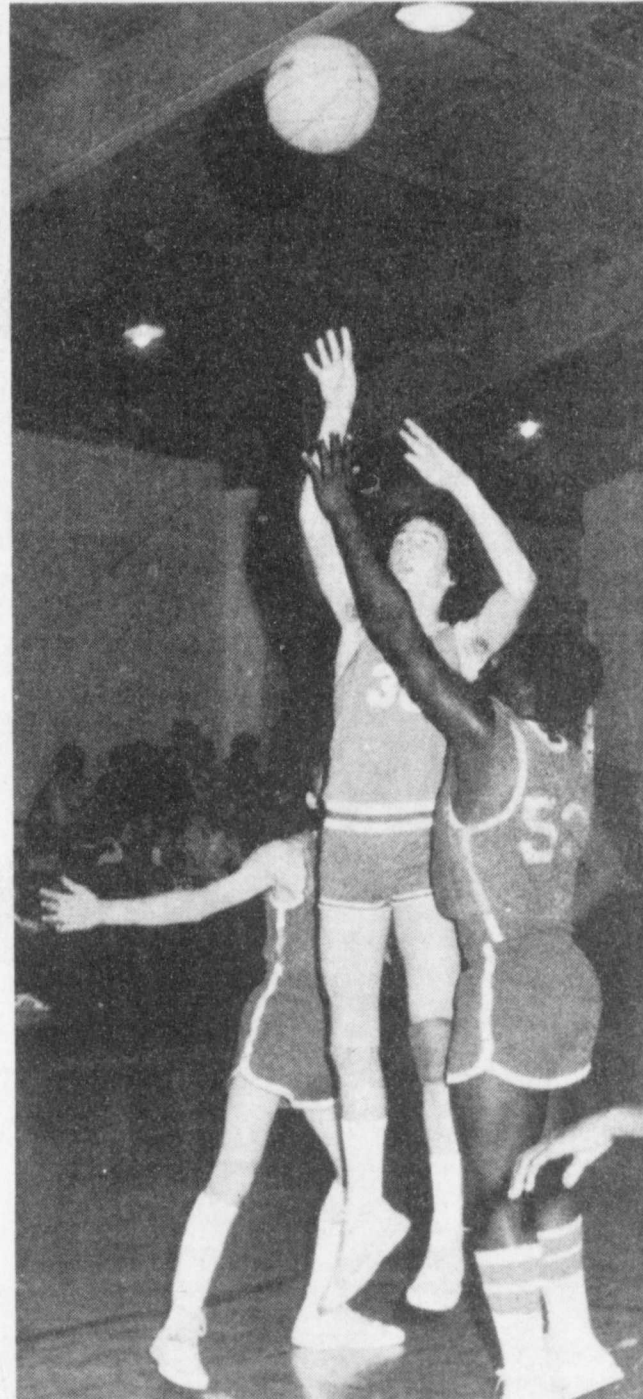
Coach Phillip Holt of Winnsboro was named Coach of the year, and Freddie Howard of Winnsboro was elected Sophomore of the Year.

