



Lymphocytes (cells active in the immune process) from human spleen tissues are from similar mouse cells are studied being simultaneously. The mouse cells are more dependable for genetic experiments because they are derived from highly inbred strains while human cells are always from a mixed an-

Molecules which stimulate the special cancer immunity are extracted from the spleen cells to discover their structure and function. They are also used to make "antisera" which could either block or enhance their ac-

The next step and one that might be decisive in solving the cancer problem is to identify the flaws that occur in the special group of anticancer genes.

The door is now open to that possibility, and as Dr. Capra put it, "Science is now sitting in the front row with great expectations, as the curtain is about to go up."

Herd Management **Important**


Rancher cooperation in herd management practices still holds the key to success screwworm eradication program for Texas this spring, reminds Bob Moody, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texa A&M University System.

Recent widespread rains over much of the state-and warmer spring temperatures-could provide an ideal environment for the spread of screwworm cases, he reminds.


To date in 1979, six screwworm cases have been confirmed at the U.S. Department of Agriculture Screwworm Laboratory While Hidalgo and Starr Counties--in the Rio Grande Valley--each have one confirmed case, individual cases have also been confirmed in Jim Wells and Kinney Counties, situated much to the west of the traditional problem areas. Medina County recorded its second case on April 23, will both cases originating in navels of new-born calves. Last year, Medina County did not record its first case

until July, records show. Moody said that the USDA's Animal and Plant tually - and is now. This is Health Inspection Service a filling and delectable field staff, along with field testing units of the Texas Animal Health Commission, are conducting trappin activities to determine location and movement of native fertile wild flies and sterile female flies, in an effort to monitor potential problem areas.

Livestock producers, Moody reminded, can still aid the screwworm eradication program by continuing the "basic three" practices of examining their herds on a regular basis, collecting samples of any larvae found in wounds and sending the samples to the Mission Lab for identification; and treating the wound to reduce host sites for the screwworm fly.
