

Few Surprises But Heavy Election Turnout

There was heavy voter turnout, but few surprises in the presidential elections held locally Tuesday, November 6.

In Bogata, the Reagan Bush ticket pulled 376 votes, and Mondale-Ferraro 236. Phil Gramm received 317, Lloyd Doggett 282 in the bid for

the U.S. Senate seat vacated by retiring John Tower.

A total number of 612 votes were cast in Bogata. Red River County echoed the votes cast in Bogata, and the democrats took all other contested races.

In Talco a total of 422 votes were cast, 225 for the Reagan-Bush ticket and 181 for Mondale-Ferraro.

Johnstown box cast 98 votes, Reagan-Bush receiving 52 and Mondale-Ferraro 39.

In Talco Phil Gramm drew 181 and Lloyd Doggett 211. Titus County had two contested local races. June Roach easily defeated her challenger for the Titus County Tax Assessor-collector position. In Talco she

received 96 votes.

J.W. Terrell defeated write-in candidate Ronnie Logan, but Talco voted in favor of Logan 214 to 164 in the bid for Commissioner, Precinct 3.

Six of the eight Texas amendment propositions seem to be passed, the two being voted down being

Proposition 6, which would have allowed public subdivisions such as cities or school districts to buy insurance from mutual insurance companies, and Proposition 8, which would have increased the daily allowance paid to state legislators.

Both Red River County and Titus County followed the state trend, and

overwhelmingly voted against these two amendments, while easily passing the other six, such as the college funding amendment.

There were no contested races for sheriff, judge, or other major county offices in either county.

Rivercrest Rebels Lose To New Diana

The Rivercrest Rebels dropped their road game to New Diana 13-0. The field was muddy but there was no rain.

The first quarter was a defensive battle for both squads. Neither team could put together an offensive threat.

With 9:51 on the clock in the second quarter, the Eagles attempted a field goal, and failed. The Eagles threatened again with a score but Rebel Shane Wright stopped the drive with an interception on the Eagle 20 with 37 seconds remaining in the half. The halftime score was 0-0.

The third quarter was much like the first with the defensive squads from both sides really getting a workout. Neither offense got the the 25-yard line.

In the fourth quarter, the Eagles took the ball in from the Reb 3 yardline for six points. Their pass for the conversion was incomplete. The Eagles led 6-0. New Diana's quick linebackers kept blitzing and stopped the Rebels from getting points on the board. The Eagles scored again with 3:36 remaining in the game. They carried in from the four for the TD. The extra point was good for a score

of 13-0.

The Rebels tried to get out of the hole with their passing game but couldn't connect. New Diana won the game.

Coach Terry Giddens commented, "We played about the best three defensive quarters we have played all year. We played a good fourth quarter, but fatigue set in and we were not physically strong enough to hold them. Our offense had problems with New Diana's quick linebackers. They blitzed too much. We couldn't hold everyone. New Diana is probably the quickest team we have played all year."

The Rebels made 13 first downs and rushed for 90 yards. They completed one of five passes for nine yards. There was one interception. The Rebs had a total of 99 yards. They fumbled once and were penalized for 20 yards. The Rebels punted seven times for 332 yards.

The Eagles made 27 first downs and rushed for 211 yards. They completed three of 11 passes for 53 yards. There was one interception. They were penalized for five yards and punted four times for 151 yards.

Rivercrest travels to Ore City Friday night for their final district game of the season. Game time is at 7:30 p.m.

Red River Ambulance Service Clarifies Membership Applications

It has come to the attention of the Board of Directors and staff of Red River Ambulance Service, Inc. that there is a great deal of confusion regarding membership renewal for the residents of the Bogata area.

We have mailed reminder notices advising that it is time to renew if your membership has expired or will expire on November 30, 1984.

We understand that Boles Ambulance Service is also mailing a membership notice to the residents of the Bogata area. Boles states that if you were a member last year, they hope you will renew again this year. We believe this is where the confusion lies.

Red River Ambulance Service, Inc. is the only ambulance service you could have had a membership to last year, unless you joined Boles Ambulance Service in or after July, 1984.

Please remember that Red River Ambulance Service, Inc. is a non-profit organization governed by 15 Red River County residents (three from the Bogata area). We will begin our sixth year of service to Red River County on December 1, 1984, and hope that all the residents of the county will continue to support the

ambulance service that provides service to the entire county. Red River Ambulance Service has a full time staff of 3 EMT-Paramedics, 1 EMT-Special Skills and 1 EMT-Basic. We have three ambulances that are well equipped and professionally staffed.