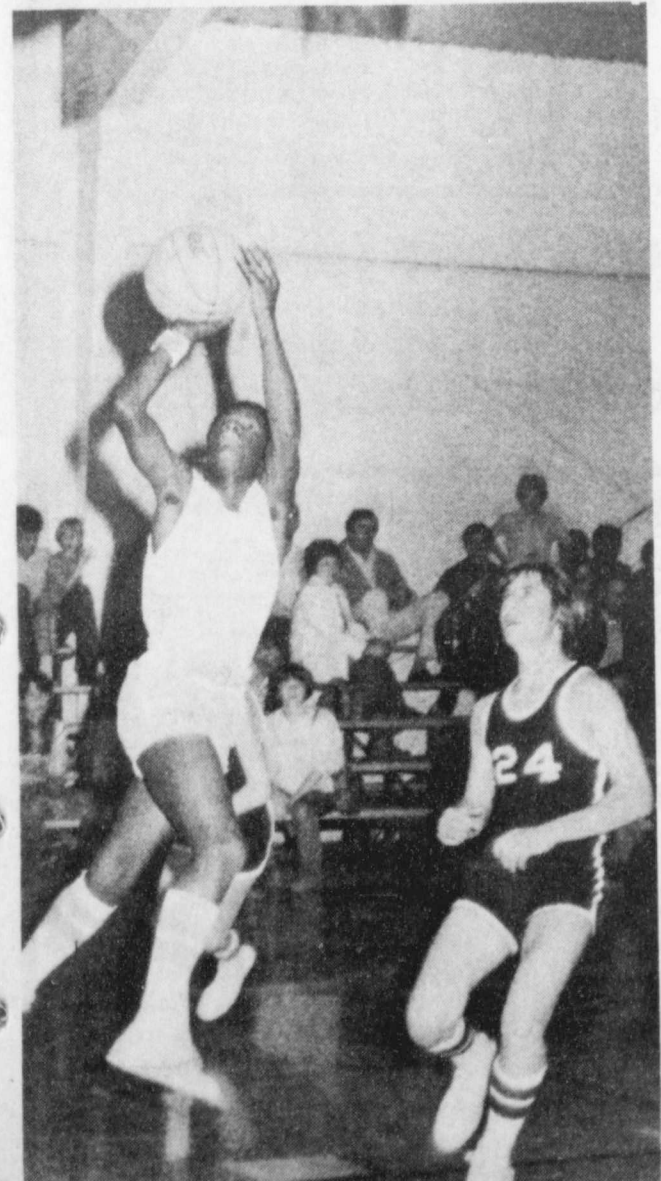

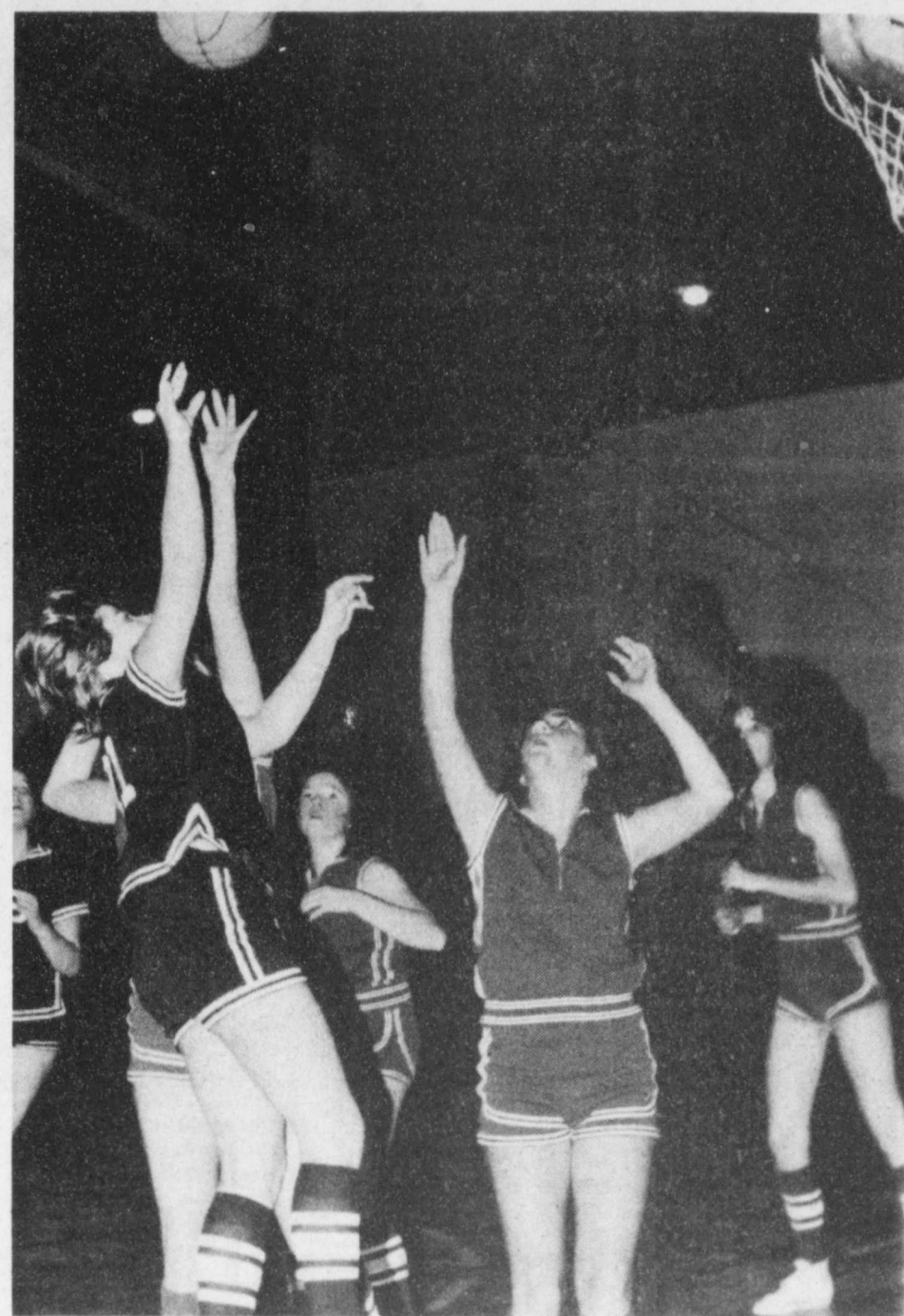

**Terrell State Hospital Is Seeking Volunteers For Christmas Gifts**

The Volunteer Council for Terrell State Hospital is seeking interested individuals and organizations to help volunteers at Terrell State Hospital provide Christmas gifts for the 850 patients.

