stove," says a German writer, speaking of the house furnishings a hundred years ago, "was quite indispensable in a northern climate, but wherein the whole of antiquity was any reference to be found to a tiled stove? **GOOD THINGS.**

For those who enjoy a dainty gingerbread for an occasional tea or luncheon the following will be enjoyed:

**Fairy Gingerbread.**—Cream one cupful of butter, add two cupfuls of sugar and mix well; add gradually one cupful of milk in which three-fourths of a teaspoonful of soda is added, add four cupfuls of flour and one table-spoonful of ginger. Beat all together and spread very thinly on the bottom of a dropping pan. Bake quickly and, while hot, cut in squares; remove rapidly. It will crisp at once. One may add a sprinkling of nuts to the top before baking and cut in squares, rolling in the form of a cornucopia. Fill with cream, food or otherwise and have a home-made cream cone.

**Oatmeal Cakes.**—Cream one-half cupful of butter or lard and lard mixed with one-half cupful of sugar, add one-half cupful of milk in which one-fourth of a teaspoonful of soda has been dissolved. Brown a light brown one cupful of oatmeal then grind it through the meat grinder, add one cupful of flour, grated orange peel or nutmeg for flavoring. Drop by small spoonfuls on a baking sheet. Nuts and raisins may be added if desired.

**Indian Pudding.**—Scald two cupfuls of milk, add one cupful of boiling water and stir in two table-spoonfuls of corn meal mixed with a little cold water, add three teaspoonfuls of tapioca, a pinch of salt, a half cupful of raisins and one-half cupful of molasses. Bake slowly and serve with a sirup made from prune juice. Prunes may be used instead of raisins in the pudding.

**Endive as Greens.**—Take a dozen heads of endive, wash and drain and cook until tender. Serve well buttered with a dash of lemon juice, or a little hot bacon fat with pieces of crisp bacon and a little onion juice and vinegar.

**DAINTY DISHES FOR OCCASIONS**

The luncheon may be made the most interesting meal of the day and the cook who enjoys manipulating foods so that with small outlay appetizing dishes are made, is a real genius.

**Chicken With Golden Sauce.**—Arrange on a platter the choicest pieces of chicken (most of the white meat) in portions suitable for serving the chicken having been previously cooked until tender. Pile boiled rice around the edge of the platter and pour over all the following sauce:  
Melt four table-spoonfuls of butter and add the same amount of flour. Stir until smooth then add slowly one pint of chicken broth and cook until smooth and thick. Remove from the stove and add, stirring rapidly, the yolks of two eggs well beaten. Season with salt and pepper and a dash of cayenne. Sprinkle with a little chopped sweet red pepper.

**Chicken Terrapin.**—Melt three table-spoonfuls of butter, add two table-spoonfuls of flour, pepper and salt to taste, a few grains of cayenne and one cupful of hot milk. Cook in a double boiler a few minutes until smooth and thick. Add one and a half cupfuls of chicken, turkey or veal, cut in dice, the yolks of two hard-cooked eggs chopped fine, and the whites in larger pieces. Cook three minutes.

**Creamed Eggs With Asparagus.**—Cook until well done six eggs; cut in halves and place while hot on a hot platter. Prepare a rich white sauce, using four table-spoonfuls of flour and butter and seasoning with one pint of rich milk; cook until smooth and thick. Arrange hot cooked asparagus cut in short stalks around the eggs and pour the white sauce over the asparagus. Garnish with toast points and serve hot.

Clery cooked in three-inch stalks may be served in this dish in place of the asparagus.  
An scallioned fish, using asparagus, macaroni or celery with white sauce baked with a covering of buttered crumbs, makes a most tasty luncheon dish.

# RADIO

## VACUUM TUBE USED AS RADIO DETECTOR

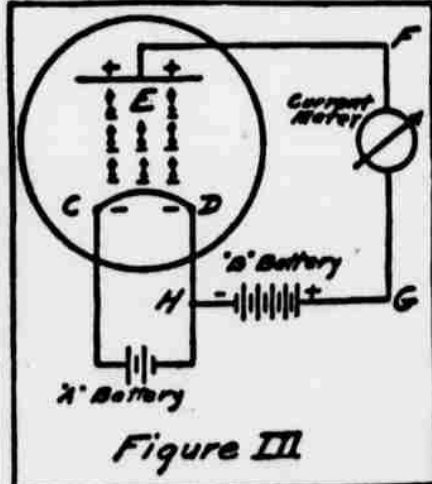
How This Device Depends on Emission and Control of Electrons for Its Operation.

