

Rebs In Third, Rebelettes First In District

The Rivercrest Rebels traveled to Harmony last Friday night. The Rebs dropped their third district loss to the Harmony boys. The Rebels are now in third place, three games out of first place. Harleton is second at 5-2.

It was a case of too much Greg Linsey of Harmony as the hosting team jumped out to a first quarter lead of 18-8. Linsey hit 32 points during the course of the game to seal the Rebels fate. Linsey also holds the honor of leading scorer in East Texas.

The Harmony boys made 23 of 28 free shots for 82 percent shooting. Rivercrest hit 3 of 6 from the foul line.

Rivercrest was paced by Anthony Brown with 19 points. "Our players played hard, but we just couldn't stop Linsey. We showed better conditioning than in the past and had the endurance to pull the game out, but our shots wouldn't fall," said Coach Wake Wood.

Tony Jasso shared double digit status with Brown. Jasso hit for 12 and Brown 19. James Anderson and Russell Rozell each marked up six. Brad Anderson hit for four as did Charley Martin. Bobby Thomas added two.

Coach Wood said, "We must continue to work hard and improve daily if we are going to have a

chance at the playoffs. We have the best schedule left of all the contending teams, and this could help us. We must quit getting rattled in tight situations and play consistent ball. We must develop the drive to play hard for 32 minutes. So far, we have not done this."

Other Rebelettes contributing scores were Tricia Duffer with nine, Staci Griffin with eight, and Donna Sessums and Kelly Anschutz each with two. Harmony's high scorer was Seahorn with eight.

The Rebelettes met Redwater Tuesday night and claimed an easy victory. The girls will host Ore City Friday night in the Rivercrest Gym.