Mrs. Clarice Lewis, chairperson of the Volunteer Council for the hospital, announced the need for help in providing new gifts or money with which to purchase new gifts. "Our hospital serves 21 Northeast Texas Counties and many of the patients have no one to remember them at Christmas but volunteers."

In the past the Volunteer Council has provided the wanted and needed articles for our hundreds of patients with the assistance of friends, church and Sunday school groups, social clubs, merchants, civic clubs, schools and many other organizations.

Early in November a list is sent to each of the wards asking the patients their gift preferences. Every effort is made to pack each gift box as individually as possible. "When a mentally ill person is hospitalized, they are often without anyone to provide items for personal care. It is sometimes surprising to many people that the 'wishes' on these lists are for simple things which most of us take for granted as necessities," Mrs. Lewis reported.

The following gifts are those listed as most needed. Volunteers will welcome help with even the smallest quantities of deodorant, ladies' and mens' combs, hair brushes, nail care sets, shampoo, small mirrors, hair rollers, make-up, bath soaps, hair cream, cologne, after shave lotion, cleansing tissue, hand and body lotions and body powder.

Baby powder and baby lotions are particularly helpful for the comfort of the elderly patients according to a hospital nursing spokesman.

There is always a great demand for new Christmas cards, especially those with postage stamps for the patients to send to friends. Cigarettes, soft candies and instant coffee are items that patients express a desire to receive. Many do not enjoy these extras except at Christmas time.

Wearing apparel which was hoped for included such items as head scarves and wool gloves to protect women from the cold wet weather, men's work gloves, panty hose for women, socks, handkerchiefs and belts for men. Men's and women's underwear are among the needed items included in the list of wishes.

"Although good used clothing and shoes are welcome at the Volunteer Center all year for our patients, at Christmas time