Readers of the radio column are urged to clip each article and paste it in a file book. The articles printed are continuous and the entire series will be valuable for reference.

The greatest advances made in the past few years in the radio art have been due in one way or another to the use of vacuum tubes. In view of this fact a more careful consideration of them will be of interest.

All of these tubes, known by a variety of names, such as radiotron, audion, seriotron (trade names of the manufacturer) depend upon the same fundamental principles for their operation. For the sake of simplicity of brevity these will be referred to in this column simply as vacuum tubes. A vacuum tube can be made to function as a detector, as an amplifier, or as an oscillator.

The vacuum tube depends on the emission and control of electrons for its operation. The electron is the smallest subdivision of matter which mankind recognizes and it carries the smallest known charge of negative electricity. For years previous to electron research it had been held by scientists that matter was built up of distinct particles or units which they called atoms and molecules. At first the molecule was assumed to be the smallest quantity of matter that could have a separate existence or take part in chemical action, but more vigorous research pointed to the fact that the molecule is made up of still smaller elements which are termed atoms; that is, a molecule may be composed of several atoms. Then for a time it was assumed that the atom was the very smallest quantity of an element that could exist, but later researches have revealed that atoms may be further subdivided into particles



called electrons. The apparent mass of an electron is about one-eighteenth-hundredth part of that of an atom of hydrogen which is the smallest of the chemical atoms.

According to the electron theory an atom consists of a definite number of electrons grouped around a nucleus having a positive charge and so long as none of the component electrons are driven from the atom, the latter possess no detectable charge. The positive charge on the nucleus is said to be exactly neutralized by the negative charges on the electrons grouped about it.

Suppose now that by some means an electron can be detached from the atom. Then the atom becomes what is known as a positive ion and it exhibits the properties of a positively charged body, or in other words since an electron which carries a negative charge has been removed from the atom which has equal positive and negative charges, the portion of the atom now remaining has a deficiency of negative charge and acts like any positively charged body.

On the other hand if some force can be brought to bear that will add an electron to a normal atom which is neutral as far as electrical charges are measured, the result will be a negative ion, which will possess all the properties of a negatively charged body. An atom then which has a deficiency of electrons is called a positive ion and one having excess of electrons is called a negative ion.

Since each electron carries a negative charge of electricity an electron represents a certain quantity of electricity. Forcing electrons to move from one point to another causes electricity to flow. The ability of any medium to conduct electricity or allow a current to flow through it depends upon the number of free electrons available as carriers of charges.

It has been known for many years that the space surrounding a piece of heated metal is a conductor of electricity. It has been demonstrated more recently that this is due to the release of electrons and that if an incandescent metal be placed in a bulb exhausted of all gases, pure electrons will be liberated from the incandescent metal.

In a vacuum tube such as we are using at the present time, the piece of metal used to furnish the electrons is called the filament and is usually made of tungsten and sometimes is coated with oxides to increase the electron emission. For convenience the filament of a vacuum tube is heat-

ed by a battery current and it is this heat furnished by the battery current that constitutes the force that disrupts the atoms of the filament and liberates electrons.

Fig. III is a spherical glass bulb from which all the air and gases have been exhausted and having mounted in it a filament C-D which can be heated to incandescence by the "A" battery connected to it, and the metallic plate E. When the filament C-D is heated to incandescence by the "A" battery connected across its terminals electrons are emitted. Connecting the cold plate E to the incandescent filament C-D by means of the circuit E-F-G-H which includes a current meter and a "B" battery, with its negative side connected to the filament lead at H and its positive side connected through the current meter, the plate becomes electrically positive with respect to the filament.

Since like charges repel and unlike charges attract, there will be a movement of electrons from the filament to the positively charged plate, and the current meter will show a deflection which indicates that a current is flowing in the circuit E-F-G-H.

Increasing the "B" battery voltage causes an increase in the current flowing in the circuit E-F-G-H, the plate circuit, until the positive charge on the plate E is so strong that all of the electrons given off by the filament are attracted to it. Assuming that the temperature of the filament is kept constant and that the plate voltage has been increased to the point where all of the electrons given off by the filament are attracted to it, any further increase in the "B" battery voltage will not cause any increase in the current in the plate circuit.