On or after January 1, 1985, the attendant certification as outlined in the Emergency Medical Services Act of 1983 will require that all ambulance units in operation must be staffed by at least 2 Emergency Care Attendants. First Aid and American Red Cross Certifications will not qualify under the new law. Any ambulance unit not meeting this requirement will be operating in violation of the Emergency Medical Services Act of 1983. Red River Ambulance Service ambulances, equipment and attendants already far exceed these upcoming requirements.

We hope this information will be helpful to you when you are deciding which ambulance service you wish to support.

We want all the residents of Red River County to know that Red River Ambulance Service, Inc. cares about you. When you need us, please call. We are here to serve you.

Effective Date On Bangs Vaccination Is November 5

November 5 was the effective date for the new bangs vaccination regulation. If you still have questions on the new proposal, give us a call. Many individuals in the area plant a row on two of sweet potatoes each year and are presently facing a problem of digging their crop in muddy conditions. This condition reminds me of the fall when I was nine years old and my dad had 75 acres of yams and it was about as muddy as it is this fall.

This year's potatoes will have a higher moisture content and could require more time to cure. Under normal conditions, yams are cured for seven to 14 days at 85 degrees and high humidity. Maintain these conditions until you are certain the skin is well cured.

While on the subject of sweet potatoes, there is a new variety that will be available in the future by the name of "Regal." According to available information, Regal has yielded very good and has excellent baking flavor. It has a brilliant purplish-red skin which retains an attractive dark red color in storage. It is questionable that it is an improvement over the Jewell variety. "Topaz" is another new variety that was released this year. It has a copper skin, brilliant orange flesh and excellent yields and quality.

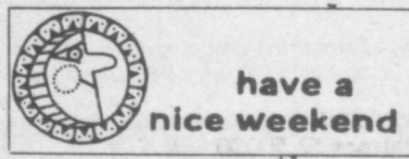

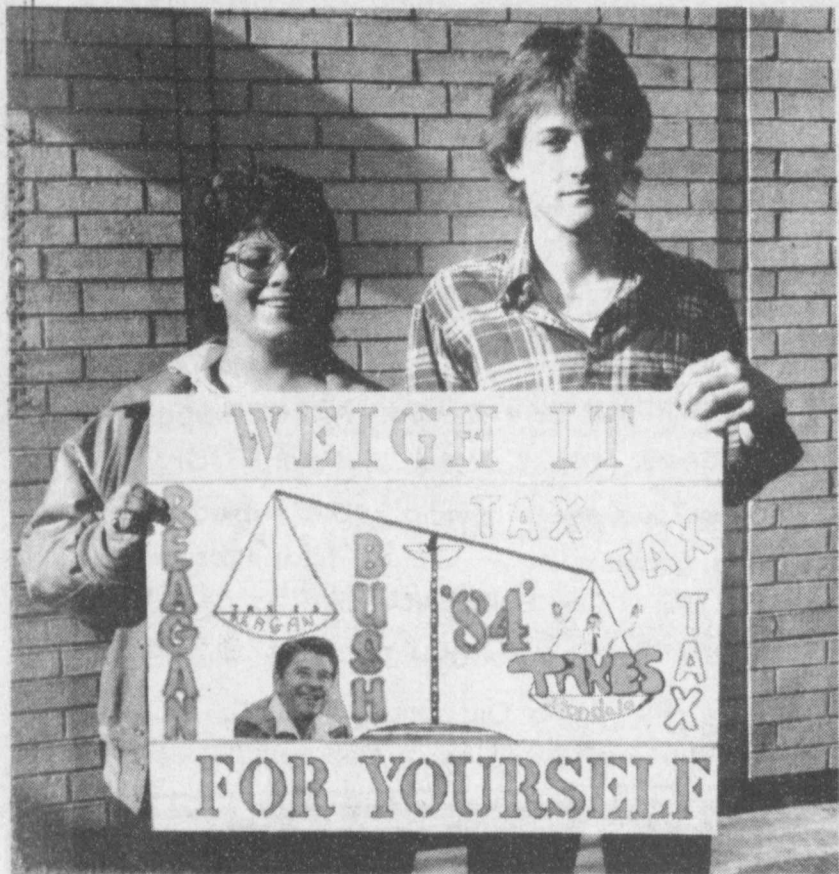

Fire Safety Fun, a special event for Brownie Girl Scouts, was held recently by the Red River Valley Girl Scout Council at Camp Gambill near Paris, TX.