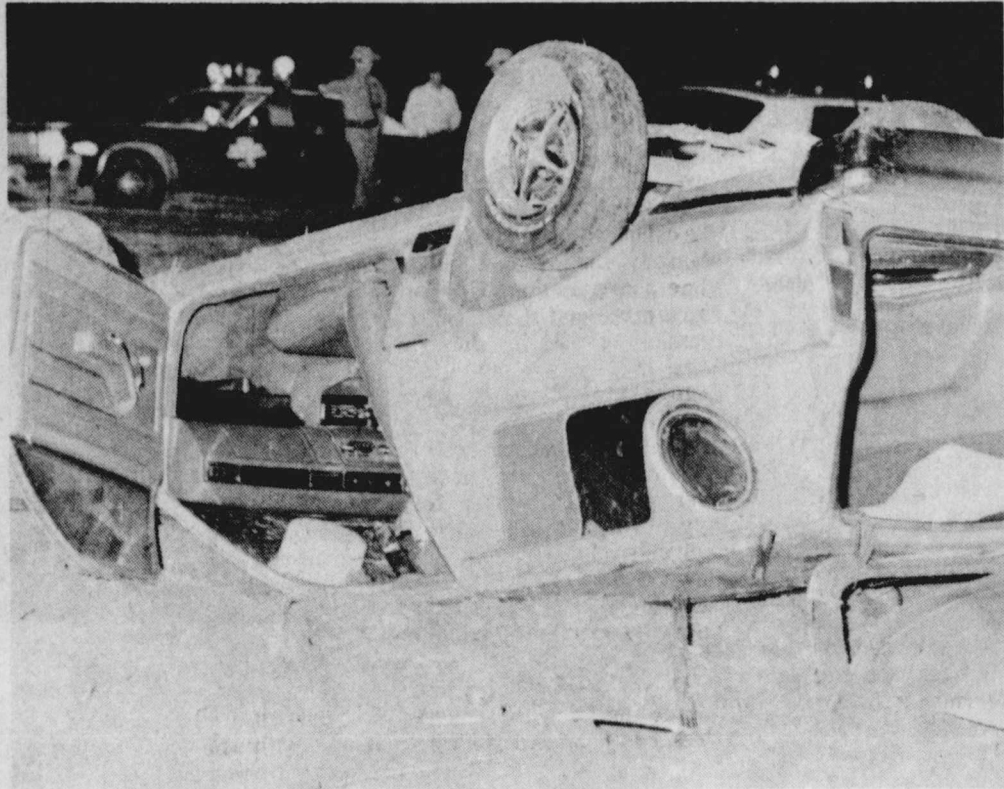

**Christmas Decorating Ideas**

Special Christmas greeting begins at the front door. With a little extra time and a smidgen of imagination, even a simple doorway can pronounce a warm welcome with expressive creativity. For example, let a wreath or arrangement express nature by using such items as pine cones, shells, sand dollars, or cactus skeletons. Or small, cleverly arranged accessories from the kitchen will express a gourmet meal theme. Wooden spoons or small copper molds held together with copper wire will alert a visitor to "goodies" inside. Also, consider these special door greetings: Attach miniature God's Eyes (ojos de Dios) to wreath forms with toothpicks and metallic thread. Wrap apples, oranges, or other fruit in plastic and attach them with bright red ribbons. Small wooden ornaments, tiny mirrors, or other small items can spruce up any store bought wreath. Consider children's toys, also. Use dried articles such as flowers and corn with a bow for a harvest season look. As an added bonus, use small wreaths on tables as rings around candles throughout the holidays.

## Public Notice

Legal Notice To Families Who Lived In Public Housing Projects Operated By The Deport Housing Authority Or Lived In Public Housing Projects In Any Other City Between March 16, 1971, September 26, 1975. If you rented a house or apartment from the Deport or any other Public Housing Agency (PHA) during the period between March 16, 1971, and September 26, 1975, you may be eligible to file a claim for a refund of part of your rent during that period if: 1. The wife or husband of the head of the household was present and dependent upon the head of the household for support and or; 2. a dependent member of your family household was employed.

If you believe your family falls within one of the categories described above, you may wish to continue reading this Notice in order to determine how and under what circumstances you may file a claim. On July 7, 1978, the District Court of the District of Columbia entered a Stipulated Order providing that the definition of family income for purposes of computing maximum rentals for public housing, as contained in HUD Circular, which excluded spouses from the \$300 deduction for each dependent, and excluded dependents from the \$300 deduction for each secondary wage earner, was invalid and violated the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended. The effect of this determination is that certain families who lived in public housing during the period from March 16, 1971, to September 26, 1975, may have been charged too much rent. Therefore, the District Court ordered HUD to establish a one million dollar fund for the payment of claims which current or former tenants of public housing may submit for a refund of any overpayments.

The District Court's Stipulated Order provides that, if valid claims exceed one million dollars, HUD has the option of having the Order dissolved in which case HUD and PHA may negotiate a modified settlement and proceed with further litigation. Thus, claimants should realize that the submission of a claim determined valid by PHA may result in full, partial, or no payment, depending on the total amount of valid claims submitted to HUD, or the final outcome of any further litigation. Any person wishing to receive a copy of the Stipulated Order or a claim form may do so by making their request known to a local PHA.

Individuals wishing to submit a claim must file the claim form made as part of this Notice and must submit it to the Public Housing Agency's address indicated on the claim form, or such other appropriate Public Housing Agency if different from the address indicated, within 120 days from December 5, 1978. No claims will be accepted after the end of the 120 day period, April 5, 1979.

Information provided by the claimant on the claim form must be specific as to the time period between March 16, 1971, and September 26, 1975, for which the wife or husband of the head of the household was present and was a dependent and or a dependent in the household and was employed.

The Pattonville Water Supply Corp. has been notified by the Texas Department of Health that the water being supplied by our system exceeds the maximum constituent level for Fluoride established by the Department's "Drinking Water Standards" which were promulgated as required by the "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 93-523 (U.S.).

The limit for this area has been set at 1.6 milligrams of Fluoride per liter of water. The samples of water from our system contained 3.8 milligrams of Fluoride per liter. There is no immediate health hazard for drinking water containing Fluoride at this level.

The Fluoride may cause mottling (brown staining) of the teeth in children under 14 years of age. All dentists in this area are aware of the Fluoride level.

The Pattonville Water Supply Corp. is investigating available treatment techniques to lower the Fluoride to allowable levels.

**Bacteriological Standard Exceeded**  
Dear Customer:  
The Pattonville Water Supply Corp. collected six bacteriological samples during the month of July, August and September. The results of the coliform bacteriological samples exceeded the Texas Department of Health's "Drinking Water Standards," which were promulgated as required by the "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 93-523. Drinking water containing coliform bacteria in excess of the standard may constitute a potential threat to public health. Your water system has collected additional check samples as required by the "Drinking Water Standards." Only the samples collected September 25 showed presence of coliform.

Coliform organisms are common to the intestinal tract of man and animals. Their presence in water is an indicator of bacteriological contamination of the sample either from the water system or from a sampling error.

Increased monitoring (check samples) and customer notification of the public when the standards are exceeded are required by law as a means of keeping the public informed. Pattonville Water Supply Corp. C.A. Sparks, President

### Mrs. Florence King

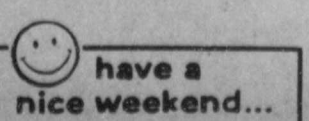
