active in basketball, track, elected to the all-district football team, and received

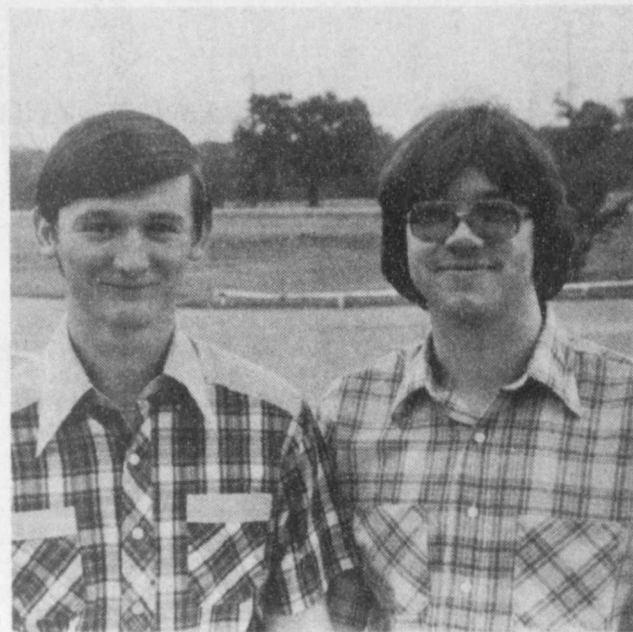
the DAR Good Citizenship award. Smith is the son of Mr. and

Neil Mankins was named the outstanding tractor mechanics student, Johnny Puckett the outstanding co-student, and Terry chran the outstanding meat processing student.

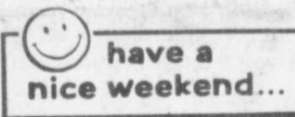

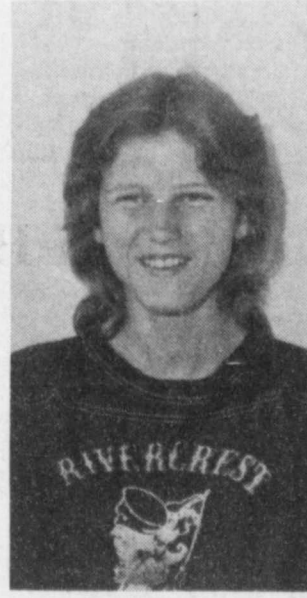

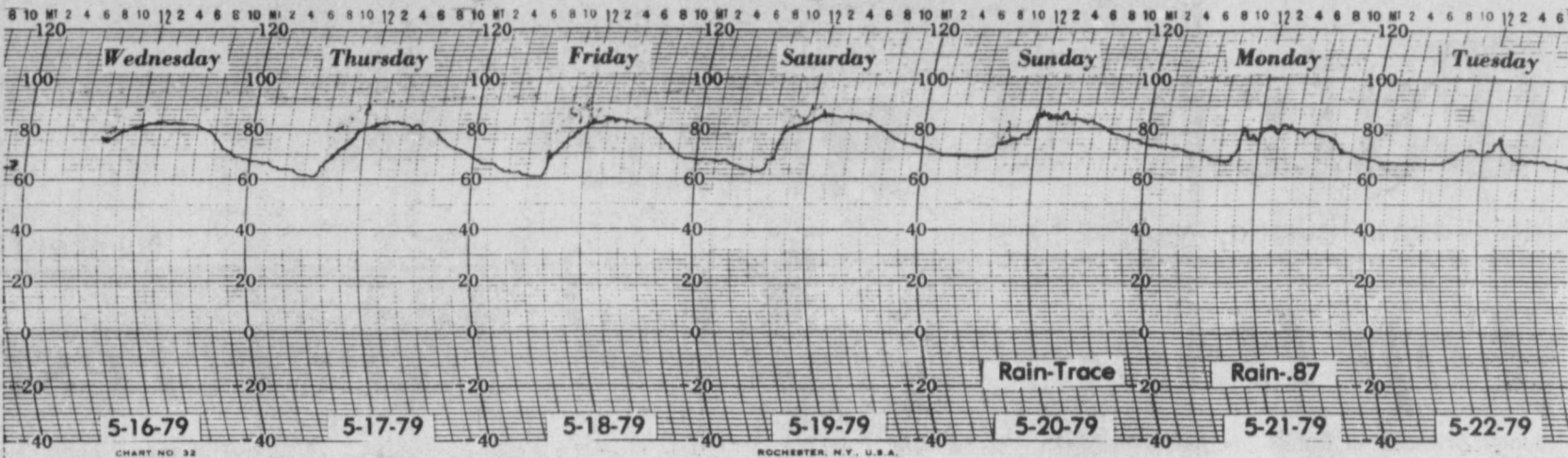

**Watch Out, Spring Is Termite Swarming Season**

Spring is the time when many homeowners discover they have termites. This is the time when winged forms appear and swarm. If winged termites are seen outdoors, usually there is no problem, since this is a natural occurrence. But if they are found indoors, usually on a window sill, chances are good that an infestation has established in your home, points out Bob Moody, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University. Termites can cause extensive damage to wooden parts of your home, so take some precautions, advises Moody. Quite often termites and