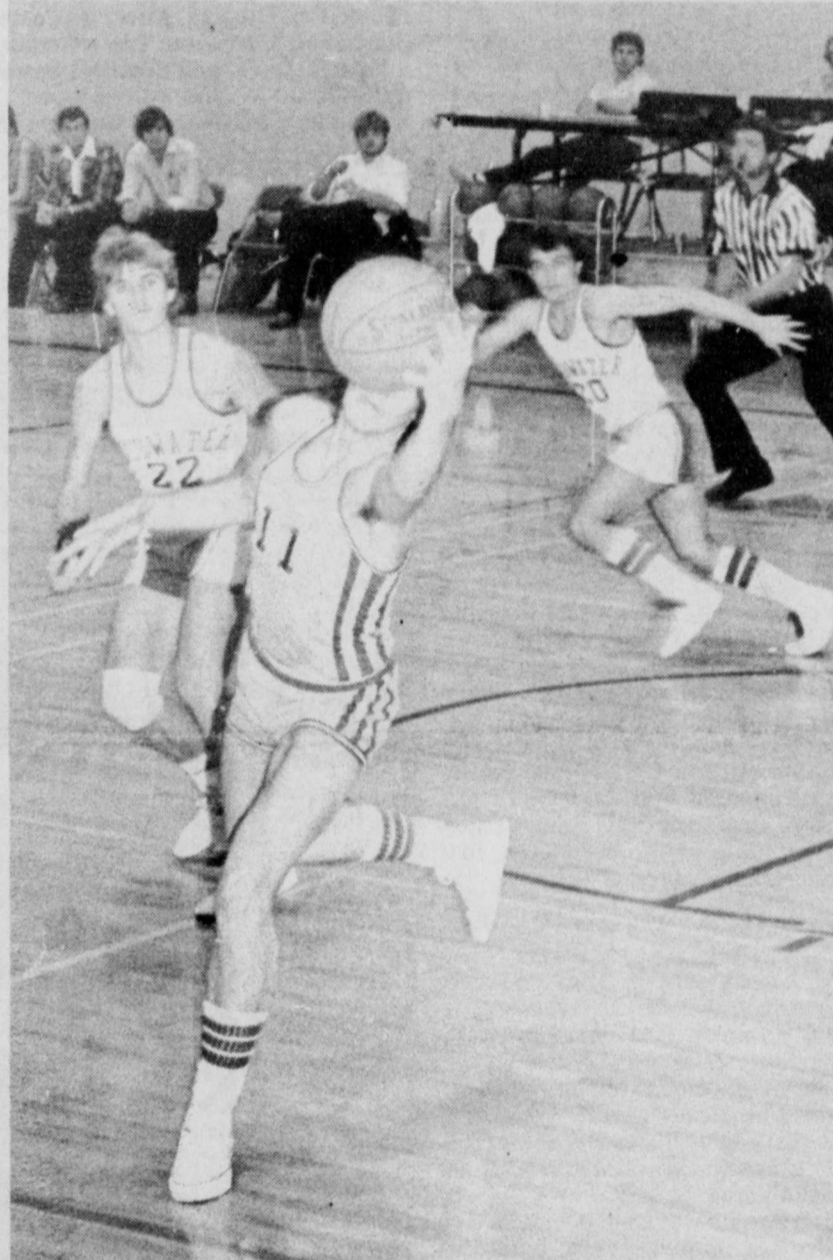

Talco Tales Continue On

Talco, Texas is a typical little oil town, located in the extreme northern part of Titus County, between the creeks, White Oak and Sulphur Rivers. It has a mayor, Jerry Jones and two city commissioners, Jack Winn and R.G. Hood, five churches and around 25 businesses mingled with many oil derricks.

It has a chamber of commerce and other clubs. It used to be said that everyone here was related, because before modern highways and fast transportation, no one could get out

long enough to get married, so they had to marry someone in Talco.

But of course, that was a long time ago, before the 1936 oil boom which brought in people from all over the country. Things were booming here for several years. Honky-tonks sprang up overnight and things got pretty rough. There were several killings. But thank goodness the honky-tonks did not last very long and after recovering from the shock of being an oil town and the prospects of becoming rich, Talco began to get organized. It was incorporated March 25, 1936 and an election was held and A.V. McElroy was elected mayor and Marvin Hazlewood, John Barton and W.K. White, city commissioners.

Ben Bonds was serving as deputy sheriff but was killed in an accident and Elemr Cato became Chief of Police. Soon streets were paved and a water and sewer system installed. The Humble Oil Co. built a company camp just outside the city limits, east of town, and had their own water supply and later after abandoning the camp they gave their \$87,000 water system to the city.

A new two story brick city hall was completed in late 1937 and was dedicated with a big banquet with city officials from all the surrounding towns attending. Talco Eastern Star Chapter, organized earlier the same year, prepared and served the banquet which added to their treasury quite a bit. Talco's Book Club was organized in 1925 and has been active ever since with several of its charger members still active. Their project is care of the city cemetery.

In 1938, one of the most beautiful school buildings in this part of the county was completed with B.E. Dunagan as superintendent and Bud Cato as school board president. The structure is used only now for elementary grades since Talco consolidated with Bogata and the Rivercrest High School was built just across the Sulphur River.

The Talco State Bank was renovated into a very attractive building in 1945, Felix Jones, who had been working there since 1917, became president and remained so until his death in 1969, after which his son, Jerry Jones was made president.

The K.D. Refinery was once located at Talco. Yes, Talco has come a long way since that eventful day in 1936, but it has come even further since the early pioneer days

when the town was called Goolsboro, located about two miles east of the present location.

Goolsboro consisted of two stores, a post office, barber shop and a blacksmith shop, besides a one-room building used for school and for church once a month on Sunday.

My father, Sam Mankins, did the delivering of supplies for these stores from Mt. Pleasant with a wagon and a team of mules. Sometime I would go with him and shop. One time I remember on our way home, it came up a storm and we were unable to get across White Oak bottom, so we spent the night with the colored family, Mr. and Mrs. George Baker, who kept a special room for white people in such emergencies. Mr. and Mrs. Baker were former negro slaves and were fine people.

The post office department asked Goolsboro to change its name because of another similar office. Q.C. Loveless was the postmaster and asked for ideas for a new name. Everett Levalling made up the name of Talco from a candy box he saw in the store while men were discussing a name. It was sent in and accepted. Jack Spears of Mt. Pleasant carried the mail by horse and buggy to our office.

