Rodeo Queen Contest Kicks Off

Shooting Leaves Bogata Woman In Poor Condition

A Tuesday morning shooting left a Bogata woman in poor but stable condition at St. Joseph's Hospital in Paris and a Bogata man under arrest for attempted murder as Red River Sheriff's Deputies continue their investigation into a somewhat puzzling case.

Dorothy Clark, a white female, was hit once with a small caliber bullet which apparently struck her in the arm and then entered her body at around 10 a.m. Tuesday, May 22.

Joe Parks, a 77 year old white male, and a Bogata

resident, were apprehended by Red River County law enforcement officers shortly thereafter.

Parks was arrested for attempted murder, and arraigned by J.C. Watson, Precinct 2, Bogata, with bond set at \$10,000.

The shooting occurred at

S. Bryson Street in Bogata, and Parks apparently fired at least two shots from the middle of the road.

Parks remains in custody at the Red River County Jail in Clarksville at this time, and the incident continues to be under investigation, with no definite motive for the shooting established.