certain ants swarm at the same time and it's important to be able to tell the difference between these two insects. Carpenter ants swarm in the springtime and can cause some structural damage to wood. However, termites are much more destructive and require different control measures. Termites have a broad waist-ants have a narrow, constricted waist; termite wings are the same size and shape-winged ants have a front and back pair of wings of different lengths and shape; termites have straight antennae (feelers on their heads)-ants have elbowed antennae. Termites may be attracted to your house by dead tree

limbs, stumps, old lumber and other sources of termite food. These should be removed. If soil is above the point where wood or brick meets the foundation, termites have easy access to your home. Anywhere that wood meets dirt (siding, wooden steps) is a potential spot for termite entry into your home. Termites also have the ability to build mud tunnels over non-wooden structures to reach a food source, explains Moody. These tunnels (about 1/2-inch wide) may extend several feet up concrete surfaces. On a slab home, these may be seen on foundation concrete between soil and brick. On homes built above the ground, these

tunnels can be found on piers or pipes that go from soil to structure. The bath trap in homes built on a slab is another source of entry. Plumbing in this situation has contact with soil under the slab, and termite tunnels may be found in this area. Although a thorough inspection is best done by a professional, a homeowner can make a quick check for termite infestations. If termites or damage is found, contact a local pest control company. This is one insect pest that should not be handled by a "do-it-yourselfer," emphasizes Moody. Commercial pest control companies have the necessary equipment and

**Protection Against Cancer Cells Confirmed**

Existence in humans of "sentry genes" that are nature's protection against cancer cells has been confirmed at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School here. Dr. Donald J. Capra, Professor Microbiology, said in an interview that the preliminary evidence has been gathered "in mice and men" to show that a special group of genes control immunity to cancer. His research was supported by an American Cancer Society

grant. Dr. Capra said his colleagues and other researchers now believe that a "fault or deficiency" in a particular group of recognition genes is responsible for failure of the body to fight off the disease or prevent cancer from starting. Recent research in this area, he said, indicates that the "sentry genes" are located in the "1 region" of the 16th chromosome in man and the 17th chromosome in

**Herd Management Important**

Rancher cooperation in herd management practices still holds the key to success in the screwworm eradication program for Texas this spring, reminds Bob Moody, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texas A&M University System. Recent widespread rains over much of the state-and warmer spring temperatures-could provide an ideal environment for the spread of screwworm cases, he reminds. To date in 1979, six screwworm cases have been confirmed at the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Screwworm Laboratory, While Hidalgo and Starr Counties-in the Rio Grande Valley-each have one confirmed case, individual cases have also been confirmed in Jim Wells and Kinney Counties, situated much to the west of the traditional problem areas. Medina County recorded its second case on April 23, with both cases originating in navels of new-born calves. Last year, Medina County did not record its first case until July, records show. Moody said that the USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service field staff, along with field testing units of the Texas Animal Health Commission, are conducting trapping activities to determine location and movement of native fertile wild flies and sterile female flies, in an effort to monitor potential problem areas. Livestock producers, Moody reminded, can still aid the screwworm eradication program by continuing the "basic three" practices of examining their herds on a regular basis, collecting samples of any larvae found in wounds and sending the samples to the Mission Lab for identification; and treating the wound to reduce host sites for the screwworm fly.

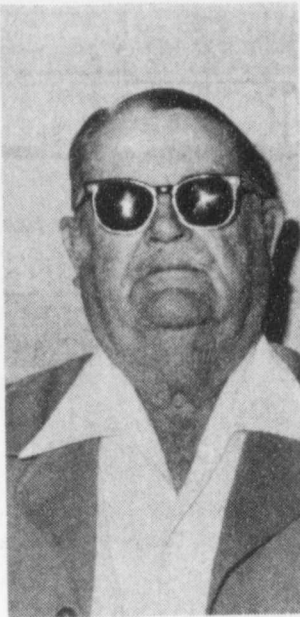
