

IRS Suspends

The Internal Revenue announced that it has temporarily suspended the requirement that employers provide copies of Form W-2, Wage and Tax Statement, to employees within 30 days after payment of final wages when employment is terminated. The temporary suspension applies only to wages paid during 1979.

The IRS said it took this action because the printing of the 1979 W-2 form has been delayed. Publication of the Revenue Procedure substitute Forms W-2 for 1979 will be delayed also.