Increasing the temperature of the filament will increase the total number of the electrons emitted.

### Big Ships' Radio.

The radio equipment of the ships Paris and Lafayette is described in a recent issue of Radioelectricity. On both steamers a five-kilowatt tube transmitter has been installed with a wave range of between 2,000 and 9,000 meters. A five-kilowatt motor-generator set is used to produce the plate-high tension for four rectifying and four oscillatory tubes, and the low voltage current for the heating of the filament of these tubes. Both vessels are equipped with a radio range-finder, or "radio goniometer," which, reduced to plain English, means a radio compass. A distance of 3,400 kilometers has been covered safely by messages sent from the transmitter of the Paris.

### Radio for Animal Training.

Experiments with the radiophone as an aid in animal training are to be made at the Hippodrome, New York city, by George Power, trainer of the elephants, to determine whether it will be possible for his big pets at some future date to execute his orders on the stage while the trainer himself is absent.

### Professor Bell a Radio Fan.

Finding the telephone, his own invention, a source of annoyance to him, Alexander Graham Bell had it removed from his home. With the radiophone there is a difference. It seems, for Mr. Bell, now seventy-five years old, is said never to tire of "listening in" and experimenting with the new device. There are few more ardent enthusiasts, declare his friends.

### RADIO DON'TS

Don't expect the circuit to oscillate with equal strength over a great range if you tune the grid circuit with capacity alone. Keep the ratio of L to C as near constant as possible while tuning.

Don't expect a circuit to oscillate if the natural period of the tickler circuit is equal to the natural period of the grid circuit.

Don't place the tickler or plate variometer tight against the grid coil or a change in the plate circuit will detune the grid circuit.

Don't expect high impedance tubes to oscillate freely in a circuit designed for low impedance tubes.

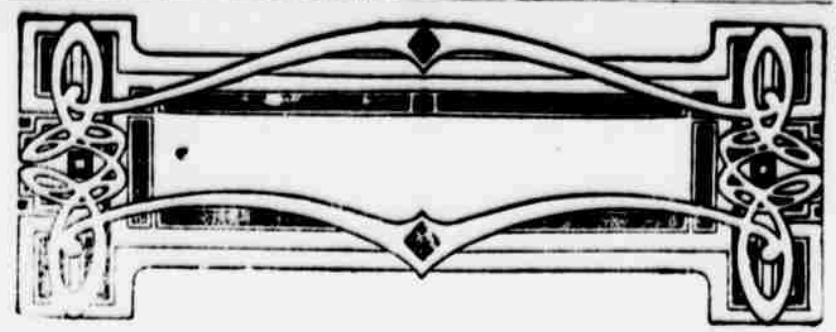
Don't discard a regenerative receiver until you have tried more than one detector tube.

Don't forget that a soft gaseous tube is the best detector, and that a hard tube is the best oscillator.

Don't treat inductance coils with shellac or any other varnish or compound that will absorb moisture.

### Battery Locomotives.

In times of labor shortage and abnormal demand for fuel mine operators turn of necessity to electrification as the only way of increasing their output, at the same time alleviating the labor situation, at times so serious. The storage battery locomotive for mine haulage offers the very great advantage that it may be used without the dangers of trolleys and the necessity of installing the trolley and educating the miners in the dangers. The storage battery locomotive, being self-contained, may be put to work directly it reaches the mine. Moreover, by charging the batteries at night, which is about the only time they may be charged unless battery exchange is in vogue, overloaded stations are able to be relieved, rates of energy are lowered and the load factor increased.

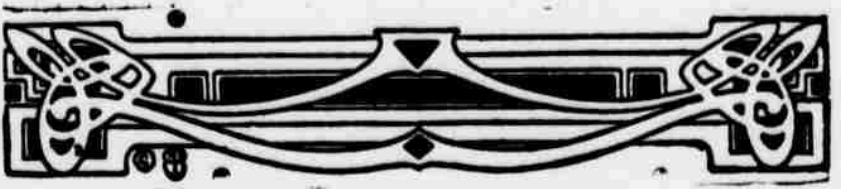