I lived with my parents at the Meadows Curve near Goolsboro and my mother and I witnessed the car accident of R.H. Meadows at this sharp curve and rendered first aid to the family. Some were unconscious and some had broken bones. But believe it or not, the car which turned over several times did not seem to have much damage. Cars were built for more rugged use in those days, I guess.

Another horrifying experience my family had while living at Meadows Curve in about 1910 was a gunfight between two neighbor men who were supposedly friends but were trying to settle a misunderstanding in their own way. They were chasing each other on horseback coming down the public road. Two of my girlfriends and I were crossing the road at this time and were barely missed by the bullets.

There for a time there was no bridge across Sulphur River so two brothers, Bob and Riley Welch operated a ferry boat on the river. Some other pioneer settlers were Ben Clark, Jim Moore, John Blackburn, Joe Barber, Worsham Kelley, Will German, Grundy Jones, Abe Gieger, Wiley Glass, John Mankins, W.H. Crawford, Bud Davis

Talco JH Take Chapel Hill Tourney

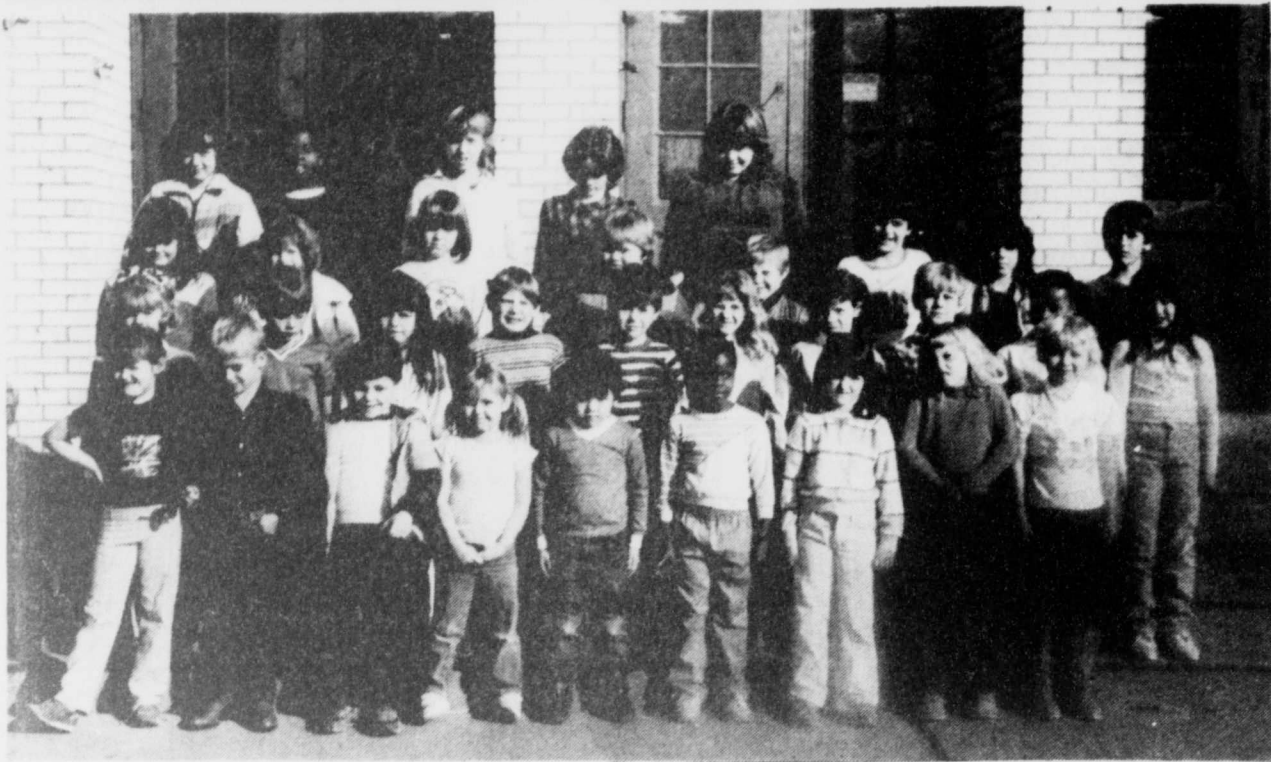

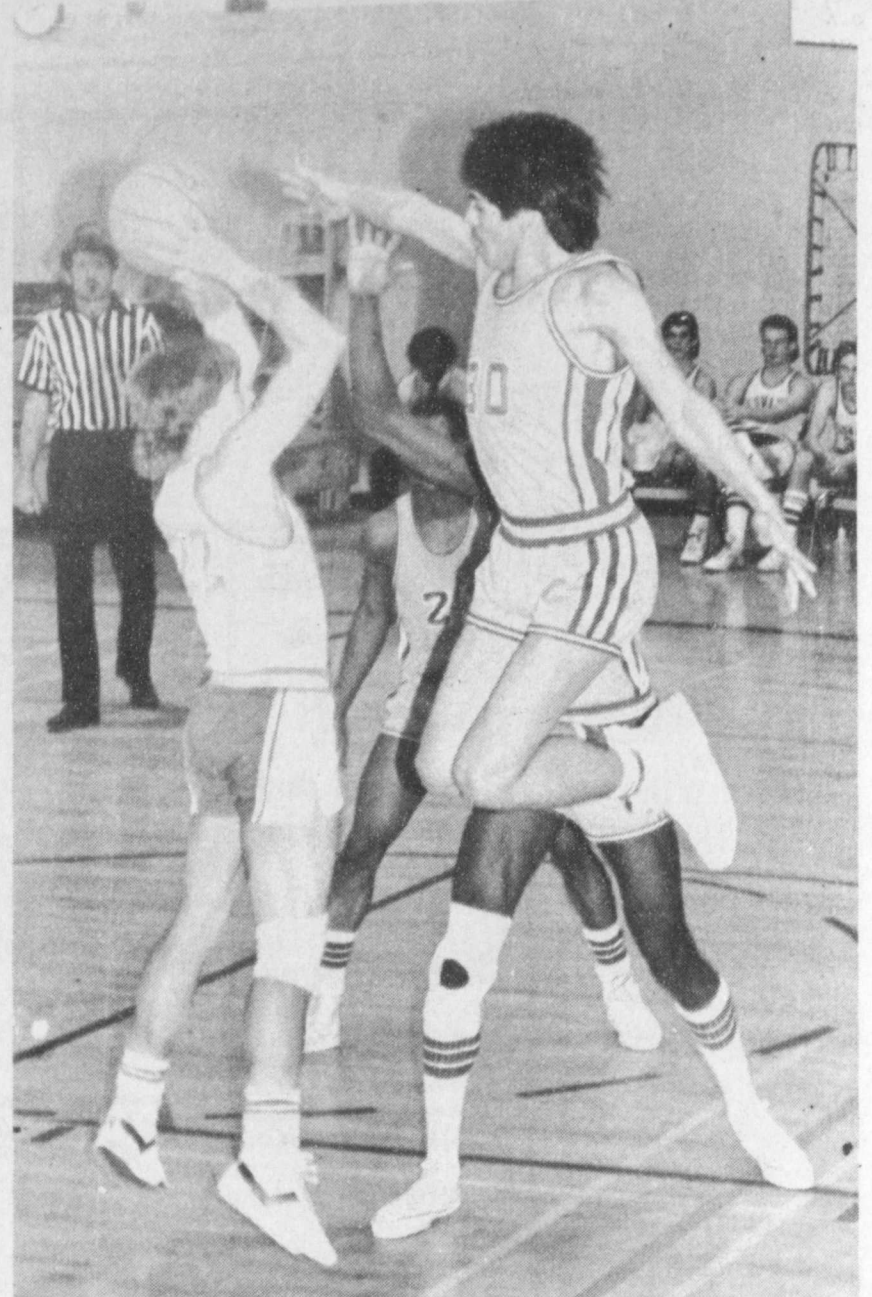
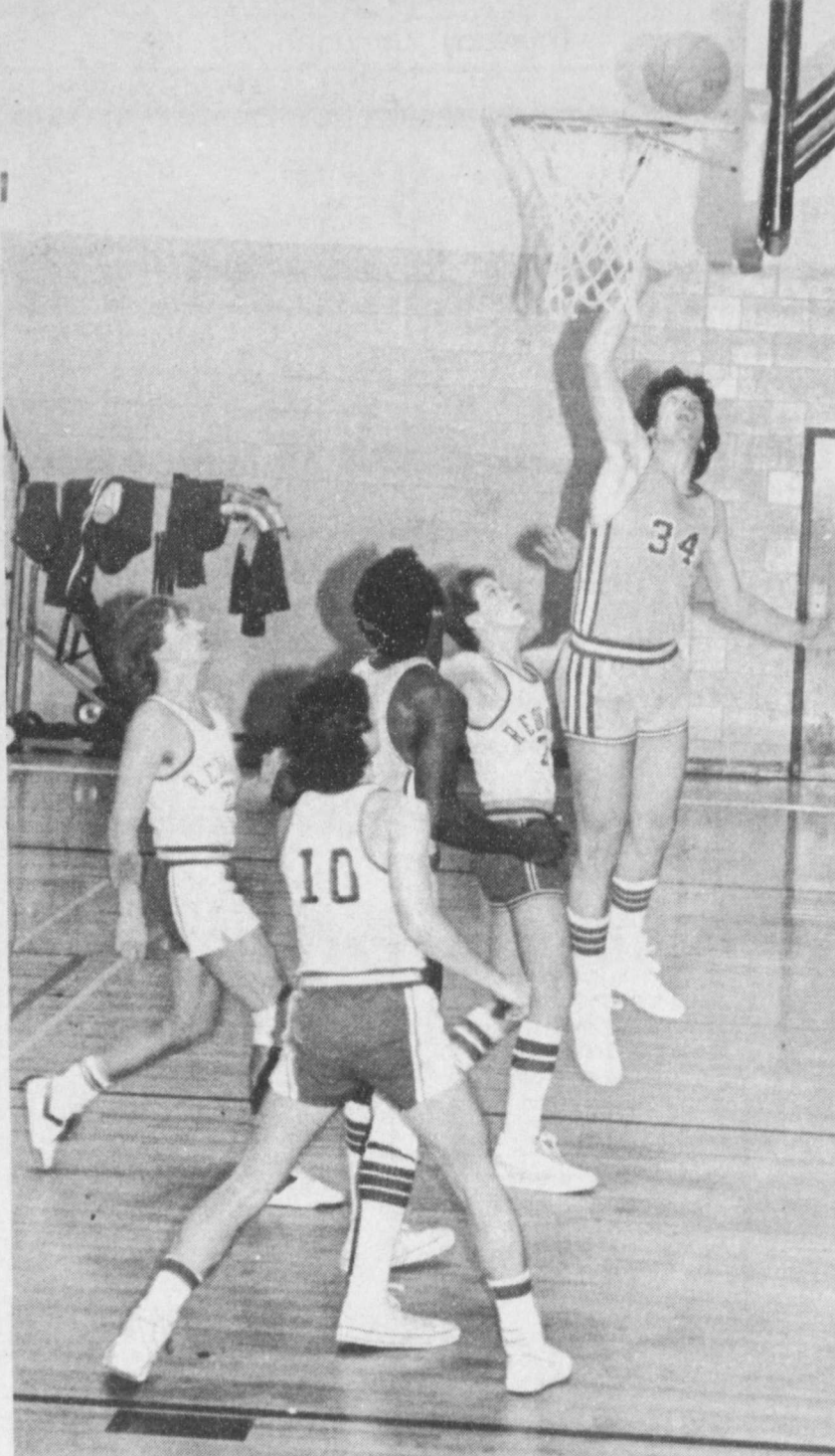
